SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF BRIGHTON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, "*An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*," it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and

alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the municipal district of Brighton shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act, numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Honor JOHN LARKINS CHEESE RICHARDSON, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in the Colony of New Zealand.

WHEREAS by section, No. 9 of the *Diseased Cattle Act*, 1861, it is enacted that "If at any time it shall be made to appear to the Governor that any infectious or contagious disease has broken out in any district out of the colony, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to declare that such district is infected within the meaning of this Act, and from time to time to make such regulations as to him shall seem fit for prohibiting the importation of cattle into the colony from such district, and the landing or driving of such cattle, and for destroying cattle imported, landed, or driven contrary to such regulations;" and by section 10 of the same Act it is also enacted that "If at any time it shall be made to appear to the Governor that any infectious or contagious disease has broken out amongst cattle in any district of the colony, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to declare that such district is infected within the meaning of this Act, and from time to time to make such regulations for destroying diseased cattle therein, and from prohibiting the removal or transportation of cattle from one part of the colony to another, and for preventing the further spread of such disease, as to him shall seem fit." And it is by the same Act also enacted that the Governor in Council may, by warrant under his hand, from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any province within the colony all or any of the powers vested in the Governor, or Governor in Council, by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he may think fit, and may from time to time rescind such delegation: And whereas the Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to John Larkins Cheese Richardson, Esquire, so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Otago, the several powers vested in the Governor by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth and tenth sections of the said Act, subject to being rescinded as in the said Act is provided, and subject to the regulations issued by the Governor in Council on the first day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and to any other regulations to be from time to time duly made:

Now therefore I, the said John Larkins Cheese Richardson, by virtue of the powers vested in me in this behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare, that after the date hereof the several Colonies of Australia—that is to say, the Colony of Victoria, the Colony of New South Wales, the Colony of Queensland, the Colony of South Australia, and the Colony of Western Australia—as well as the Colony of Tasmania, and the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, and the Islands of Great Britain and Ireland, shall be deemed to be infected districts within the meaning and for the purpose of the abovementioned Act, and that no cattle after the date hereof, until further notice, shall be imported into the Province of Otago from such districts: provided, however, that the Superintendent of the Province may allow any cattle to be landed from vessels from the Islands of Great Britain and Ireland, subject to such conditions and restrictions as he may deem expedient and the circumstances of any case may require.

And whereas cattle have been lately imported from the said Colony of New South Wales into the Province of Southland, in the Colony of New Zealand, and the cattle in the said province have thereby become infected, I do therefore further proclaim and declare, that after the date hereof the Province of Southland, in the Colony of New Zealand, shall be deemed to be an infected district within the meaning of the said Act, and that no cattle shall be removed or transported from the said Province of Southland into the Province of Otago.

LAND TO BE PERMANENTLY RESERVED AND GRANTED.

IT is hereby notified, in pursuance of the 87th section of the Act 21 Victoria No. 117, that, upon the expiration of one month from the date hereof, it is the intention of the Governor in Council to permanently reserve the land hereinafter described, and that thereupon the said land will be granted to trustees in accordance with the 5th clause of the said Act, viz.:—

LAND TO BE GRANTED TO THE COLLINGWOOD, FITZ ROY, AND DISTRICT GAS AND COKE COMPANY.—All that piece or parcel of land situate in the parish of Jika-jika, in the county of Bourke, and colony of Victoria, and containing by admeasurement three acres, be the same more or less: Commencing at the point of intersection of the north side of a Government road three chains wide, called Reilly street, with the west side of another Government road, one chain wide, called Smith street; bounded on the south by Reilly street aforesaid, extending west from said point of intersection along Reilly street aforesaid four hundred and twenty-five links; then extending in a line at right angles to the last line bearing north seven hundred and six links, and bounded on the west by Gore street, one chain wide; then extending in a line at right angles to the last line bearing east four hundred and twenty-five links, and bounded on the north by other Government land; then extending in a line at right angles to the last line bearing south seven hundred and six links to the commencing point, and bounded on the east by Smith street aforesaid.—(62.F.978.)

MUNICIPALITY OF ARARAT.

BYE-LAW No. 27.—FOR MAKING AN ASSESSMENT AND IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE YEAR ENDING 20TH SEPTEMBER, 1862.

WHEREAS by Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to assess all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district (except property belonging to or in the occupation of Her Majesty), according to its fair annual value, and to impose a rate upon all such properties for the current year: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Ararat, that all the several properties within the limits of the said municipal district shall be assessed for the year 1861-62 according to the several amounts of annual value respectively affixed to the same in the assessment roll, confirmed by the said municipal council on the 19th day of February, 1862, and amounting, after all appeals have been heard, to the sum of Twelve thousand four hundred and thirty-four pounds sterling (£12,434); and also that a rate of One shilling in the pound of said annual value is hereby imposed upon all the said properties, for the year ending the 20th day of September, 1862, the first moiety of said rate to be due and payable on the 1st day of March, 1862, and the second moiety to be due and payable on the 2nd day of July in the same year.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 27, made by the municipal council of Ararat, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF BELFAST.

