After the expiration of the present week, a weekly escort will be despatched from Ballaarat on Wednesday (commencing on the 14th May), leaving Ballaarat by the mid-day train, and arriving in Melbourne about Four p.m. It will return to Ballaarat by the train starting at Noon on Thursday.

The Ararat escort will thus take six days in coming to Melbourne and returning.

His Excellency the Governor directs the publication of the following notice relative to Eden Harbor Light, Twofold Bay, from which a light will be exhibited from sunset to sunrise, on and after the 24th May next.

EDEN HARBOR LIGHT, TWOFOLD BAY.

The Lighthouse is a white tower, built of wood, is 38 feet high to the centre of the lantern, and built on the southern extremity of Look-out Point, 102 feet above the level of the sea. The light consequently will be 140 feet above that level, and will be seen in clear weather from a ship's deck at a distance of nine miles, showing a fixed red light.

The Lighthouse is situated in latitude 37° 40' 30" south, longitude 149° 55' 30" east, from which the following bearings are taken :—

North point of Twofold Bay or Mewstone Point, north 40° east.

South Point or Red Head, south 60° east.

Jew's Point, south 50° east.

East Boyd, south 32° east.

The church at West Boyd, south 40° west.

Mount Imlay, south 45° west.

The light will be visible, seaward, from all points of an arc of 85°.

The point on which the Lighthouse is erected should not be approached within two cables' length when rounding the light, there being many detached rocks within that distance.

EMPLOYMENT OF CONVICT LABOR.

THE following Regulations as to the employment of prisoners for other than convict purposes (in lieu of the Regulations dated 9th September, 1856),* have been approved by the Governor in Council.

1. All work performed by prisoners for other than convict purposes is to be paid for by the department or party receiving the benefit thereof, unless special directions to the contrary are given by the Chief Secretary in reference to any particular work.

2. Articles required for the Store branch of the public service are, as far as may be found advantageous, to be manufactured by prison labor.

3. Articles (not coming under clause 2) may also be manufactured, and work performed, for other departments of the public service, upon authorized application from the head of the department.

4. Such clothing and accoutrements for the Police and Penal Departments as are paid for by the men, may be made, and the payment provided for in such manner as the internal arrangements of those departments may from time to time provide.

5. Prisoners may also be employed for the performance of such private work for the officers and warders of the Penal Department as they may require, strictly for their own personal or household necessities, on payment of Seven shillings and sixpence per man, per diem, for mechanics, and Five shillings for laborers, which is to be paid into the Treasury in the manner provided by the Regulations as to revenue; all materials to be found by the party for whom the work is performed.

6. The Inspector General is at liberty to sell by public auction, or otherwise, for the best price that can be obtained for the same, any stone, broken metal, or other raw material, solely the produce of prison labor, to any person or persons, paying the proceeds thereof into the Treasury, as provided by the Regulations as to revenue.

7. A return of all work undertaken by the Inspector General under the preceding clauses is to be forwarded monthly to the Honorable the Chief Secretary.

8. No benefit is to accrue to any department in consequence of receiving supplies of convict manufacture. Each department will be charged the full value of the article: the saving effected by the Government being the difference between the cost of the raw material used and the price charged, which will be carried to the credit of the general revenue as the proceeds of the labor of prisoners.

9. The Government Storekeeper is not to procure in any other manner articles which can be with advantage manufactured by prison labor, provided the Inspector General is in a position to make the supply within such period as may be named.

10. Expenditure in the purchase of materials for manufacturing purposes is, as a rule, to be conducted under the same regulations as govern the entire service. Inasmuch, however, as it is difficult to estimate in sufficient time for the quarterly requisition how much material will be required, requisitions for such "raw material" may be sent in from time to time by the Inspector General to the Government Storekeeper, and they are to be executed by that officer without submitting them for the approval of the Governor, since the material will be required only for works authorized, and will be accounted for both in quantity and value by the Inspector General.

11. The whole of the supplies thus furnished are to be charged in the Treasury to the item "Stores," or "Clothing and Bedding,"

as the case may be, of the vote for contingencies for Penal Establishments.

12. Such supplies as it may be desirable under clause 2 to have manufactured at Pentridge are to be ordered by the Government Storekeeper upon the Inspector General, and the articles required are to be manufactured at the earliest possible date.

13. The Inspector General is not to furnish manufactured articles for the public service which are comprised under clause 2 to any other department than the Government Stores.

14. No work, except in household service, is to be performed by the prisoners for the private benefit of the officers and men of the penal establishments, except as is provided under clauses 4 and 5.

