REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE CONVEYANCE OF GOVERNMENT PARCELS PER ESCORT.

THE accompanying Regulations are published for general information.

1. Parcels to be forwarded will be received at the Gold Offices only, on the day preceding the departure of the escort conveying them.
2. No parcel exceeding one cubic foot measurement will be conveyed by escort, nor will parcels from Melbourne, addressed to Ballarat or Sandhurst, or any intermediate place on the Government lines of railway, be taken.
3. Parcels addressed to places on the escort routes beyond Ballarat, Castlemaine, or Sandhurst, will not be received at Melbourne for transmission, but may be left at the Gold Office at either of the beforenamed places (as the case may be), from whence they will be taken on by escort.
4. Parcels addressed to officers not stationed on the escort route will be left at the nearest Gold Office until called for.
5. Officers in charge of escorts are on no pretext to allow private property to be conveyed in the escort conveyances.
6. Although as a rule the escorts are available for the conveyance of Government parcels, it must be distinctly understood that such will not be taken when their conveyance is calculated to interfere with the main object of the Escort Service, namely, the safe and regular transport of treasure and prisoners; and the responsibility of settling this point is left to the officer in charge of the escort.
7. In the event of parcels being too numerous for conveyance by any one escort, those which appear to be most urgently required will receive precedence.

NOTICE is hereby given that cash parcels will not in future be received at the Gold Office, Melbourne, for transmission by escort to either Heathcote or Mount Blackwood.

FEES FOR PRIVATE BOXES AT POST OFFICES.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of November, 1862.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the seventeenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, *An Act to amend the Law relating to the Post Office*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make rules and regulations for the establishing and managing of the several post offices, including the imposing of fees for private boxes, and the said rules and regulations from time to time to alter, revoke, or vary, and such other rules and regulations to establish in their stead as with the advice aforesaid he shall deem expedient: And whereas it is considered desirable to reduce the amount of the fee at present charged for the appropriation and use of private boxes at the post offices in Victoria:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct, that on and after the 1st day of January, 1863, the fees to be paid for private boxes shall be as follow, viz. :-

Two pounds (£2) for one year,
One pound (£1) for six months,
Ten shillings (10s.) for three months.

Private boxes not to be allotted for a less period than three months, and the above amounts to be chargeable from the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, or 1st October, in each year.

And the Honorable George Samuel Evans, Her Majesty's Postmaster General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE MARONG ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twentieth-ninth day of September, in the present year, the boundaries of "The Marong Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be again altered: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as describes the said road district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the boundaries of the said Marong Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say :-

Commencing at the south-western angle of the municipality of Sandhurst; thence by the western and northern boundary of the said municipality to the Bendigo Creek; thence northerly by the Bendigo Creek and the western boundary of the Campaspe Road District to the northern boundary of the parish of Huntley; thence by a line due west to the centre of the Loddon River; thence southerly by the centre of the Loddon River to a point opposite the south boundary of the parish of Laanacooric; thence east by the south boundaries of the parishes of Laanacooric and Shelbourne to the western boundary of the parish of Ravenswood; thence south to the south-west angle of block 2, parish of Ravenswood; thence east by a direct line to the west boundary of the Strathfieldsaye Road District; thence northerly by the western boundary of said Road District to a point in the southern boundary of the Sandhurst municipality, forty-one chains forty links, more or less, west of the south-east angle of the said municipality; thence westerly by the southern boundary of the said municipality to the commencing point. Excepting the municipality of Eaglehawk.-(62.2277.)

Commencing at the junction of the Indigo Creek with the River Murray; thence westerly by the said river to a point due north of the eastern boundary of the parish of Gooramadda; thence south by the eastern boundary of the said parish to its south-east angle; thence west to the eastern boundary of the Wahgunyah Gold Field Common; thence by a direct line south to a point due west of the Pilot Hill; thence by a line due east to said hill; thence by a line due north to a point in the centre of the Indigo Creek; thence by the centre line of said creek to the commencing point. Excepting the municipality of Chiltern.-(62.2101.)

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Indigo Road District."

Commencing at the junction of the Buffalo with the Owens River; thence westerly by the centre line of the Owens River to the south-east angle of the Rutherglen Road District; thence north by the east boundary of said road district to a point due west of the Pilot Hill; thence by a line due east to the Pilot Hill; thence by the south and south-western boundary of the Yackandandah Road District to a point in the north-eastern boundary of the Buckland Road District; thence by part of the north-eastern and north-western boundaries of said road district to the commencing point. Excepting the municipality of Beechworth.—(62.2398.)

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Stanley Road District."

