TO CONTRACTORS AND OTHERS.

NOTICE WITH REGARD TO THE RESERVES FOR DEFENCES AT
WILLIAMSTOWN AND SANDRIDGE.

PERSONS are hereby cautioned against removing earth, sand, gravel, or brushwood; quarrying for, or removing stone; depositing rubbish, except from sites specially set apart; erecting huts, destroying the plants, buildings, and fences in the reserves for defences at Sandridge and Williamstown.

2. Any person found trespassing within the enclosure of the batteries within those reserves, or in any way disregarding the above caution, will be prosecuted with the utmost rigor of the law.

3. The limits of the reserves are detailed in the following extracts from the *Government Gazette*.

Government Gazette, No. 178, of the 6th December, 1861. —

"*St. Kilda*—For purposes of Defence at Hobson's Bay (Order dated 14th October, 1861).—Site No. 2: Commencing at a point bearing N. 45° W. two chains from the point of intersection of the south-west side of Acland street with the south-east side of Fitz Roy street; thence N. 45° W. twenty-three chains, more or less; thence N. 64° 36' W. one chain, more or less, to a point bearing S. 25° 24' W. one chain from the western angle of block No. 1 of building allotments, St. Kilda West; thence S. 25° 24' W. three chains fifty links, more or less, to high-water mark of Hobson's Bay; thence by high-water mark south-easterly to a point intersected to the north-west side of Fitz Roy street (St. Kilda); thence by that side of Fitz Roy street N. 25° 24' E. four chains fifty links, more or less, to the point of commencement.—(61.D.8214.)"

"*St. Kilda*—For purposes of Defence at Hobson's Bay (Order dated 14th October, 1861).—Site No. 3: Commencing at a point on the shore of Hobson's Bay at high-water mark, said point bearing S. 62° E. one chain and S. 28° W. two chains, more or less, from the south-east angle of portion A, Sandridge; thence N. 28° E. eleven chains, more or less, to a point bearing N. 64° 36' W. from the north-west angle of block 2 of building allotments, St. Kilda West; thence S. 64° 36' E. eighty-five chains; thence S. 23° W. nine chains, more or less, to high-water mark on the shore of Hobson's Bay (at high-water mark) north-westerly to the point of commencement. Area, about eighty-three and a quarter acres.—(61.D.8214.)"

Government Gazette No. 4, of the 13th January, 1862: —

"*Williamstown*—Site for Military purposes at Williamstown (pursuant to Order of the 23rd December, 1861).—Being the unappropriated Crown lands within the following described boundaries, county of Bourke, parish of Cut-paw-paw: Commencing at a point on the sea-coast bearing S. 76° 23' E. one chain fifty links, more or less, from the south-east angle of the railway reserve; thence N. 76° 23' W. sixteen chains twenty links, more or less, to the east side of a prolongation of Morris street; thence S. 45° W. thirty-three chains, more or less, to the sea-coast; and by the sea-coast easterly and north-easterly to the point of commencement.—(61.D.10153.)"

4. Posts painted white, and marked on one side with a broad arrow, will be erected at intervals to show the extent of the reserves.

5. After the 1st August, 1862, sites will be set apart at Williamstown and Sandridge from which sand and stone only can be removed.

6. These sites will be indicated by notice boards bearing the signature of the undersigned.

7. Until that date, persons desirous of removing sand and stone are hereby requested to send in applications to the undersigned.

ALTERATIONS IN THE RULES MADE BY THE TULLAROOP DISTRICT ROAD BOARD TO REGULATE ITS PROCEEDINGS.

IT having been found expedient to cancel section 2 of the Rules to regulate the proceedings of the Tullaroop Road Board, and to substitute an amendment in its place: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the said Tullaroop Road Board, that section 2 of the said Rules be rescinded, and that the following stand part of the said Rules, viz.—

The regular meetings shall be held at the office of the Board on the second Thursday in every month, at Two o'clock p.m.; the business of the board to commence as soon as the quorum of three is present, but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of half an hour after the said appointed time of meeting, the same shall be entered, with a note of the members present, in the minute book, and the meeting shall lapse.

LETHBRIDGE GENERAL CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations of Lethbridge General Cemetery.

1. The burial ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

2. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

3. By the eighth section of the Act, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever.

4. Application for such permission to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying, on payment of the charges in schedule A.

5. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

6. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, if required, at a uniform rate of (see schedule A); but parties wanting brick graves or vaults, will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. Orders for interment to be given to the sexton (or other person appointed by trustees) seven working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, if not, an extra charge will be made (see schedule A).

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked up, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, iron, or brick, to the satisfaction of the trustees.

10. The plans of all monuments, tombstones, and fences to be submitted to the trustees for approval.

11. Any person wantonly and wilfully destroying, or doing, or causing to be done, any damage to, any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof is liable to a penalty of Twenty pounds or three months' imprisonment, as prescribed by the 14th section of the Act 17 Victoria No. 12.

12. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for interments will be from Eight o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the month of September to April inclusive, and from Eight o'clock

a.m. to Four p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock p.m. throughout the year.

13. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of, the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. A plan of the cemetery and a register will be kept, and may be inspected at the charges set forth in schedule A.

15. The name, age, denomination, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order for interment.

16. The trustees reserve to themselves the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

FORM OF CERTIFICATE OF RIGHT OF BURIAL IN THE LETHBRIDGE GENERAL CEMETERY.

