PROCLAMATION

CONTAINING REGULATIONS UNDER THE "DISEASED CATTLE ACT, 1861."

WHEREAS by the *Diseased Cattle Act*, 1861, it was provided that the Governor in Council might, by warrant under his hand, from time to time, delegate to the Superintendent of any province within the said colony all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he might think fit, and might from time to time rescind such delegation: And whereas the said Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive

Council of New Zealand, delegated to William Douglas Hall Baillie, Esquire, so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Marlborough, the several powers vested in the said Governor by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth sections of the said Act, subject to being rescinded as in the said Act provided, and subject to the regulations issued by the Governor in Council on the first day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and to any other regulations to be from time to time duly made:

Now therefore I, the said William Douglas Hall Baillie, by virtue of such powers in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare:—

1. That after the date hereof the several Colonies of Australia, that is to say, the Colony of Victoria, of New South Wales, of Queensland, of South Australia, and Western Australia, as well as the Colony of Tasmania, and the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, and the Islands of Great Britain and Ireland, shall be deemed to be, for the purposes of the above recited Act, infected districts within the meaning of the said Act, and that no cattle shall be allowed to be imported from the abovementioned districts, and that in the case where any cattle may be imported from the said districts, such cattle shall be destroyed forthwith, in such manner and at such places as the Superintendent may proclaim and appoint.

2. That after the date of these regulations the Provinces of Otago and Southland, in the Colony of New Zealand, shall be deemed to be infected districts within the meaning of the said Act, and that no cattle shall be imported from the said provinces either by land or sea.

3. That the following persons shall be appointed Inspectors under the second section of the said Act:—

4. That every inspector so appointed shall produce, on demand, to any person requiring the same, a copy of the Act, and all regulations appertaining thereto.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

WOODEND.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and fifty-six householders, resident at and near Woodend, in the county of Dalhousie, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders resident in the township and district of Woodend, in the county of Dalhousie, and represent that their locality has greatly increased in importance, and now contains a population of resident householders larger than that required under the Municipal Institutions Act.

They therefore request that it may be erected into a municipal district, and suggest an area of six square miles for the same, bounded as follows, viz.:—"On the west by the Campaspe River; on the south by the boundary of the parish of Woodend and sixty chains into the parish of Newham; on the east by a road running north-east to a point four miles and ten chains distant from the southern boundary; and on the north by a road running west to the Mount Alexander road; and thence by a line in continuation to the Campaspe River."

And the petitioners pray as follows, viz.:—

"That as the formation of such municipality will be of the greatest benefit to this township and district, your petitioners humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to take this their petition into your consideration, and to grant its prayer."

THE METROPOLITAN CRICKET GROUND.

ELECTIONS.

On 26th September, 1861, Messrs. E. H. Dunn (by 175 votes), Alex. Rogers (by 172 votes), and James Shackell (by 156 votes), were elected to fill the places of Councillors J. S. Clarke, Wm. Witt, and E. H. Dunn, retiring by rotation. And on 27th September, Councillor George Briscoe Kerferd, J.P., was again unanimously elected chairman of council.

WATER SUPPLY.

The council are steadily pursuing their endeavors to bring their proposed Beechworth Waterworks into speedy operation, and the ratepayers may rest assured that no exertion will be spared to accomplish that object as one that must prove of such incalculable benefit to this municipality and district, by the great inducements it will offer for the settlement of an increased and permanent population on the extensive surrounding gold field.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The council having, upon favorable terms to the municipality, leased the public recreation ground to Mr. H. C. Batchelor, for three years as a grazing paddock, have, in anticipation of the revenue therefrom, expended that amount upon a contract for effecting the clearance of the entire reserve (sixty-three acres), which, when completed, will really render the place available for the recreation purposes for which it was intended. The public garden reserve is likewise being greatly improved, the council having, after much difficulty, again obtained from the Government, through the perseverance of their town agent, B. Cowderoy, Esq., a grant of £100 towards such work.

The above improvements, together with the necessary repairs to roads and streets, have, as in late previous half-years, been principally effected by day labor, and small contracts under the supervision of the town clerk.

The council have undertaken the improvement (for the Government) of the road between Beechworth and Stanley, and having entrusted the works to Mr. Superintendent Dalziel upon the same terms as last year, they are glad to learn that the same, as carried out, are giving satisfaction to the inhabitants of both towns.

BYE-LAWS.

The council passed a bye-law for the suppression of the daily increasing goat nuisance, but it was denied the Government's approval, although precisely similar (word for word) to those sanctioned for other municipalities, thus showing a want of impartiality and system, against which this is not the first time the council have had to complain.

MISCELLANEOUS.

At the request of the commissioners of the Victorian Exhibition of 1861, the council, in August last, caused to be compiled in detail the statistics of this municipality from its establishment, and had the same engrossed on vellum for display with other similar documents from other municipalities of the colony, in the Victorian Exhibition of this year, and subsequently in the London International Exhibition of 1862.

FINANCE.

The usual balance sheet of the receipts and expenditure for the half-year is appended, showing (as at the end of previous municipal years) a balance to the council's credit.
