THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF INGLEWOOD.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign (number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Inglewood.

MELTON TOWN COMMON ENLARGED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of February in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, a certain area, therein described, was proclaimed to be a Town Common for the use of the inhabitants of the town of Melton: And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said common, and to proclaim another area in lieu thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the said Town Common; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim that the Crown lands hereinafter mentioned shall be and constitute a Town Common

for the use of the inhabitants of the said town of Melton, within the intent and meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

TOWN COMMON FOR MELTON.—450a, more or less, county of Bourke, parish of Djerriwarrh, allotment D and part of allotment B, section 5, Djerriwarrh: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment D; bounded on the west by a road, bearing north about sixty-six chains twenty links; thence east sixty-seven chains, more or less, to the Toolam-toolern Creek: thence by that creek southerly to a point due east of the commencing point; thence west fifty-eight chains, more or less, to the point of commencement.—(61.D.10824.)

WANGARATTA TOWN COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim that any Crown lands in the vicinity of any town shall be a common for the use of the inhabitants of such town, and all the inhabitants of such town and its vicinity shall, from the time of such proclamation, be entitled to depasture their cattle and horses on such common, and such common shall be called a "Town Common;" and it is further enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, or in case such Town Common shall be included within or adjoin the limits of any municipal district, then for the municipal council of such district, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for determining how many horses and cattle every such inhabitant shall be entitled to depasture on any Town Common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the Crown lands comprised within the area hereinafter described shall be a Town Common within the meaning of the said Act, for the use of the inhabitants of the town of Wangaratta, that is to say:—

TOWN COMMON FOR WANGARATTA.—Estimated area, about 1200 acres, county unnamed: Commencing at the north-east angle of G. Gray's pre-emptive section, Wangaratta; bounded on the south by that section bearing westerly, and also on the south and west by the King River, bearing northerly to its intersection with the south boundary of the township of Wangaratta; on the north by the south boundary of that township bearing east, and again on the west by the east boundary of that township bearing north to the main road; on the north by that road bearing south-easterly to the north-east angle of allotment 1, North Wangaratta; thence by the west boundary of that allotment to a point on the south bank of the Ovens River, opposite the south-west angle of that allotment; thence by the south bank of that river bearing south-easterly to a point

opposite the south-east angle of allotment 5, parish of North Wanganatta; and on the south-east by a line bearing south-westerly to commencing point, as shown by plan deposited in the Public Lands Office, Melbourne, and exclusive of all appropriated lands within the before-mentioned limits.—(61.D.10162.)

FARMERS' COMMON AT LAANECOOBIE.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common," provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common. And whereas the occupiers of purchased land at or near the locality hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for a Farmers' Common in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be a FARMERS' COMMON for the use of the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and also under and subject to such conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common as are or may be prescribed, that is to say:—

FARMERS' COMMON FOR AGRICULTURISTS AT LAANECOOBIE, County unnamed, Parish of Laanecoorie, being the unappropriated Crown lands within the parish abovenamed. Approximate area 5650 acres, more or less.—(61.D.10973.)

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PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR RICHARD GRAVES MACDONNELL,
Knight Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of Her Majesty's Province of South Australia, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth years of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled, *An Act to enable the Governor to prevent the Importation of Cattle into South Australia, and for other purposes*, it was enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor, from time to time, and at any time thereafter, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, by proclamation in the *South Australian Government Gazette*, to prohibit the introduction or importation of any cattle, or any particular description of cattle, into the said province from such places and during such time as should be set forth in such Proclamation: Now therefore I, the said Governor, in pursuance of the said authority, and of all other powers me enabling, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, order, and direct that from the day of the date hereof, no horned cattle, except such as being free from the disease known as pleuro-pneumonia shall be authorised to be imported, under a permission in writing signed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands, shall be introduced or imported into the Province of South Australia from either of the colonies of New South Wales, Victoria, or Tasmania: And I do also proclaim, order, and direct that this my Proclamation shall continue in full force and effect until the same shall be revoked by proclamation in the *South Australian Government Gazette*.

Given under my Hand and the Public Seal of the said Province, this twelfth day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

The market bye-law, No. 23, has not yet received the assent of His Excellency, but the Government have promised to gazette it on certain alterations being effected.

MISCELLANEOUS.

An arrangement has been entered into with the Volunteer Fire Brigade, by which the council defrays the whole of the working expenses of that body. An engine-house has been leased by the council for the use of the brigade.

Owing to misrepresentations having been made to the late Government, a proclamation appeared in the *Government Gazette* of the 10th May, curtailing the area of our Circuit Court and General Sessions districts to a very great extent, transferring to the Maryborough district the whole of the McKinnon's, Navarre, and Redbank gold fields, and actually taking from our district the township of Crowlands, a place only thirteen miles distant. Owing to the exertions of this council, and to a memorial numerously signed by the inhabitants of the abovementioned places, protesting against such a change, being presented to the Honorable the Attorney General, the proclamation was rescinded on the 29th of the same month, and our original boundaries were thus restored.
