## THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF AVOCA ALTERED.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter petition, signed by an equal or greater number of house-

holders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case, save as therein-after mentioned, to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, the municipal district of Avoca was defined as therein mentioned: And whereas a petition has been received from the householders resident within the said municipal district and within the area hereinafter described, praying that the present municipal boundaries may be altered, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as purports to describe the boundaries of the said municipal district, and with the advice aforesaid, I do by this my Proclamation declare that the said municipal district of Avoca shall be and consist of the area comprised within the boundaries and limits hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 1, section A 3; thence south to the south-east angle of allotment 30, section 1 A; thence west to the south-west angle of allotment 7, section 6 A; thence north to the north-west angle of allotment 3, section 5 A, all in the parish of Avoca; thence east by the north boundaries of allotments 3 and 4 of section 5 A, to the north-east angle of allotment 4; thence north by the east side of allotment 1, section 5 A, to the north-east angle thereof; thence east one chain crossing a road; thence by a line bearing S. 73° 30' E. fifty-nine chains to the main road from Moonambel to Avoca; thence east crossing said main road, the Avoca River, and two roads one chain wide each to the north-east angle of allotment 1, section A 3, being the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and in the twenty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

#### WATER SUPPLY TO CASTLEMAINE AND SANDHURST.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF HAMILTON.

BYE-LAW No. 12.—TO REPEAL BYE-LAW No. 10, "FOR THE ELECTION OF MANAGERS FOR THE TOWN COMMON OF HAMILTON," AND TO SUBSTITUTE OTHER PROVISIONS IN LIEU OF THOSE CONTAINED THEREIN.

WHEREAS it has been found expedient to repeal bye-law No. 10 of the municipal council of Hamilton, assented to by His Excellency the Governor in Council, and gazetted on the third day of October, 1862, and to substitute other provisions in lieu of those contained therein:—He it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Hamilton, under the authority vested in them by the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, the said bye-law No. 10 shall be repealed, and the following provisions substituted in lieu of those contained therein:—

1. That the election of three persons, to be managers of the Hamilton Town Common, shall take place in the month of December in each year.
2. That all meetings of the council for the election of managers shall be specially convened for that purpose:—

3. That at the annual meeting, or any subsequent meeting, for the election of a manager or managers for the said common, any member of the municipal council may nominate, in writing, the names of not more than three persons to be managers thereof, with the consent of the person or persons so nominated; and in case there shall be more persons nominated than there are persons to be elected, a ballot shall be taken of the chairman and members present at such meeting of council, and at the conclusion of the said ballot if there shall be an equality of votes the chairman shall have a casting vote, and the person or persons elected shall be declared to be the managers or a manager, as the case may be, of the Hamilton Town Common, under the provisions of the Act of Parliament 25 Victoria No. 145, section 69.

4. That should any manager or managers resign or be removed by order of the said municipal council of Hamilton, a meeting for the election of a successor or successors shall be held within one month from the date of such resignation or removal, and the manager or managers then elected shall hold office for the remainder of the term of his or their predecessor or predecessors would have been entitled to have held the same, unless resigned or removed by the municipal council.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 12, made by the municipal council of Hamilton, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

#### MUNICIPALITY OF INGLEWOOD.

BYE-LAW No. 13.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE THE CONDUCTING OF THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the council of any municipal district may make bye-laws for the conducting of elections of members of such municipal council: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Inglewood, that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency, as required by the provisions of the said Act:—

1. That if at any election a poll shall be demanded in the manner and form required by the said Act, the chairman shall cause to be provided at the polling place a sufficient number of stalls or compartments, together with ink and pens or pencils, for the purpose of enabling the elector to mark the voting papers as hereinafter provided, in which polling place no person other than the chairman, the town clerk or his deputy, the several candidates and their respective scrutineers, and the electors who shall for that time be tendering their votes, shall be entitled to be present; and no person other than such chairman, town clerk or his deputy, candidates, scrutineers, and electors, shall intrude into such room, and all persons shall withdraw on being required to do so by the chairman.

2. The chairman shall cause to be provided for the purpose of such election a locked-up box, of which he shall keep the key, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the voting papers, and which box shall stand upon the table in front of the chairman, and each elector shall receive from the chairman a voting paper in the form of the schedule hereunto annexed, and shall thereupon retire to a stall or compartment provided for that purpose, and there strike out the names of such candidates as he does not intend to vote for, and deposit the same in the ballot-box in the presence of the chairman, town clerk, or his deputy, and scrutineers; and in case such elector shall be unable to read or be blind, he shall signify the same to the chairman, who shall thereupon mark or strike out the names of such candidates as such elector shall designate, and no elector shall take out of such polling place any such voting paper, either before or after he has marked the same.

3. Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, by writing under his hand, to be delivered to the chairman at any time before eight o'clock in the morning of the polling day, one scrutineer to be present on his behalf in the polling place.

4. It shall be lawful for the chairman, or for any candidate or scrutineer through the chairman, to put to any person claiming to vote, before he shall have received his voting paper, the following questions only:—

- 1st. What is your name and surname?
- 2nd. Are you of the age of twenty-one years?
- 3rd. Are you a ratepayer on the ratepayers' roll of the municipal district of Inglewood?
- 4th. Have you already voted at this election?

And no person shall wilfully give a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid.

5. At every election, it shall be the duty of the town clerk or his deputy to provide himself with the ratepayers' roll, and as each elector comes forward to demand his voting paper, to see whether the name of such elector appears upon the roll as a ratepayer within the meaning of the said Act; and as each elector deposits his voting paper within the ballot-box to mark off such elector's name as having voted at such election.

6. In case the voting paper of any person shall have been received, and any other person shall afterwards demand his voting paper as of the same person, the chairman, when such person shall purpose to deposit his paper in the ballot box, shall refuse to allow the same to be put therein, but shall receive and keep the same apart, and at the close of the election decide whether such person has already voted or not; and if it shall appear to the chairman that such elector has not already voted at such election, such vote shall be added to the number already polled, but if otherwise, such vote shall not be allowed.

7. At the close of the poll, or as soon after as conveniently may be, the chairman, in the presence of the scrutineers, shall
