#### WILFUL MURDER.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.—FREE PARDON TO AN ACCESSARY.

**WHEREAS** between half-past Four o'clock in the afternoon of Friday, the 23rd of May last, and Ten o'clock on the following morning, Edmund Cuckson, formerly residing at the Wild Dog Brewery, near Queenstown, was murdered at the Big Hill, Mountain Rush road, apparently by means of a shot from a pistol: Notice is hereby given that a reward of One hundred pounds will be paid for such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons guilty of murdering the said Edmund Cuckson.

His Excellency the Governor will also extend Her Majesty's free pardon to any person implicated in the said murder as an accessory after the fact, who will give the required information.

#### PARTICULARS TO AID DETECTION.

A person passing in the neighborhood of the locality where the murdered man was found, states that he heard a shot fired about a quarter past Five o'clock in the evening of the 23rd.

The following property which Mr. Cuckson had with him is missing, viz.:—A bay pony, branded H6 off shoulder, a little white about the hind feet, and with a full switch tail; a good piskin saddle, one flap loose at the top of the knee-pad, two white girths attached; a good snaffle bridle with smooth plain snaffle bit; a hunting crop of Malacca cane-cracked on both sides of the horn handle; a pair of plated spurs; a railway rug, black on one side and brown on the other, with a stag's head in the centre and a fox's head at each corner, slit for the neck bound with black braid, and the outer edge bound with black braid of a different kind. Mr. Cuckson is also supposed to have had about £15 with him.

#### THE LINTON SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT.

##### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to make provision for the sale of fermented and spirituous liquors and of refreshments in certain districts*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said colony to be a district subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called a Special Licensing District, and to define the boundaries of such district, and from time to time to vary, alter, and revoke such boundaries: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and proclaim that the part or portion of Victoria hereinafter defined shall be and constitute a Special Licensing District, subject to the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

**THE LINTON SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT**—Commencing at a point on Baillie's Creek, where it is intersected by the eastern boundary of the township of Carnham; thence by part of the eastern, the northern, and part of the western sides of the township of Carnham northerly, westerly, and southerly

to Baillie's Creek; again by said creek westerly to the eastern boundary of the township of Chepstowe by part of the eastern, the northern, and part of the western sides of Chepstowe northerly, westerly, and southerly to Baillie's Creek; thence by said creek southerly to a point intersected by the western boundary of the county of Greenville; by said country boundary southerly, being a line and the Gnarket chain of ponds to a point where the said chain of ponds is intersected by the main road from Lismore to Cressy; thence by said road south-easterly to the west side of the township of Cressy, by the west, south, and east boundaries of said township of Cressy southerly, easterly, and northerly to the main road (three chains wide), leading from Cressy to Inverleigh; by said main road easterly to the Yarrowee River, and by that river northerly to its confluence with Williamson's Creek; thence by a straight line bearing north-westerly (said line forming the western boundary of the Buninyong special licensing district) to the east side of the township of Carnham, being the point of commencement.

## FARMERS' COMMON AT SANDFORD.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common;" provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land at or near the locality hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for a Farmers' Common in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be a FARMERS' COMMON for the use of the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act.

FARMERS' COMMON FOR AGRICULTURISTS AT SANDFORD.—1570 acres, more or less, being the unappropriated Crown Lands within the following boundaries: Commencing at a point on the south boundary of the village reserve of Sandford where it is intersected by the Wannon River; thence west by the south boundary of the village reserve to a point on the east side of the road from Casterton to Portland, bearing due east from the north-east angle of allotment 5, section 1; thence southerly by the main line of road from Casterton to Portland to a point bearing due east from the south-east angle of allotment 3, section 2; thence east to the Wannon River, and by that river north-westerly to the point of commencement.—(62.F.2801.)

## FINANCE.

The total assessment for the year amounted to £2919 10s., which was reduced on appeal £235, and by property discovered to be without the boundary, £693; a supplementary assessment finally settled the total value of rateable property at £2669 10s.

In the face of the urgent requirements of the town for public works of primary importance, the council have found it necessary to use the strictest economy in management. The present council chambers and office have been rented at Twenty-five pounds per annum, and although a building or hall belonging to the council would be more desirable and of great public utility and convenience for divers purposes, it is feared that some time must elapse before the council can spare funds from the road works.

## PUBLIC WORKS.

Unlike the majority of towns that have availed themselves of the advantages of municipal government, St. Arnaud is situated at a distance from the line of any main road. Under these circumstances the council urged the extension of the present mail road from Castlemaine through Maldon as a main road to St. Arnaud, and the matter was brought before Parliament by the member for the district, John Woods, Esq., who forcibly seconded the arguments put forth by the council. The Govern-

ment, however, opposed the extension, and the district road board has undertaken the construction of the roads to Castlemaine and Ballarat, and has invited the council to continue the line through the municipality, a distance of four miles. This important and necessary work has been approved of by the Board of Land and Works, and a minimum outlay of £2200 will be required to execute it. The smallness of the preliminary endowment for 1861, viz., £500, has prevented the council from proceeding with the work in its entirety, but the worst portions of the road are now under contract, and the largest of the five bridges and culverts on the line is in course of erection. It is proposed to renew the application for a special grant in aid of the road, as the council find that many other useful improvements in the town have to be postponed owing to the great outlay on it.

## BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have passed the council:—  
 Bye-law No. 1. For regulating the proceedings of the council. Not yet assented to.  
 Bye-law No. 2. For making an assessment and imposing a rate of One shilling in the pound.—Assented to.

Applications have been made to Government on the following subjects:—

The establishment of a daily mail to St. Arnaud.—Granted.  
 To transfer the police camp to the reserve in Napier street, and for the erection of suitable accommodation.—Granted.

For the construction of a reservoir.—The council obtained a promise from the Department of Public Works, that the scheme should be proceeded with at the commencement of the year. In consequence of the great importance of the subject to the district, and no steps having been taken in the matter by Government, the council were induced to make a second application, which has resulted in the information that plans, &c., were ready, and that the consent of Government would be asked to proceed with the works immediately on the passing of the vote by Parliament.

For the survey of agricultural land to the westward of the town.—Granted.

To appoint a receiver and paymaster for the district.—The Treasurer, whilst declining to accede to the request at the present time, has promised that the matter shall be kept under notice.

For the establishment of a county court and court of mines. Not yet decided.

For the appropriation of a sum of money, out of the vote of 1861, to St. Arnaud.—£500 granted.

For the amendment of the municipal boundary.—Not yet decided.

To cause such a divergence of the proposed line of telegraph to Swan Hill that St. Arnaud might be included in the route.—Refused.
