MUNICIPALITY OF SANDRIDGE.

BYE-LAW No. 12.—TO ESTABLISH A TOLL AT INGLES STREET, NEAR THE LEVEL CROSSING OVER THE MELBOURNE AND HOBSON'S BAY RAILWAY LINE.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, known as the Municipal Institutions Act, it is provided, *inter alia*, that it shall be competent for every municipal council, whenever it shall appear necessary, to establish tolls, rates, and dues upon any road within the jurisdiction and under the control of such council, and to erect toll-gates, toll-bars, and other works necessary for the collection of such tolls, rates, or dues, and to make such bye-laws for the proper collection and management of such tolls, rates, and dues as to such municipal council shall seem fit: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Sandridge, with the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria:—

1. That on and after the first day of January, A.D. 1863, a toll shall be established at Ingles street, near to or adjoining the level crossing at Ingles street, over the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway line, for the collection of tolls, and also that toll-gates, toll-bars, and all necessary works for the collection of tolls shall be established, erected, and maintained by the municipal council of Sandridge, at Ingles street aforesaid, being a road within the jurisdiction and under the control of the said council.

2. That the tolls specified in the schedule hereto annexed, shall be the tolls payable to the said council in respect of any animal or vehicle passing through the said toll-gate or bars, until such time as said council, with such assent as aforesaid, shall see fit to alter the same.

3. That no person or persons shall fraudulently or forcibly pass, nor claim nor attempt to pass said toll-gates or bars without having first paid the tolls named in the schedule hereto annexed, nor shall refuse payment, nor evade nor attempt to evade, nor aid, assist, or abet any person or persons in evading or attempting to evade payment of the tolls payable in respect of any animal or vehicle legally chargeable therewith.

4. That the christian name and surname of the toll-collector, and a list of the tolls for the time being in respect of any animal or vehicle passing through said toll gates or bars, shall be painted in black letters at least two (2) inches in length on a board with a white ground, which shall be placed in a conspicuous situation in front of the toll-house, or contiguous to side toll-gates or bars; and no such collector shall refuse or neglect to place and keep such board as aforesaid during the time he shall be such collector, nor shall in anywise hinder any person from reading the inscription on such board, nor shall refuse to tell his christian name and surname to any person who shall demand the same, nor shall give a false name, nor shall demand more than the legal toll, nor upon the legal toll being paid or tendered shall detain any passenger, nor shall use any abusive language while collecting the toll.

5. That it shall be lawful for the said council, from time to time, by public auction or tender, duly advertised in some one or more of the public newspapers, to let and farm out for any term not exceeding twelve months the tolls that may be authorised by said council to be collected at such toll-gates or bars, or to employ such person or persons as may be requisite or necessary for the collection of said tolls as to said council shall seem best; and any such person so employed by said council shall be deemed to be the toll collector within the meaning hereof.

6. No toll shall be demanded or taken by virtue of this bye-law or from any person in Her Majesty's service, or in the employment or service of the Government, or of or from any person going to or returning from any place of public worship, or of or from any minister of religion.

7. Any person or persons guilty of a breach or neglect of this bye-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10.)

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. 9.
