THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF EAGLEHAWK.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **SIR HENRY BARKLY**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereinafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has

been presented to the Governor by the householders and landholders resident at and near Eaglehawk, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act, and no counter-petition, in accordance with the terms of the said Act, has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF EAGLEHAWK.—Commencing at the south angle of the proposed municipal district, bearing about N. 15° 45' E. ninety-two chains, more or less, and about N. 24° 40' W. sixty chains, more or less, from Larritt's post, at an angle on the western boundary of the municipality of Sandhurst; thence by a line bearing about N. 23° 40' W. ninety-four chains, more or less; thence about N. 66° W. one hundred and nine chains, more or less; thence about N. 53° W. one hundred and four chains, more or less; thence about N. 20° E. thirty-two chains, more or less; thence about N. 89° 20' E. one hundred and forty-four chains, more or less; thence about N. 75° 40' E. fifty-two chains, more or less; thence about S. 53° E. one hundred and seventy-one chains, more or less; thence about S. 49° W. one hundred and forty-five chains, more or less; and thence about S. 15° 45' W. fifty-five chains, more or less, to the point of commencement. Area, about 3735 acres.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Eaglehawk."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-second day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and in the twenty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

LANDS TEMPORARILY RESERVED.

IT is hereby notified, in pursuance of the 9th section of the Act No. 145, that the Governor in Council has temporarily reserved from sale the lands hereinafter described for the several purposes specified in connection with each description, viz. :—

BALLAARAT, SMYTHESDALE, AND SCARSDALE TRAMWAY.—Land temporarily reserved by Order of 15th July, 1862, for a Tramway from Ballarat to Smythesdale and Scarsdale: Commencing at a point on the west side of Drummond street, Ballarat, where the said street joins the southern boundary of the municipality of Ballarat West, and proceeding by a curve of twenty-six chains radius the chord of which bears S. 45° 52' W. distance seventeen chains; thence by a curve of thirty chains radius the chord of which bears S. 33° 50' W. distance twenty-three chains; thence by a straight line bearing S. 10° 13' W. distance one hundred and thirty-two chains thirty links; thence by a curve of forty chains radius the chord of which bears S. 38° 55' W. distance thirty-five chains ten links; thence by a line bearing S. 63° 50' W. distance ninety-four chains; thence by a line bearing S. 53° W. distance three hundred and twenty-eight chains; thence by a curve of forty chains radius the chord of which bears N. 60° 52' W. distance sixty-three chains; thence by a curve of fifteen chains radius the chord of which bears N. 60° 52' W. distance twenty-one chains fifteen links; thence by a curve of forty chains radius the chord of which bears N. 78° 45' W. distance forty-eight chains twenty links; thence by a curve of twenty chains radius the chord of which bears N. 89° 50' W. distance thirty chains eighty links; thence by a line bearing S. 30° 48' W. distance forty-eight chains ten links; thence by a line bearing S. 35° 15' W. distance fifty-six chains; thence by a line bearing S. 21° 30' W. distance fifty-eight chains ninety links; thence by a curve of forty chains radius the chord of which bears S. 36° 30' W. distance seventeen chains fifty links; thence by a line bearing S. 55° 23' W. distance thirty-five chains; thence by a curve of twenty chains radius the chord of which bears S. 79° 20' W. distance eleven chains; thence by a curve of fifteen chains radius the chord of which bears S. 53° 30' W. distance ten chains fifty links; thence by a line bearing S. 30° 32' W. distance forty-five chains sixty links to the north-east corner of No. 1 allotment, Scarsdale; and thence by a line bearing S. 18° 30' W. distance fifty-two chains to the proposed terminus at Scarsdale. The above description has reference to the centre line of tramway, the land temporarily reserved extending one hundred links on each side of said centre line, having reference only to the unappropriated Crown Lands through which the proposed tramway will pass.—(62.F.4604.)—Gazetted, first, 25th July, 1862.

NUNAWADING ROAD DISTRICT.

REGULATIONS OF THE NUNAWADING DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

THAT the regular meetings of this board be held at such times and places as the board may direct, and that the business shall commence as soon as the legal quorum is present; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of half an hour after the time appointed for meeting, the same shall be entered, with a note of the members present, in the minute book, and such meetings shall lapse.

2. That special meetings shall be summoned at any time by the chairman, upon receiving a written requisition signed by two members, stating the matter to be discussed at such meeting.

3. That no such meeting be held unless notice shall have been given thereof at least three days; that such notice shall be given by the secretary sending circulars, three days before the same is to be held, to each of the members.

4. That the first business at all meetings of the board shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting, in order to their confirmation; and that no discussion shall be allowed thereupon except as to their accuracy.

5. The reading of correspondence, presentation of petitions by members, and bringing up reports, shall have precedence of the regular business at all meetings of the board.

6. On the presentation of a petition, no debate shall take place thereon until the next meeting of the board.

7. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under the notice of the board.

8. Notices of motion (excepting as appears by the 10th rule) shall be given in writing to the secretary of the board one meeting previous to the making of the same, and all such notices shall be considered in the order in which they were given.

9. No notice shall be proceeded with unless the member who gave notice of it, or some member authorised by him, be present when the business is called on, and notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out.

10. Notices of motion involving the expenditure of smaller sums than £10 may be acted upon at the meeting at which they are brought forward, as also may orders for the payment of any salaries.

11. That no payment of any account whatever be made unless it shall be first approved and ordered to be paid by the board.

12. That the treasurer shall at every meeting lay before the board a statement of all moneys that have been paid into his hands since the previous meeting of the board, together with the bank book.

13. Any member, on proposing a motion or amendment, or of speaking on any matter, must rise and address the chairman. No member when speaking shall be interrupted, unless called to order, when he shall sit down, in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other, and the question of order shall be disposed of by the chairman before the subject is resumed or any other matter entered upon. The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state his opinion upon the subject, and, if necessary, take the sense of the meeting thereupon. The decision of a majority, in such cases, shall be final.

14. Any member making a motion or amendment shall put it in form, sign it, and deliver it to the secretary, who shall add the name of the seconder, and no motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without leave of the board.

15. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment. Should two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to be heard in preference; and no member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment except by way of explanation, or in reply to any original motion or amendment of which he may have been the mover, and the chairman shall call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time; after the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be put to the vote.

16. No member shall digress from the matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to others.

17. Any member who shall use any expression which may be applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the chairman, withdraw such expression and apologize to the board.

18. Any person not being a member of the board who shall conduct himself in a manner that the chairman and a majority of the members who shall be present at such meeting shall consider disorderly, must leave the board room.

19. The board shall vote by show of hands.

20. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the board, shall be entertained during the current year, unless a call of the whole board has been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board which shall have been negatived by the board, shall be again entertained during the current year.

21. No election to any office shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in the local newspapers, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

22. No member or officer of the board shall be allowed to tender for any work to be done for or in connection with this board, or be received as surety for any contractor for such work, or work for any contractor engaged under the board.

23. All contracts shall be made by tender, advertised in one of the local newspapers. Each tender shall be addressed to the chairman, and such tender or tenders only to be opened at the time of their consideration by the board, and which tender shall be so considered and dealt with at the next meeting of the board which shall happen after the said tenders are required to be sent in; and when tenders are accepted, a contract bond shall be entered into, signed by the contractor and his surety or sureties and by the chairman of the board; and the expense of preparing such bond shall in all cases be borne by the person or persons giving the same.
