In consequence of the reduction of the vote for 1862, as compared with the vote for 1861, for the salaries of teachers of National Schools: It is ordered by the Board of Commissioners for National Education, that a reduction of Five pounds per centum be made upon the salaries and allowances of all persons employed in National Schools, from the 1st January to the 31st March, 1862; and a reduction of Ten pounds per centum from the 1st April to the 31st December, 1862.

They further state that it is the centre of a large agricultural district, and that the elements of wealth, such as a large and increasing population, genial soil, and mineral productiveness, are there concentrated; but, the greatest inconvenience is caused by the want of proper roads, whereby the outlet of produce is obstructed and the cost of imported necessaries is enhanced.

That the township, possessing no improvements in the way of street making and draining, is, during several months in the year, all but uninhabitable, and that owing to its isolation in position and interest, local self-government is indispensable to its welfare and progress.

On the 20th December an election took place to supply vacancies in the council caused by the resignation of Councillors Bland, Beaver, and Scott, and Messrs. John Mason, George Haynes, and John Clement Spink, were elected accordingly.

BYE-LAWS.

A bye-law, No. 25, for striking a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling, for the current year's assessment,

And bye-law No. 26, for altering the hour of meeting, and extending the limit of power of adjournment from fourteen to thirty days, have been passed and duly assented to, and gazetted.

A bye-law exempting machinery in buildings used for manufacturing purposes from taxation passed the council, but was not assented to.

For lands at Mount Rouse to be submitted for sale at Belfast.—Declined.

For lands in the immediate vicinity of Belfast proclaimed for sale at Warranbool, withdrawn from such sale, and gazetted for disposal at Belfast.—Refused.

For a piece of land to be granted for the purpose of a manure depot.—No reply received yet.

For the erection of a district survey office.—No reply received yet.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The twenty-eight chains of Yambuk road contracted for previous to last report, have been formed and completed, and slopes of embankment and cuttings pitched with stone.

In conjunction with the road board, the bridge at Rosebrook has been repaired and strengthened by tightening up trusses, repairing tie-rods, and replanking diagonally the whole of the roadway, and laying new gravel beams, &c.

Forty-six chains in length of the Rosebrook road have been coated with bluestone metal, and the remainder of the road repaired where worn into holes.

Fourteen chains of street have likewise been sheeted with bluestone metal.

A contract has been entered into for the making of forty-six chains of the Mount Napier road, including the cutting down of two stony rises, and building one culvert. This work is now in progress of erection.

FINANCE.

The deficit at close of last half-year has been increased, as shown by statement of Receipt and Expenditure, during last six months, no rates having been collected during that period; the council, however, have not been required to give their personal security for the overdraft as hitherto.
