EDEN HARBOR LIGHT, TWOFOLD BAY.

IT having been found necessary to correct the latitude of Eden Harbor Light, as stated in the Government notice, dated 23rd ultimo, the following description is now published for general information.

EDEN HARBOR LIGHT, TWOFOLD BAY.

The Lighthouse is a white tower, built of wood, is 38 feet high to the centre of the lantern, and built on the southern extremity of Look-out Point, 102 feet above the level of the sea. The light consequently will be 140 feet above that level, and will be seen in clear weather from a ship's deck at a distance of nine miles, showing a fixed red light.

The Lighthouse is situated in latitude 37° 4' 30" south, longitude 149° 55' 30" east, from which the following bearings are taken:—

North point of Twofold Bay or Mewstone Point, north 40° east.

South Point or Red Head, south 60° east.

Jew's Point, south 50° east.

East Boyd, south 32° east.

The church at West Boyd, south 40° west.

Mount Imlay, south 45° west.

The light will be visible, seaward, from all points of an arc of 85°.

The point on which the Lighthouse is erected should not be approached within two cables' length, when rounding the light, there being many detached rocks within that distance.

MUNICIPALITY OF CASTLEMAINE.

BYE-LAW No. 59.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF HOUSE AND LAND PROPERTY WITHIN THE DISTRICT OF CASTLEMAINE, FOR THE YEAR 1862.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make an annual assessment of all property in

houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district, according to their fair average annual value: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Castlemaine, that the assessment on the annual value of property within this municipal district, estimated at (£88,097) Eighty-eight thousand and ninety-seven pounds, as approved by the justices of the peace in Petty Sessions, shall be the value, and be legal and in force, for the municipal year commencing the 22nd January, 1862.

BYE-LAW No. 60.—FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CASTLEMAINE, FOR THE YEAR 1862.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district, according to their fair average annual value, such rate not to exceed the sum of Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Castlemaine, that a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current year be levied on all property in houses and lands within the limits of this municipal district; one moiety to be collected on and after the 1st day of June, and the second moiety on and after the 1st day of December, 1862.

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 59 and 60, made by the municipal council of Castlemaine, have been assented to by the Governor in Council.

TOWN OF HOTHAM.

FIFTH Half-yearly Report of the Proceedings of the Municipal Council of Hotham, from the 20th day of October, 1861, to the 19th day of April, 1862.

ANNUAL ELECTION, 20TH OCTOBER, 1861.

Messrs. Councillors Campbell, Barwise, and Carroll's term of office having expired, Messrs. Campbell and Carroll were re-elected, and Mr. G. M. Hardess was elected in the room of Mr. Councillor Barwise.

At the first meeting of the council for the present year, the late chairman, F. T. Gell, Esq., was unanimously re-elected chairman.

The past council being unable to clear off the debt, the present council found themselves, upon accession to office, liable for £550 over available assets.

On the 6th January last, the following resolution was passed by the council:—"Upon viewing the statement of liabilities and assets now submitted by the finance committee, be it resolved, that no works of an expensive nature be entered into until the council is in a position to pay for the same."
The amount paid for public works this half-year was £1527 4s. 3d.

ASSESSMENT.

The valuation of rateable property within the municipal district, after deducting the reductions made by the court of appeal, amounted to £37,434, which, at the rate of 1s. 3d. in the pound, would produce £2338. Of this sum there has been collected £760 14s. 9d., including a few arrears, leaving £1578 now due.