THE WINCHELSEA ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the second day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the boundaries of "The Winchelsea Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable again to alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said district; and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that the said Winchelsea Road District shall be and comprise the area hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Gherangherang; thence by a line south-westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 52 in the parish of Bamba; thence by a line due west to a point in the centre of the River Barwon; thence by the centre line of the said river northerly to a point due east of the south boundary line of allotment N, section 28, in the parish of Birregurra; thence westward to the south-west angle of said allotment; thence northward to the south boundary of allotment A of section 22 in the said parish; thence south-east along the south boundary of said allotment to its south-east angle; thence due north along the eastern boundaries of allotments A, B, C, D, and E of said section 22 to the north-east angle of said allotment E; thence westward to the south-east side line of a Government road (bounding the said section E on the north-west); thence north-east along the side line of said road and of allotment E of section 19 in the last-named parish to a point due south of the dividing line of allotments B and C of said section 19; thence northerly by the said dividing line (crossing the Birregurra Creek into the county of Grenville) and the dividing line of allotments B and C of section 12 in last-named parish to the Colac Road; thence north-east along the said Colac Road to a point due south of the east side line of allotments 50 and 57 of the last-named parish, and onwards to the south side of section 104 in the parish of Gollibrand; thence further north by the western boundaries of the parishes of Gollibrand and Hesse to the north-west angle of section 7 in the parish of Hesse; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of sections 7, 2, 1 of the parish of Hesse to the western boundary of the parish of Mardetuke; thence northerly by the west boundary of said parish to the centre of the Warrambine

Creek; thence easterly by the centre line of said creek and by the centre line of the River Barwon to a point due north of the north-east angle of the parish of Carrung Emurnong, in the county of Grant; thence southward along the east boundary lines of the parishes of Carrung Emurnong and Lake-lake Wollard to the northern boundary of the parish of Gherangherang; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the said parish to its north-east angle; thence south by the eastern boundary of said parish to the commencing point.—(62.2188.)

MUNICIPALITY OF GISBORNE.

BYE-LAW No. 13.—FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF TWO HUNDRED AND SIXTY-FIVE POUNDS TWELVE SHILLINGS AND FIVEPENCE, BEING LAST INSTALMENT OF GRANT-IN-AID FOR 1861, AND FIRST, SECOND, AND THIRD INSTALMENTS OF THE SUM GRANTED OUT OF THE PUBLIC REVENUE FOR 1862.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that any works proposed to be executed by any municipal council by funds raised by aid of Government, whether by endowment or otherwise, shall be the subject of a distinct bye-law: Be it therefore enacted by the council of Gisborne, that the sum of Two hundred and sixty-five pounds twelve shillings and fivepence sterling, being balance of sum granted to the said municipal council of Gisborne for the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and whole amount of sum granted for the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, shall be expended in the following works:—

Bridge and approaches on the Lancefield road, across the Saltwater Creek, £265 12s. 6d.

BYE-LAW No. 14.—FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within such district, according to their fair average annual value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Gisborne, that a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current year be levied on all property in houses and lands within this municipal district; one moiety to be collected on and after the first day of January, 1863, and the other on and after the first day of May, 1863.

The foregoing Bye-laws Nos. 13 and 14, made by the municipal council of Gisborne, have been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MANURE DEPOT.

The Government Gazette of 3rd October contained a proclamation, appointing the gravel pits in Hotham as a site for a metropolitan manure depot for Melbourne, Fitz Roy, and Hotham. The council took active steps to have the procla-

mation rescinded, and so far succeeded that the deodorising works are to be erected at the city manure depôt.

ERECTION OF TOWN HALL AND COURT HOUSE.

During the past half-year the council approved of the design sent in by Mr. J. Flanagan, architect, and accepted the tender of Messrs. Leech and Bricknell to erect the building for the sum of £1398. It is of brick, and consists of the police court, 40 feet by 20 feet, a magistrates' consulting room, an office for the clerk of petty sessions; and for municipal business there are offices for the town clerk and surveyor, and a committee room. The building is near completion, and is much admired for its arrangements.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The works executed during the half-year have been confined to the main road through the town, from the southern to the northern districts. Four miles of road one chain in width have been cleared, and three substantial wooden bridges and one culvert have been erected thereon. The council's financial position not admitting of a further outlay this year for the completion of the above road before the next winter season, and being aware of the necessity of the case, an appeal was therefore made to the District Road Board for assistance in levelling the worst portion, viz., from the Gap northwards. The council is glad to state that that body took the same view of the case, and has generously devoted a sufficient portion of its funds for completing that part of the line for traffic. A box-drain has been constructed across Napier street, between Burke and Wills streets, for the drainage of that part of the main road; the plan, however, will not prove thoroughly efficacious until the council is in a position to raise that portion of the road to the formation level. A small portion of Napier street (fourteen chains) is being kerbed and channelled and the footpaths formed. This work is the only one now under contract.

WATER SUPPLY.

The council has to congratulate the town on the prospect of obtaining a thorough supply of water for the future, the Government having at length been induced to call for tenders for the construction of a reservoir for that purpose.

The following applications have also been made to Government:—

- For a site for a manure depot.—Granted.
- For the alteration of the boundaries of section O, so that Napier street might be continued in a straight line to the extent of that portion of the town survey.—No reply.
- For a town common.—Granted.
- To erect the fence of the police buildings along the line of Napier street.—Granted.
- For the space known as "Market square," to be gazetted as a reserve for that purpose.—No reply.
- For a portion of the grant for fencing public reserves.—Reply, that no funds were available out of this year's vote.
- For the extension of the electric telegraph to the town.—No reply.
- To proclaim the streets and highways of the town.—Granted.
- For the extension of sections 5 to 10 of the Town and Country Police Act to the municipality.—Granted.
- For the block between sections C, D, F, and L, as a water reserve.—No reply.
