The Central Board has been informed that in some cases the blacks have succeeded in obtaining intoxicating liquors in exchange for their clothing; and it is now notified that if any case of this kind come under the notice of the Central Board or the honorary correspondents, the person receiving the clothing will be prosecuted.

TOWN COMMON FOR HOTHAM.—320 acres, more or less, being the unappropriated lands within the limits hereinafter described: Commencing at a point on the south side of the Flemington road due north of the north-east angle of portion 17, parish of Doulla Gallia; thence south to the east angle of said allotment 17; thence south-westerly by the south-east boundary of said allotment 17 to its south-east angle; thence east to the south-west angle of block 73, Hotham; thence northerly to the

No. 18.—A BYE-LAW FOR LEVYING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND ON THE ANNUAL VALUE OF PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF AVOCA.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is with other things enacted, that the municipal council of any municipal district shall cause an annual value to be fixed on all houses and lands within the boundaries of such municipality, and to impose a rate on such annual valuation not exceeding Two shillings in the pound: And whereas the municipal council of Avoca has made such valuation (full particulars of which are lodged in offices of the said council): Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Avoca, that a rate of One shilling in the pound be levied therein for the current municipal year (the fourth), one moiety to be due and payable in the 23rd day of June, 1862, and the second moiety to be due and payable on the 23rd day of December, 1862: Provided, nevertheless, that all sums of Ten shillings and under shall be due and payable in due payment on the 22nd day of June, 1862.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 18, made by the municipal council of Avoca, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

MUNICIPALITY OF SMYTHESDALE.

BYE-LAW No. 7 OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF SMYTHESDALE.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for regulating the killing and sale of butchers' meat: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Smythesdale, with the assent of His Excellency the Governor, that all butchers or other persons whose premises shall have been suitably prepared and properly paved for the purpose of slaughtering, so that in the judgment of the council after the report of the inspector or other officer, the premises are found to be in a fit and proper state, shall be granted a license and permitted to kill sheep, lambs, swine, or goats, provided that all such persons shall receive, or cause to be received, the blood into tubs, together with all offal or other offensive matter, and remove the same, or cause it to be removed, from such premises at least once in every twenty-four hours.

That all such premises shall be registered at the office of the town clerk, and the same premises shall always be open to the inspection of the municipal council or their inspector or other officer.

That no butcher or other person as aforesaid shall kill any sheep, lambs, swine, or goats, except upon premises registered as aforesaid, and without being duly licensed, except such butcher or other person be the *bona fide* servant of a duly licensed person.

That it shall not be lawful for any licensed butcher or other person to kill sheep, lambs, swine, or goats, on premises distinct and apart, except all such premises are severally registered, and a license be taken out to slaughter on each of such premises as though they belonged to different owners and persons.

That written notice of application for such license and registration shall be given to the town clerk at least eight days before the same be granted, made, and entered, and be exhibited at his office; and that the said license and registration shall issue and be made on the first Friday in every month or upon such other day as the council may appoint.

That any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 7, made by the municipal council of Smythesdale, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.
