## TOLLS ON THE SANDRIDGE ROAD.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of June in the present year, it was declared and ordered that the Board of Land and Works should collect or cause to be collected tolls, not exceeding the rates of tolls therein specified, for all animals and vehicles passing through or by any toll-bars, toll-gates, or toll-houses on main or other roads under the charge of the said Board: And whereas it is expedient to adopt a new scale of tolls for the Sandridge road: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the rates of tolls specified in the said Proclamation, so far as the same extend to the road commonly called or known as the Sandridge road, in the county of Bourke; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby authorise the said Board of Land and Works to collect or cause to be collected tolls for all animals and vehicles passing or repassing through or by any toll-bar or toll-gate erected on the Sandridge road aforesaid, at rates not exceeding the rates hereinafter declared, that is to say:—

NOTE.—Each driver of an empty cart, dray, or other such vehicle passing through the toll-gate for the purpose of obtaining manure shall, on payment of the full rate of toll, be entitled to receive a ticket stating the date and amount of toll paid, which amount (less one penny) shall be refunded to the driver of such cart, dray, or other vehicle when returning on the same day laden with manure.

Tolls payable one way only for going and returning on the same day.

## LANDS TEMPORARILY RESERVED.

IT is hereby notified, in pursuance of the 9th section of the Act No. 145, that the Governor in Council has temporarily reserved from sale the lands hereinafter described for the several purposes specified in connection with each description, viz.:—

The petitioners state that they are householders residing in the township of Rutherglen, and that it is in the centre of a large and important mining and agricultural district, the population of which, according to the census returns, is over four thousand.

They further state, that the town contains more than three hundred householders; that the buildings are, for the most part, well and substantially constructed; and that at the earnest wish of the townspeople the land in the township has recently been sold; but that as at present no means exist for effecting local improvements otherwise than by private enterprise, the streets and roadways are unformed, and in winter partially impassable.

They therefore believe that the establishment of a municipality will greatly conduce to the prosperity and permanent welfare of the town, and suggest the following municipal boundaries, viz.:—Commencing from a point sixty-seven chains south-east (magnetic) from the south-eastern angle of allotment No. 7, section 20, parish of Carlyle; bearing thence due west one mile; bearing thence due north two miles; bearing thence due east one mile; bearing thence due south two miles to the commencing point.

## PROPOSED ROAD DISTRICT.

## ESTCOURT PARISH.

A MEMORIAL, bearing the signatures of twenty-six residents at Estcourt, has been addressed to the Governor, the substance and prayer of which are as follow:—

The memorialists state that they form part of a very numerous agricultural population located in the parish of Estcourt to the north of Wangaratta, and that though their lands were purchased from the Crown some years ago no steps have ever been taken for the formation of their roads, the ill-condition of which renders them desirous of a road district being created, the area to be as follows: "Commencing at the junction of Reedy Creek with the road between allotment 1 of section A, and allotment 1 of section B, North Wangaratta; extending from thence along that road one hundred and twenty-three chains, bearing N. 51° E.; bounded on the east by agricultural allotments in North Wangaratta; from thence by a line bearing N. 39° W. to the north-eastern boundary of Estcourt; from thence to and along the back of occupation-license farms to the north-east corner of Thomas McKenzie's occupation farms; on the north by the northern boundaries of Thomas and Murdock McKenzie's farms to the Ovens River; on the west by the Ovens River to its junction with the Reedy Creek, and by the Reedy Creek to the commencing point."

And they pray as follows:—

"Your memorialists therefore pray that your Excellency will take the matter into favorable consideration, and cause the district as defined [above] to be proclaimed a road district in accordance with the Acts 16 Victoria No. 40 and 17 Victoria No. 29."

## PROPOSED ROAD DISTRICT.

## STANLEY AND VICINITY.

A MEMORIAL, bearing the signatures of two hundred and six storekeepers, traders, and miners, residing in the "Stanley" [Snake Valley?] division of the mining district of Beechworth, has been addressed to the Governor, the substance and prayer of which are as follow:—

The memorialists state that they have suffered great loss and inconvenience from the almost impassable state of their roads during the winter months; and that from the settlement of this part of the Ovens gold fields in 1852 to the present—a period of ten years—scarcely anything has been done to improve the roads in their locality, only a sum of £1100 having been expended on the main line of road to Beechworth, and all the other roads being totally neglected.

They further state that the "division of Stanley" contains a population of about 2000, the majority of whom are interested in water rights, which operate as a salutary check to the periodical fluctuations common on other gold fields, and impart a settled character to the locality; that numerous puddling mills, worked by horses, have recently been erected; and that forage and farm produce, in great demand and abounding in the

vicinity, are rendered artificially scarce and dear through the difficulty encountered in transporting it.

