NOTICE TO APPLICANTS FOR EMPLOYMENT IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE.

IT is hereby notified, for the information of persons intending to apply for Government employment, that under the *Civil Service Act*, which became law on the 18th of June, 1862, persons entering the service can be appointed only to the lowest class, at a salary of £80; or in any departments or branches of the service in which the Governor in Council shall have decided that special but not professional qualifications are required, to the fourth class, and at the minimum salary of the class. Every candidate must, prior to his appointment, produce such evidence as the Governor in Council may think sufficient as to his age, health, and moral character; must pass an examination before a Board of Examiners appointed by the Governor in Council; and must undergo probation for three months on half salary before being enrolled in the Civil Service.

The only exceptions to these rules are—

1. Where vacancies take place in the higher classes of the **PROFESSIONAL SERVICE**, and the Governor in Council is of opinion that there is no officer in a lower class competent to discharge the duties of the vacant office.

2. Where it is expedient to secure for the public, on the occurrence of any vacancy, the services of any person of known and proved ability, and to place such person in some of the higher classes of the Civil Service.

3. Where persons are re-appointed who have previously been employed in the Civil Service, and have not been dismissed, or called upon to resign for improper conduct.

ADDITIONAL AREAS ANNEXED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SANDHURST.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, if he should think fit, on the receipt of a petition signed by the householders purporting to be the majority resident within an area adjoining to any proclaimed municipal district containing an average of thirty-six resident householders for each square mile thereof, praying that such locality by a general description might be united with and form part of such previously proclaimed municipal district, to declare by Proclamation, with the consent of the council of such proclaimed district, such locality to be united with and form part of such previously proclaimed municipal district, and also by the same or any other Proclamation to define the limits and boundaries of such locality, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be and be deemed to be united with and should form part of such previously proclaimed municipal district; provided that no such Proclamation be issued as above until the substance and prayer of such petition should have been published for at least one month previously in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the householders purporting to be the majority resident within the respective areas hereinafter described, adjoining to the municipal district of Sandhurst, and containing an average of thirty-six resident householders for each square mile thereof, have presented petitions to the Governor praying for the annexation of their respective localities to the said municipal district: And whereas the substance and prayer of the said petitions have been duly published, and the council of the said municipal district has consented to such annexation: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and also with the consent of the municipal council of Sandhurst, do by this my Proclamation declare that the two several areas hereinafter described shall be united with and form parts of the municipal district of Sandhurst, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the municipal district of Sandhurst, bearing N. 17° 5' E. sixty-six chains fifty links from the south-western angle thereof; thence by a line bearing about N. 24° 40' W. sixty chains, more or less; thence about N. 16° 45' E. one hundred and forty-six chains, more or less; thence about N. 49° E. two hundred and thirty-five chains, more or less; thence about S. 66° 30' E. thirteen chains, more or less, to the north-western angle of the municipal district of Sandhurst; and thence by the western boundary of said municipal district southerly to the point of commencement. —(V.4203.)

Again, commencing at a point being the south-eastern angle of the municipal district of Sandhurst; thence by a line bearing N. 10° E. sixty chains; thence N. 36° E. forty-seven chains; thence about S. 55° E. fifty-two chains fifty links, more or less; thence about N. 89° E. thirty-two chains, more or less; thence about N. 29° 20' E. sixty-eight chains sixty links, more or less; thence about S. 23° 20' W. seventy-three chains, more or less;

thence about S. 45° 50' W. one hundred and fourteen chains forty links, more or less; thence about S. 87° 40' W. one chain sixty links, more or less; thence about N. 64° 10' E. forty-one chains forty links, more or less, to the point of commencement. —(V.4047.)

The attendance of members at 23 general meetings shows as follows:—The Chairman, 22; Councillor Ustick, 20; Councillor Eastman, 14; Councillor Norman, 20; Councillor Hodgens, 23; Councillor Deery, 22; Councillor Meredith attended four meetings—was absent from four meetings (absence occasioned by illness), and consequently lost his seat—was re-elected on the 17th of April, and attended the ten meetings since held.

ASSESSMENT.

The assessment made by Mr. Robt. Holmes amounted, after appeal, to £12,207 19s., on which a shilling rate was imposed.

REDUCTION OF SALARIES.

On 16th February, it was carried in council that the salaries of the town clerk and surveyor be reduced 25 per cent.

TOWN SURVEYOR.

On 6th February, Mr. Holmes tendered his resignation of this office, which was accepted, and on the 10th of April, Mr. T. L. Brown was elected to succeed him.

DEPUTATIONS.

In March, the chairman, accompanied by Councillors Norman and Deery, waited on several members of Government in reference to matters of importance to the district, and were not unsuccessful in obtaining their requests.

In May, the town surveyor, accompanied by the originator of the scheme, attended in Melbourne to give evidence before a select committee of the House, to show the feasibility of providing the district with an unlimited supply of water from the Coliban River.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The delay in the receipt of money from Government has greatly retarded the progress of the public works contemplated, and little beyond lighting the township, and carrying out necessary repairs to the roads and footpaths, has been effected.

APPLICATIONS MADE TO GOVERNMENT.