15. Accounts are to be made out by the Inspector General against the departments receiving manufactured articles, or for which work is performed, as soon as possible after the execution of the order, and (as to those supplied under clause 2) are to be certified as to the price by the Government Storekeeper; and as to the supply by the Head of the Department; and as to the work done or articles supplied, under clause 3, by the Head of the Department only.

16. In these accounts it will be necessary for each description of article or work to be set down by the Inspector General at its value, a distinction being drawn between the cost of materials and the value of the labor.

17. On receipt of these vouchers, they will be charged by the Treasurer to the several departments, and paid in the usual manner to the Inspector General of Penal Establishments. That officer, upon receiving the moneys, will repay the amount, accompanied by a proper voucher, into the Treasury, under two heads, viz. — "Proceeds of Labor of Prisoners," which will be credited to the General Revenue; and "Repayment of Materials," which will be credited to the item of the vote for contingencies for Penal Establishments, against which the materials had been charged.

18. These regulations take effect from the 1st of January, 1862.

ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW NO. 1.—FOR REGULATING THE NUMBER OF HORSES AND CATTLE WHICH THE HOLDER OF A MINER'S RIGHT, BUSINESS LICENSE, OR CARRIER'S LICENSE, SHALL BE ENTITLED TO DEPASTURE ON THE GOLD-FIELDS COMMONS OF THE ARARAT MINING DISTRICT.

AT a meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ararat, begun and holden at the Mining Board Room, Ararat, in the said district, on the seventh day of April, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. Every holder of a miner's right or business license, and other residents, shall be entitled to depasture on the gold-fields commons of the Ararat district three (3) horses or six (6) head of cattle, two (2) horses and two (2) head of cattle, or one (1) horse and four (4) head of cattle.

2. Every holder of a carrier's license shall be entitled to depasture any number of horses not exceeding four (4), or any number of cattle not exceeding ten (10).

3. The holder of a miner's right, business license, or carrier's license, or the holder of two or more of the above licenses, shall only be entitled to depasture the number of horses or cattle allowed for one of the said licenses.

For the removal of the railway iron from Hyde street.—Complied with.

DEPUTATIONS.

Deputations have been appointed during the half-year to represent to the Government the undermentioned requirements, some of which have been conceded, and others remain under consideration.

To the Railway Department, to obtain improved accommodation by reduced fares, approaches to the station, unlocking the gates, and to open a road for cart traffic from the arch to Albert street.

To the Department of Land and Works, to obtain a sum placed on the Estimates of 1862, for a bridge over the Saltwater River at O'Farrell's punt.

To the same, for a supply of water from the Yan Yean to be laid along the Williamstown railway to Footscray.

INCOME.

An assessment has been made on all property in the district for the year ending 30th June, 1862, amounting to £13,368 5s., upon which a rate of 1s. in the pound has been imposed by by-law No. 13, duly gazetted.

POPULATION AND HEALTH.

The census completed on the 18th July last gives the number of persons in the municipality as 547 males and 542 females,

total 1069. The general health of the district compares favorably with all the other suburbs of Melbourne, and the return shows 35 births and 6 deaths; of the latter 4 were accidental and 2 from natural causes.

ELECTIONS.

On the 20th December, 1861, Councillor Geo. B. Kerferd having resigned the chair, Councillor Alexander Rodgers was unanimously elected chairman in his stead.

Councillor P. D. Ramsay having resigned his seat in the council on the 17th February, 1862, William Witt, Esq., was, on the 1st April, elected his successor.

WATER SUPPLY.

The council, after sending a deputation to the Government, at length, so far satisfactorily, concluded the negotiations relative to a subsidy as to be enabled to enter into contracts for at once carrying out the municipal water scheme, now known as the Beechworth water works.

This undertaking was commenced with the new year, and is progressing in a very satisfactory manner.

The details of the arrangement with the Government were duly published on the return of the deputation from Melbourne.

PUBLIC WORKS.

Little beyond necessary repairs have been carried out during the past half-year, the council deeming the water works a project of primary importance to the town and district, and therefore demanding their utmost consideration.

They may, however, state that Edward Clarke, Esq., barrister-at-law, and Dr. Gemmell, have kindly presented them with land sufficient for a new road twenty chains in length by a chain and a half wide, leading from Loch street to the public recreation reserve, upon condition that it be at once cleared and fenced. The council have therefore taken the necessary steps to have that condition complied with.

FINANCE.

The council append their usual half-yearly balance sheet, and would remark, with respect to the overdraft therein shown, that it arises in a great measure from the delay on the part of the Government in remitting the annual grant-in-aid, the first instalment of which is usually to hand long prior to this date.

Under this head the council would also mention that, fully recognising the vast importance to this municipality of the speedy completion of the Beechworth water works, they have deemed it advisable to levy a 1s. 6d. rate, to assist in meeting the outlay required in the execution of so beneficial an undertaking.