They moreover state that within the last twelve months a number of quartz reefs have been opened up at Rocky Point, on the northern side of the division, and promise to be highly remunerative, and other reefs recently discovered in the immediate vicinity of the town of Stanley are being worked with vigor, the effects of which will conduce to the stability of the district and to the increase of the population.

And the memorialists pray as follows:—

"Your memorialists believe that much good will result to the community of this division by the formation of a local road board, and pray that your Excellency may be pleased to proclaim the Stanley division a road district in accordance with the provisions of the Acts 16 Victoria No. 40 and 17 Victoria No. 29, the area of such road district to be that comprised in the Stanley division of the mining district of Beechworth, as defined in the *Government Gazette* of 5th January, 1858 (under the title of Snake Valley division), the respective boundaries of which are as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the Dingle Range; thence north three miles and twenty chains; thence east five miles and forty chains, more or less, to the Yackandandah Gap; thence south four miles and twenty chains; thence south-west by the north-western tributary of the Yackandandah Creek two miles and forty chains; and thence by the range north-westerly to the commencing point."

## MELBOURNE AND GEELONG CORPORATIONS ACTS AMENDMENT BILL.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made in the next session of the Parliament of Victoria for leave to bring in a Bill, intitled, *A Bill to further alter and amend the Laws relating to the Corporations of the City of Melbourne and of the Town of Geelong respectively, and to extend and apply other existing Acts thereto.* And notice is hereby given, that by such bill it is intended to apply for powers to adopt the ballot in the election of councillors, auditors, and assessors; to forbid the holding of such elections in public houses; to appoint branch polling places, arranged alphabetically; to limit the tenure of office by aldermen to four years; to disqualify members of the council absent from meetings for two months; to disqualify persons convicted of treason, felony, personation at elections, or other infamous offence, for election as members of the council; to elect the mayor for each ensuing year on the ninth day of October, the mayor then elected to assume office on the ninth day of November, and to be in the interim styled the mayor elect, and be, ex officio, a justice of the peace within the corporate limits; to empower the town clerk in certain cases to convene meetings of the council; to render the annual election of treasurer and other officers unnecessary; to compel officers receiving money for the corporation to pay same to the treasurer within seven days at farthest, and treasurer to lodge all money received by him in bank to credit of town fund within four days at farthest, under liability of prosecution for misdemeanor; to limit the number of advertisements requisite for the publication of bye-laws, and for the declaration of rates; to extinguish the exemption of untenanted premises from rating, save in respect to buildings unoccupied for three months; to empower the assessment and rating for town and lighting rates of lands, buildings, tenements, and places beneficially occupied, and to declare and enforce such rates, and notify and recover arrears; to enrol as citizens or burgesses freeholders of property on which rates are paid, and to enable the revision court to strike off freeholders' names in case of non-payment of rates; to collect fees for licenses and registrations of bowling-saloons, concert-rooms, places for pastime, and from porters, drivers, and others, and to pay one-half of the net amount of license fees collected from drivers resident in other municipal limits to the council of the district; to establish additional cattle markets, and collect tolls therein; to lease corporate lands and buildings, and the tolls and dues arising therefrom; to erect public baths and washhouses, and make bye-laws for the management thereof, and for charging for admission thereto; to extend to Geelong the Melbourne Hackney Carriage Act, and empower the town council to issue and charge fees for licenses to hackney carriages, and the owners, drivers, and conductors thereof; also the Act 16 Victoria No. 38, and thereby to enable the town council to cause lands to be filled up to the level of adjacent streets, and private streets to be drained; also the Acts 14 Victoria No. 17 and 18 Victoria No. 18, and thereby to enable the town council to erect public abattoirs, and charge dues for the use thereof; to enable the corporate councils of Melbourne and Geelong to authorize the construction and use of street railways, and to regulate the fares to be charged for travelling thereupon; to enable the said councils to collect from adjoining owners a moiety of the cost which shall be incurred in flagging footways; to define more clearly the meaning of words and terms used in the Acts 14 Victoria No. 20 and 14 Victoria No. 35, with regard to formation and repair of streets, courts, and alleys, on private property; to protect streets and ways already formed or used from encroachment; to confer, vary, or extinguish other rights or privileges as in the said bill mentioned.

## CHEWTON MUNICIPALITY.

**THIRD** Half-yearly Report of the Chewton Municipal Council, being from 16th January to 15th July, 1862, both inclusive.

## ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN.

On the 16th of January, Thomas Johnston, Esq., was unanimously re-elected as chairman.

## ATTENDANCE OF MEMBERS.

The delay in the receipt of money from Government has greatly retarded the progress of the public works contemplated, and little beyond lighting the township, and carrying out necessary repairs to the roads and footpaths, has been effected.