On the application of _____, and upon payment of the sum of _____, which is hereby acknowledged to have been received, the trustees of the Lethbridge General Cemetery, in terms of, and as authorised by, the Acts of Council 14 Victoria No. 19 and 17 Victoria No. 12, have agreed to grant, and do hereby grant, unto the said _____, permission to dig or make a grave or vault on

that piece of ground _____ feet long by _____ feet broad, lying within the portion of the said cemetery appropriated for _____ burials, and marked No. _____, compartment _____, on the map or plan of the said cemetery kept by the said trustees, with permission to erect or place on the said piece of ground a monument or tombstone on payment of such charges as may from time to time be established; and it is hereby declared that the said _____ shall be entitled to have, maintain, and keep up such vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of this permission, to and for the sole and separate use of the said _____ and his (or their) representatives for ever: Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this grant is made subject to the terms and conditions following, viz. :—

1st. That the said piece of ground shall be kept and used by the said _____ and his near relations, solely as a burying-place, and that no other use shall be made thereof.

2nd. That no enclosing wall or fence, building, monument, or tombstone, shall be erected or placed on the said piece of ground until a plan thereof shall have been exhibited to the said trustees, and their authority given for the erection thereof.

3rd. That the said grave or vault, and the said wall, fence, building, monument, or tombstone, shall be maintained and kept up by the said _____ and his representatives, in proper repair, to the satisfaction of the said trustees.

4th. That the said _____ and his heirs and near relations shall, in the use of the said piece of ground and access thereto, be subject in every respect to such rules and regulations as the trustees of the said cemetery may from time to time make, and shall not be entitled to exercise the right to bury or inter therein, except on payment of such charges as shall from time to time be established by the said trustees.

MUNICIPALITY OF CARISBROOK.

BYE-LAW No. 33.—TO REPEAL SO MUCH OF BYE-LAW No. 1, INTITLED, "A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE, BY MEANS OF STANDING ORDERS, THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CARISBROOK," AS RELATES TO THE HOLDING OF THE MEETINGS OF SUCH COUNCIL, AND TO MAKE FURTHER PROVISION IN LIEU THEREOF.

WHEREAS by a bye-law of the municipal council of Carisbrook, assented to by His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, intituled, *A Bye-law to regulate, by means of standing orders, the proceedings of the Council for the municipal district of Carisbrook*, provision was made for holding the meetings of such council every Thursday, at Four o'clock in the afternoon: And whereas it is expedient to repeal so much of the said bye-law as relates to the holding of the meetings of such council: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Carisbrook, with the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, as follows:—

1. That from and after the assent of His Excellency the Governor to this bye-law, so much of the said recited bye-law as relates to the holding of the meetings of such council shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. That the council shall meet every Monday at Four o'clock in the afternoon, and shall commence business at each meeting so soon as the legal quorum shall be present; but if at the expiration of thirty minutes after the appointed time of meeting there shall not be a quorum present the business of such meeting shall lapse.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 33, made by the municipal council of Carisbrook, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

BYE-LAW No. 19.—FOR REPEALING BYE-LAW No. 12, INTITLED, "A BYE-LAW FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A TOLL-BAR NEAR THE SLATY CREEK BRIDGE, ON THE MELBOURNE ROAD."

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that Bye-law No. 12, passed by the municipal council of Creswick, for the establishment of a toll-bar near the Slaty Creek Bridge, which received the sanction of His Excellency, and was gazetted on the 11th day of December, 1860, should be now repealed: Be it enacted by the municipal council of Creswick, that from and after the date on which His Excellency the Governor shall signify his assent hereto, the aforesaid bye-law No. 12 shall be repealed.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 19, made by the municipal council of Creswick, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

BYE-LAW No. 35.—A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE ANY ADDITIONS TO THE RATEPAYERS' ROLL AFTER ITS COMPLETION.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act, may make bye-laws for the regulation of their own proceedings, the collection of their rates, the conducting of elections, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district; and whereas by the 22nd section of the said Act it is enacted that if at any time after the completion of the ratepayers' roll any person not being liable to be placed on such roll at the time of its completion, shall thereafter become liable to be rated for, or on account of any house or land occupied or held within such district, it shall be competent for such person to apply to the municipal council to have his name inserted in such ratepayers' roll, and if it shall be made to appear to the satisfaction of such council that such person was not at the time of the completing or making the ratepayers' roll as aforesaid liable to be rated, but has since become so, and has in fact for the space of three months previous to such application been so liable, such council shall cause the name of such applicant to be placed on the ratepayers' roll; and whereas it is expedient that the mode in which such application to be placed on the ratepayers' roll after its completion, and the time and manner in which such application shall be heard and determined should be defined and regulated: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Sandhurst, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the provisions of the said Act:—

1. That any person desirous of having his name placed on the ratepayers' roll after its completion, shall and may make application to the said council in the form hereto annexed.

2. That such application shall state whether the applicant claims as owner or occupier, the length of time he has been such owner or occupier, his present place of abode, and contain a description of the nature of the property, and its situation.

3. That the council shall cause a list to be made of all such applications, and a copy or copies thereof to be publicly exhibited on some conspicuous part of one or more places of public resort within the municipal district of Sandhurst, together with

a notice of the time when, and the place where, the council will meet to hear and determine on such applications, and shall also cause such list and notice to be published twice in one or more of the newspapers published within the boundaries of the said municipal district.

4. That it shall not be competent for the council to hear and determine on any such application until the provisions contained in the 4th clause of this bye-law have been complied with; and in no case shall any such application be complied with by the council until fourteen clear days shall have elapsed from the time of the same being received by the council.

5. That it shall be competent for the council to require the personal attendance of any applicant if deemed necessary by them.
