## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinnfter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the Government Gazette, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of house

holders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Sceretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and after, but so as in no case, save as therein after mentioned, to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the Hovernment Gazette, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the municipal district of Avoca was defined as therein mentioned: And whereas a potition has been received from the householders resident within the said municipal district and within the area heroinafter described, praying that the present municipal boundaries may be altered, the substance and prayer of which potifion have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as purports to describe the boundaries of the said municipal district, and with the advice aforesaid, I do by this my Proclamation as purports to describe the boundaries of the said municipal district, and with the advice aforesaid, I do by this my Proclamation declare that the said municipal district of Avoca shall be and consist of the area comprised within the boundaries and limit

BYE-LAW NO. 12.—TO RIPEAL BYE-LAW NO. 10. "FOR THE ELECTION OF MANAGERS FOR THE TOWN COMMON OF HAMILTON." AND TO SUBSTITUTE OFFIRE PROVISIONS IN LIEU OF TROSE CONTAINED THEREIN.

WHIEREAS it has been found expedient to rejeat bye-law! No. 10. of the municipal council of Hamilton, ascented to by His Excellency the Governor in Council, and gracted on the third day of 'October, 1862', and to 'substitute other provisions in lieu' of 'those contained' therein:—Be it therefore ordered and' directed by the 'minicipal council' of Hamilton, under the authority veited in them by the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, that from and after the dovernor of Victoria, the said bye-law No. 10 shall be repealed, and the following provisions substituted in lieu of those contained therein:—

1. That the election of three persons, to be managers of the Hamilton Town Common, shall take place in the month of December in each year.

2. That all meetings of the council for the election of managers shall be specially convened for that purpose:

3. That at the annual meeting, or any subsequent meeting, for the election of a manager or managers for the said common, any member of the municipal council may nominate, in writing, the names of not more than three persons to be managers thereof, with the consent of the person or persons so nominated; and in case there shall be more persons nominated than there are persons to be elected, a ballot shall be taken of the chairman and members present at such meeting of council, and at the conclusion of the said ballot if there shall be an equality of votes the chairman shall have a cashing vote, and the person or persons elected shall be declared to be the managers or a manager, as the case may be, of the Hamilton Town Common, under the provisions of the Act of Parliament 25 Victoria No. 145, section 69.

4. That should any manager or managers resign or be removed by order of the said municipal council of Hamilton, a meeting for the election of a successor or successors shall be held within one month from the date of such resignation or removal, and the manager or managers then elected shall hold office for the remainder of the term of his or their predecessor or predecessors would have been entitled to have held the same, unless resigned or removed by the municipal council.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, initialed, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that the council of any municipal district may make bye-laws for the conducting of elections of members of such municipal council: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Inglewood, that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency, as required by the provisions of the said Act—

That if at any election a poll shall be demanded in the manner and form required by the said Act, the chairman shall cause to be provided at the polling place a sufficient number of stalls or compartments, together with ink and pens or pencils, for the purpose of enabling the elector to mark the voting papers as hereiaafter provided, in which polling place no person other than the chairman, the town clerk or his deputy, the several candidates and their respective scrutineers, and the electors who shall for that time be tendering their votes; shall be entitled to be present; and no person other than such chairman, town clerk or his deputy, candidates, scrutineers, and electors, shall intrude into such room, and all persons shall withdraw on being required to do so by the chairman.

The chairman's shall cause to be provided for the purpose of such election a locked-up box, of which he shall keep the key, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the voting papers, and, which box shall stand upon the table in front of the chairman, and each elector shall receive from the chairman a voting paper in the form of the schedule hereunto annexed, and shall thereupon retire to a stall or compartment provided for that purpose, and there strike out the names of such candidates as he does not intend to vote for, and deposit the same in the ballot-box in the presence of the chairman, town clerk, or his deputy, and scrutineers; and in case such elector shall be unable to read or be, blind, he shall signify the same to the, chairman, who shall thereupon mark or strike out the same in the ballot-box in the presence of the chairman at any time before cight o'clock in the morning of the polling day, one soruhineer to be present on his behall in the polling day, one soruhineer to be present on his behall in the polling day, one soruhineer to be present on his behall in the