BYE-LAW No. 26.—FOR EXTENDING THE POWER OF ADJOURNMENT AND FOR ALTERING THE TIME OF HOLDING OF THE MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it has been provided by bye-law No. 3 of the municipal council of Belfast, that the council shall have power to adjourn the ordinary meetings of the council from time to time, not being more than fourteen days from the last day of meeting: And whereas it has been provided by bye-law No. 10 of the said municipal council that the hour of meeting of the said council shall be Three o'clock p.m. instead of Eleven o'clock a.m. as fixed by said bye-law No. 3: And whereas the said municipal council are desirous of enlarging the power of adjournment and altering the hour of holding the ordinary meetings of the council: Be it therefore ordered and directed, that from and after the publication of this bye-law in the *Government Gazette*—

1. The council shall have power to adjourn the ordinary meetings of the council from time to time, not being more than thirty days from the last day of meeting.

2. The ordinary meetings of the council shall be held on Wednesday in each week at Seven o'clock p.m., instead of Three p.m. as fixed by said bye-law No. 10.

3. The council shall have power from time to time, at a meeting held in pursuance of a call of the whole of its members for that purpose, to alter the time of holding the ordinary meetings of the council to such other time or times as may be deemed advisable or convenient without the necessity of any bye-law for the purpose.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 26, made by the municipal council of Belfast, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF MOONAMBEL.

BYE-LAW NO. 3.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF HOUSE AND LAND PROPERTY WITHIN THIS MUNICIPAL DISTRICT FOR THE YEAR 1861.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make an assessment on all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district, according to its fair annual average value: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the Moonambel municipal council, that the assessment on the annual value of property within the municipality of Moonambel, estimated at £7159 1s. sterling, as approved of by the justices of the peace in petty sessions assembled, shall be the value on which the rate of One shilling in the pound shall be levied, and shall be legal and in force for the municipal year, commencing the 20th day of November, 1861, and ending the 20th day of November, 1862.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 3, made by the municipal council of Moonambel, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF KEW.

BYE-LAW NO. 11.—A BYE-LAW FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within such district, whether occupied or not, according to their fair average annual value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Kew, that a rate of One shilling in the pound, for the current year, be levied and collected on the annual value of all property in houses and lands within the said municipal district, to become due and payable on and after the first day of May next.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 11, made by the municipal council of Kew, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

BYE-LAW NO. 34.—A BYE-LAW FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT MUNICIPAL YEAR.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all property, works, houses, tenements, or lands, within such district according to its fair average annual value, such rate not to exceed Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Warrnambool, that a rate of One shilling in the pound, for the current municipal year, be levied on all property in works, houses, tenements, or lands, within the said district, to become due and payable on and after the thirty-first day of March, 1862.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 34, made by the municipal council of Warrnambool, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

VICINITY OF SANDHURST.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by forty-one persons, stated to be the majority of the householders resident within a defined area adjoining the Municipal District of Sandhurst, praying that their locality may be united with, and form part of, the said municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders resident upon lands outside of but adjacent to the south-eastern boundary of the municipality of Sandhurst, and that they constitute a

majority of residents within an area adjoining the said municipality containing an average of thirty-six resident householders for each square mile thereof.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"That your Excellency will be pleased to declare by proclamation the locality within which we reside to be united with and form part of the said municipality of Sandhurst, by the following general description, as defined and set forth in the plan [accompanying the petition], viz.:—Commencing from a point in the boundary line of the said municipality of Sandhurst, known as Kirk's post, by a line fifty-two chains fifty links, bearing north fifty-five degrees west to a point at the south-western corner of the Cemetery reserve; thence by a line thirty-two chains, bearing south eighty-seven degrees west to the south-eastern corner of the said Cemetery reserve; thence by a line sixty-eight chains sixty links, bearing south twenty-nine degrees twenty minutes west to the south-eastern corner peg of allotment 88, section H; thence by a line fifty-four chains eighty links, bearing north three degrees east to a point in the boundary of the said municipality of Sandhurst known as Bell Post."

**DESCRIPTION OF THE TWO MEN ENCOUNTERED BY CONSTABLES
WHITE AND MCGLADERY, NEAR GLENLOGIE, ON THE AFTER-
NOON OF THE 4TH INSTANT.**

First man—Between 25 and 30 years of age, about 5 feet 5 inches high, light hair, and sandy whiskers worn all round the face; wore dark felt hat with blue veil, dark trousers inside riding boots, red Crimean shirt, and dark vest.

Second man—Aged 40, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, stout build, dark complexion; wore dark trousers inside riding boots, red Crimean shirt, and black billycock hat; had a mark on his face as if blistered by the sun.

Both went towards Lexton.

**DESCRIPTION OF THE TWO MEN WHO, ON THE MORNING
OF THE 2ND INSTANT, WAYLAID JOHN KUBSCH, ON THE
ARARAT ROAD, NEAR MR. BEGGS'S STATION.**

First man—About 35 years of age, 5 feet 5 inches high, medium build, light yellow hair, and light sandy whiskers worn all round the face; wore grey tweed jacket, drab billycock hat, and thick blue veil over the face; rode a dark bay horse with a tether rope round his neck, and carried a large glazed valise or swag on the front of his saddle.

Second man—About 40 years of age, 5 feet 5 inches high, medium build, and dark complexion; wore dark clothing and black billycock hat; had a mark over his face; rode a dark brown horse, and carried a swag similar to that borne by the first man.

Both went towards Mount Cole.

**DESCRIPTION OF THE HORSES NOW IN THE POSSESSION OF
THE SUPERINTENDENT OF POLICE, AVOCA, LEFT BEHIND
BY THE HIGHWAYMEN WHO, ON THE AFTERNOON OF THE
