UNITED COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold Field" [or, as the case may be] Common of for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the Nunawading, Doncaster, and Carlton Farmers' Common, and the Bulleen Farmers' Common, severally described in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861, shall be a Common, under the name of "The United Farmers' Common of Doncaster, Carlton, Nunawading, and Bulleen," for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the said commons.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this first day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and in the twenty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the lands hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

BEECHWORTH MUNICIPAL COMMON.—The town common for Beechworth, described in a proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861, together with the additional area hereinafter described, shall be and constitute the Municipal Common of Beechworth, the additional area being as follows, *viz.*—The unappropriated land within the following boundaries, area of extension 4400 acres, more or less: Commencing at the north-east angle of the present town common, being the north-east angle of the municipal district of Beechworth; thence east two miles, more or less; thence south three and a half miles, more or less; thence west two miles, more or less, to a point due south of the commencing point; thence north three and a half miles, more or less, to the point of commencement; as shown in plan deposited in the Office of Crown Lands and Survey at Melbourne. (Total area of common, including extension, about 5500 acres.—(62.F.8074.)

BRAYBROOK FARMERS' COMMON DIMINISHED.—The Farmers' Common at Cut-paw-paw, Doutta Galla, Derrimut, &c., described in a proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of May, 1861, is hereby diminished by withdrawing therefrom section 6, in the parish of Maribyrnong.—(62.F.10,010.)

CASTERTON TOWN COMMON.—The Town Common for Casterton, described in a proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861, is hereby increased, by adding thereto 1500 acres, more or less, county of Dundas, being the unappropriated land within the boundaries of the township of Casterton, and the following portions of land, *viz.*—Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 3, section 17, parish of Casterton; thence south about forty-four chains; thence east to the Glenelg River; thence northerly by that river to the south boundary of the township of Casterton; by part of the south and east boundaries of that township west and north to the south-east angle of allotment 1, section 17; thence west to the point of commencement.

Also, commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 8, section 17; thence north to the Glenelg River; by that river south-westerly to a point due north of the north-west angle of allotment 13, section 17; thence south to the north-west angle of said allotment 13, section 17; thence east to the point of commencement.

Also, commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 17, section 13; thence west to the south-west angle of allotment 20, section 12; thence south to the south-east angle of the town reserve of Casterton; thence east to the Wannon River; thence by that river easterly to a point bearing south from the south-

east angle of allotment 17, section 12; thence north to the south-east angle of allotment 17, section 12, being the point of commencement.—(62.F.7287.)

THE UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON OF KEILOR AND MARIBYRNONG, described in a proclamation bearing date the twenty-second day of September, 1862, is hereby increased by adding thereto section 6, in the parish of Maribyrnong.—(62.F.10,010.)

MODEWARRE FARMERS' COMMON.—The Farmers' Common at Modewarre, described in a proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861, is hereby increased by adding thereto the following area, viz.:—Three thousand four hundred and seventy acres, more or less, being the unappropriated land of the following named portions, all in the parish of Parapara, and county of Grant, viz., allotment 1 section 2, and portions 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, 68, 69, 77, 78, 79, 80, 81, 82, 83, 84, 85, 86, 87, 88, 89, 90, 91, 92, 93, and 94. Total area of common, including the land originally set apart, 9270 acres, as shown on plan deposited in Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(62.F.9890.)

SKIPTON TOWN COMMON.—The Town Common for Skipton shall be and comprise the area hereinafter described, viz.:—Counties of Hampden and Ripon, being the unappropriated land within the boundaries of the township of Skipton, and the following described area.—Approximate area, nine hundred and thirty acres, more or less: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 6, parish of Skipton; thence south one hundred and fifty-five chains, more or less, to the south-west angle of allotment 8, section 5; thence east thirty-nine chains, more or less, to the south-east angle of allotment 7, section 5; thence north one hundred and fifty-five chains, more or less, to the north-east angle of allotment 2, section 6; thence west twenty chains, more or less; thence north to the Emu Creek; thence by that creek south-westerly to its intersection with the north boundary of the township reserve; thence by the town boundary easterly and southerly to the point of commencement.—(62.E.9581.)

MUNICIPALITY OF BEECHWORTH.

BYE-LAW No. 39.—FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE IN THE POUND ON THE RATEABLE PROPERTY IN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BEECHWORTH, FOR THE YEAR 1862-3.

WHEREAS by 18 Victoria No. 15 municipal councils are empowered to impose a rate not exceeding two shillings in the pound upon all houses and lands within their respective municipalities, according to the fair average annual value: Do it and it is hereby enacted by the municipal council of Beechworth, that a rate for the current municipal year of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual value of all rateable property within the limits of the Beechworth municipal district be imposed and levied, and be due and payable in equal proportions upon the tenth day of April and the tenth day of July respectively, in 1863, except that in any case where the full amount of rate does not exceed fifteen shillings, such full rate shall be due and payable upon the first-named of such dates.

The foregoing Bye-law No. 39, made by the municipal council of Beechworth, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF INGLEWOOD.

BYE-LAW No. 14.—FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, SECOND INSTALMENT OF THE GRANT-IN-AID TO THE INGLEWOOD MUNICIPALITY (NEW MUNICIPALITY).

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered and required to make a bye-law for the appropriation of all money in aid received from Government: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Inglewood, that the sum of Two hundred pounds (being the second instalment of the grant-in-aid) received from Government be appropriated as follows, namely:—

Brooke street, forming roadway from Verdon street to Heales street, twelve chains... £200 0 0

The foregoing Bye-law No. 14, made by the municipal council of Inglewood, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.
