REGISTRATION OF PARLIAMENTARY VOTERS, 1862.

IT is hereby notified that persons claiming to have their names placed upon the Electoral Roll must give notice to the Registrar of the division for which they claim to be registered, on or before the 10th day of June next.

Any person objecting to any other person as not entitled to have his name retained or inserted in any roll, may give notice thereof either in the manner prescribed by the 13th and 23rd sections of the Act No. 81, or by publishing a notice in some newspaper, as prescribed by the 8th section of the Act No. 137.

Such further information as may be required will be afforded by the Electoral Registrars, from whom also, as well as from all postmasters, clerks of petty sessions, deputy registrars of births and deaths, and officers in charge of police stations, forms may be obtained free of charge.
