REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE CONVEYANCE OF GOVERNMENT PARCELS PER ESCORT.

THE accompanying Regulations are published for general information.

1. Parcels to be forwarded will be received at the Gold Offices only, on the day preceding the departure of the escort conveying them.

2. No parcel exceeding one cubic foot measurement will be conveyed by escort, nor will parcels from Melbourne, addressed to Ballarat or Sandhurst, or any intermediate place on the Government lines of railway, be taken.

3. Parcels addressed to places on the escort routes beyond Ballarat, Castlemaine, or Sandhurst, will not be received at Melbourne for transmission, but may be left at the Gold Office at either of the beforenamed places (as the case may be), from whence they will be taken on by escort.

4. Parcels addressed to officers not stationed on the escort route will be left at the nearest Gold Office until called for.

5. Officers in charge of escorts are on no pretext to allow private property to be conveyed in the escort conveyances.

6. Although as a rule the escorts are available for the conveyance of Government parcels, it must be distinctly understood that such will not be taken when their conveyance is calculated to interfere with the main object of the Escort Service, namely, the safe and regular transport of treasure and prisoners; and the responsibility of settling this point is left to the officer in charge of the escort.

7. In the event of parcels being too numerous for conveyance by any one escort, those which appear to be most urgently required will receive precedence.

TRANSMISSION OF CASH PARCELS.

NOTICE is hereby given that cash parcels will not in future be received at the Gold Office, Melbourne, for transmission by escort to either Heathcote or Mount Blackwood.

ORDER IN COUNCIL UNDER THE "REAL PRO- PERTY ACT." SCALE OF DIAGRAMS.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the eighth day of December, 1862.

WHEREAS by the *Real Property Act*, No. 140, it is amongst other things enacted, that all waste lands and lands set apart for public purposes remaining unalienated from the Crown on the day on which the said Act should come into operation, should, when alienated in fee, be subject to the provisions of the said Act; and that the grants of such land should be in duplicate; and that every such grant, in addition to proper words of description, should contain a diagram of the land thereby granted, on such scale as the Governor in Council might from time to time direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that in future the diagrams shall be according to the following scale, that is to say:—

If the land shall contain one acre or under, the scale shall be equal to two chains to one inch.

If the land shall contain over one acre and not over ten acres, the scale shall be equal to four chains to one inch.

If the land shall contain over ten acres and not over six hundred and forty acres, the scale shall be equal to twenty chains to one inch.

And if the land shall contain over six hundred and forty acres, the scale shall be forty chains to one inch.

And the Honorable Richard Davies Ireland, Her Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE WHITTLESEA ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him shall seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the colony of Victoria hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Plenty due west of the south boundary of section V., parish of Yan Yean; thence due east to and by the said south boundary, and by a line to a point in the centre of Arthur's Creek; thence northerly by the centre line of said creek to its source in the Dividing Range; thence westerly by the range to a point due north of the north-east angle of the Woodstock Road District, being the north-east angle of section XXXI., parish of Merriang; thence south to the said angle; thence by the east boundaries of sections XXXI., XIX. of said parish, and by the north boundary of section IX., parish of Toorourrong, to the north-east angle of said section; thence south by the east boundary of sections IX., VIII., I of said parish, and by the east boundary of sections XVII., XVI. of the parish of Yan Yean, to a point in the centre of the road running westward from the Yan Yean reservoir to Woodstock; thence east by the centre line of said road to a point in the centre of the River Plenty; thence south by the centre line of said river to the commencing point.—(62.1858.)

And, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare that as to so much of the area hereinbefore defined as at present appertains to the Greensborough Road District, this Proclamation shall not take effect until from and after the twenty-second day of February, in the year next ensuing.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of the road district above described shall be "The Whittlesea Road District."

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-third day of September, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the boundaries of "The Greensborough Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable that the boundaries of the said district should be again altered prospectively: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that from and after the twenty-second day of February in the year next ensuing, the boundaries of the said Greensborough Road District shall be the boundaries hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Plenty, opposite the south boundary of section XXVIII, in the parish of Keelbundora; thence west to the centre of the Upper Plenty road; thence southerly by the centre line of said road to the north boundary of section x. in said parish; thence east to the western boundary of the Eltham Road District; thence northerly by the said boundary to a point in the centre of the Arthur's River due east of the south boundary of section v., parish of Yan Yan; thence west by a line and by the said south boundary of said section for a distance of four and a half miles, more or less, to a point in the centre of the River Plenty; thence southerly by the centre line of said river to the commencing point.—(6L1509.)

10. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 7.

11. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of department, or officer in charge of station, will have the power to reject such articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 7.

12. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been gazetted during the half-year:—

Bye-law No. 1. For regulating the proceedings of the council by means of standing orders.

No. 3. For the expenditure of the sum of £500 grant-in-aid.

No. 4. For licensing and regulating the slaughter of small cattle, &c.

No. 5. For compelling the emptying of privies, &c., when necessary.

No. 6. For prohibiting the deposit of night-soil, or other offensive matter, except at the depot.

No. 7. For conducting meetings of the ratepayers and elections of members of council; also for regulating the proceedings at the election of chairman.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The works executed during the half-year have been confined to the main road through the town, from the southern to the northern districts. Four miles of road one chain in width have been cleared, and three substantial wooden bridges and one culvert have been erected thereon. The council's financial position not admitting of a further outlay this year for the completion of the above road before the next winter season, and being aware of the necessity of the case, an appeal was therefore made to the District Road Board for assistance in levelling the worst portion, viz., from the Gap northwards. The council is glad to state that that body took the same view of the case, and has generously devoted a sufficient portion of its funds for completing that part of the line for traffic. A box-drain has been constructed across Napier street, between Burke and Wills streets, for the drainage of that part of the main road; the plan, however, will not prove thoroughly efficacious until the council is in a position to raise that portion of the road to the formation level. A small portion of Napier street (fourteen chains) is being kerbed and channelled and the footpaths formed. This work is the only one now under contract.

WATER SUPPLY.

The council has to congratulate the town on the prospect of obtaining a thorough supply of water for the future, the Government having at length been induced to call for tenders for the construction of a reservoir for that purpose.

The following applications have also been made to Government:—

For a site for a manure depot.—Granted.

For the alteration of the boundaries of section O, so that Napier street might be continued in a straight line to the extent of that portion of the town survey.—No reply.

For a town common.—Granted.

To erect the fence of the police buildings along the line of Napier street.—Granted.

For the space known as "Market square," to be gazetted as a reserve for that purpose.—No reply.

For a portion of the grant for fencing public reserves.—Reply, that no funds were available out of this year's vote.

For the extension of the electric telegraph to the town.—No reply.

To proclaim the streets and highways of the town.—Granted.

For the extension of sections 5 to 10 of the Town and Country Police Act to the municipality.—Granted.

For the block between sections C, D, F, and L, as a water reserve.—No reply.
