FARMERS' COMMON ON THE NORTH SIDE OF KYNETON, ETC., ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, a certain area, therein described, situate on the north side of Kyneton and east of the Campaspe River, was proclaimed to be a Farmers' Common: And whereas it is expedient to substitute another area in lieu of the said common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the Farmers' Common aforesaid, and I do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be the FARMERS' COMMON for the use of the occupiers of purchased land at or near the locality hereinafter mentioned, within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:-

FARMERS' COMMON—On north side of Kyneton, and east of the Campaspe River, county of Dalhousie, parishes of Langley, Baynton, and Glenhope.—Extent about 20,379 acres, being portions 1 to 26, parish of Langley; also the following described lands: Commencing at a point on Piper's Creek, being the south-west angle of portion 55, parish of Glenhope; thence easterly to the north-west angle of portion 46; thence southerly by a straight line to the south-west angle of portion 45; thence easterly to the south-east angle of the last-named portion; thence southerly to the south-west angle of portion 25; thence south-easterly to the south-west angle of portion 22; thence by the south boundaries of portions 22, 23, and 18, easterly to Pohlman's Creek; thence by that creek and a road southerly to the south-east angle of portion 5, parish of Baynton; thence westerly to the north-west angle of Baynton's pre-emptive right; thence southerly by the western boundary of said pre-emptive right and a line to a point bearing east from the north-east angle of portion 34, parish of Langley; thence westerly to the north-west angle of portion 34; thence north about one hundred and eighty chains to a creek; thence westerly by that creek to its junction with Piper's Creek, and by the last-named creek northerly to the point of commencement. Exclusive of all appropriated Crown lands.—(62.E.3768.)
