GRANT FOR PUBLIC LIBRARIES.

THE Committees for the management of Mechanics' Institutes or other Public Libraries in country districts, claiming to participate in the grant for the purchase of books, are hereby informed that the distribution of the Vote for 1863 will not take place until after the 31st of December next.

3. That no grant be made to any institution in Melbourne, or more than one-sixth of the entire sum be divided amongst institutions within ten miles of it.

HIGHWAY ROBBERY UNDER ARMS.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

SANDHURST MINING DISTRICT.

ADDITIONAL CLAUSE TO GENERAL BYE-LAW, No. 5.—[2nd October, 1863.]

AT a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Sandhurst, begun and holden at Sandhurst, in the said district, on the second day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, it is ordained by the said board, as follows, that is to say:—

Registration of residence.—That any holder of a miner's right, who may have resided on the portion of land allowed him for residential purposes, for a period of not less than six months, shall be entitled to leave the said residence unoccupied for a period not exceeding six months, on his lodging due application with the registrar of the division in which his residence is situated, asking for the protection thereof.

And every driver of a cart, dray, waggon, wain, or other such vehicle, laden with at least thirty posts or rails, shall, on payment of the full rate of toll, be entitled to receive a ticket, stating the date and amount of toll paid, which amount (less one penny) shall be refunded to the driver of such vehicle when returning on the same day, providing the vehicle be empty.
