REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE CONVEYANCE OF GOVERNMENT PARCELS PER ESCORT.

THE accompanying Regulations are published for general information.

1. Parcels to be forwarded will be received at the Gold Offices only, on the day preceding the departure of the escort conveying them.

2. No parcel exceeding one cubic foot measurement will be conveyed by escort, nor will parcels from Melbourne, addressed to Ballarat or Sandhurst, or any intermediate place on the Government lines of railway, be taken.

3. Parcels addressed to places on the escort routes beyond Ballaarat, Castlemaine, or Sandhurst, will not be received at Melbourne for transmission, but may be left at the Gold Office at either of the beforenamed places (as the case may be), from whence they will be taken on by escort.

4. Parcels addressed to officers not stationed on the escort route will be left at the nearest Gold Office until called for.

5. Officers in charge of escorts are on no pretext to allow private property to be conveyed in the escort conveyances.

6. Although as a rule the escorts are available for the conveyance of Government parcels, it must be distinctly understood that such will not be taken when their conveyance is calculated to interfere with the main object of the Escort Service, namely, the safe and regular transport of treasure and prisoners; and the responsibility of settling this point is left to the officer in charge of the escort.

7. In the event of parcels being too numerous for conveyance by any one escort, those which appear to be most urgently required will receive precedence.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the seventeenth year of
the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, An Act to amend the Law relating to the Post Office, it
is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the
Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make
rules and regulations for the establishing and managing of the
several post offices, including the imposing of fees for private
boxes, and the said rules and regulations from time to time to
alter, revoke, or vary, and such other rules and regulations to
establish in their stead as with the advice aforesaid he shall
deem expedient: And whereas it is considered desirable to
reduce the amount of the fee at present charged for the appropriation and use of private boxes at the post offices in
Victoria:

direct, that on and after the 1st day of January, 1803, the fees to
be paid for private boxes shall be as follow, viz.:—

Two pounds (£2) for one year,

Private boxes not to be allotted for a less period than three months, and the above amounts to be chargeable from the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, or 1st October, in each year. WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the second day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the boundaries of "The Winchelsea Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable again to atter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby rovoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said district; and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the said Winchelsea Road District shall be and comprise the area hercinafter described, that is to say:—

District shall be and comprise the area hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Gheranggherang; thence by a line south-westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 52 in the parish of Bambra; thence by a line due west to a point in the centre of the River Barwon; thence by the centre line of the said river northerly to a point due east of the south boundary line of allotment N, section 28, in the parish of Birregurra; thence westward to the south-west angle of said allotment; thence northward to the south-west angle of said allotment; thence northward to the south-west angle of said allotment; thence northward to the south-east along the south boundary of said allotment to its south-east angle; thence due north along the eastern boundaries of allotments A, B, C, D, and E of said section 22 to the north-east sideline of a Government road (bounding the said section Bouthen north-west); thence north-east along the side line of said road and of allotment E of section 19 in the last-named parish to a point due south of the dividing line of allotments B and C of said section 10; thence northerly by the said dividing line (crossing the Birregurra Creek into the county of Grenville) and the dividing line of allotments B and C of section 12 in last-named parish to the Colae Road; thence north-east along the said Colae Road to a point due south of the cast side line of allotments 50 and 57 of the last-named parish, and onwards to the south side of section 104 in the parish of Gellibrand; thence further north by the western boundaries of the parishes of Gellibrand and Hesse to the north-west angle of section 7 in the parish of Hesse; thence casterly by the northern boundaries of sections 7, 2, 1 of the parish of Hesse to the western boundary of the parish of Hesse to the centre of the Warrambine west boundary of said parish to the centre of the Warrambine

MUNICIPALITY OF GISBORNE.

BYE-LAW NO. 13.—FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF TWO HUNDRED AND SIXTY-FIVE POUNDS TWELVE SHILLINGS AND FIVEPENCE, BEING LAST INSTALMENT OF GRANT-IN-AID FOR 1861, AND FIRST, SECOND, AND THIRD INSTALMENTS OF THE SUM GRANTED OUT OF THE PUBLIC REVENUE FOR 1862.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, initituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted that any works proposed to be executed by any municipal council by funds raised by aid of Government, whether by endownent or otherwise, shall be the subject of a distinct byo-law: Be it therefore enacted by the council of Gisborne, that the sum of Two hundred and sixty-five pounds twelve shillings and five-pence sterling, being balance of sum granted to the said municipal council of Gisborne for the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and whole amount of sum granted for the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, shall be expended in the following works:—

BYE-LAW NO. 14.—FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within such district, according to their fair average annual value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings in the pound: He it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Gisborne, that a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current year be levied on all property in houses and lands within this municipal district; one moiety to be collected on and after the first day of January, 1863, and the other on and after the first day of May, 1863.

The foregoing Bye-laws Nos. 13 and 14, made by the municipal council of Gisborne, have been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MANURE DEPOT.

The Government Gazette of 3rd October contained a proclamation, appointing the gravel pils in Hothain as a site for metropolitan manure depot for Melbourne, Fitz Roy, and Hotham. The council took active steps to have the procla-

are to be erected at the city	y manure depôt.

ERECTION OF TOWN HALL AND COURT HOUSE.

During the past half-year the council approved of the design sent in by Mr. J. Flannagn, architect, and accepted the tender of Messrs. Leech and Bricknell to creet the building for the sum of £1398. It is of brick, and consists of the police court, 40 feet by 20 feet, a magistrates' consulting room, an office for the clerk of petty sessions; and for municipal business there are offices for the town clerk and surveyor, and a committee room. The building is near completion, and is much admired for its arrangements.

A detailed statement has been compiled at the instance of the Municipal and Charitable Institutions Commissioners, showing among other things the revenue derivable from rateable property since the establishment of the municipality in 1859, as follows:—

The works executed during the half-year have been confined to the main read through the town, from the southern to the northern districts. The council's financial position not admitting of a further outlay this year for the completion of the above read before the next winter season, and being aware of the necessity of the case, an appeal was therefore made to the District Road Board for assistance in levelling the worst portion, viz., from the Gap northwards. The council is glad to, state that that body took the same view of the case, and has generously devoted a sufficient portion of its funds for completing that part of the line for traffic. A box-drain has been constructed across Napier street, between Burke and Wills streets, for the drainage of that part of the main road; the plan, however, will not prove thoroughly efficacious until the council is in a position to raise that portion of the road to the formation level. A small portion of Napier street (fourteen chains) is being kerbed and channelled and the footpaths formed. This work is the only one now under contract.

WATER SUPPLY.

The council has to congratulate the town on the prospect of obtaining a thorough supply of water for the future, the Government having at length been induced to call for tenders for the construction of a reservoir for that purpose.
