GRANT FOR PUBLIC LIBRARIES.

HIGHWAY ROBBERY UNDER ARMS.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS on the evening of Friday, the 2nd day of October instant, the telegraph toll-house on the Raglan road, situated two miles from Ballaarat, was entered by two armed men, with masked faces, who violently assaulted Thomas Harman, the toll collector, and stole the undermentioned property: And whereas the Ballaarat District Road Board have offered a reward of Fifty pounds for the conviction of the offenders: Notice is hereby given that a reward of Fifty pounds (supplementary to the above-mentioned reward) will be paid by the Government for such information as shall lead to the apprehension and conviction of the said offenders.

Property stolen—Money. 46s. in silver and a chamois leather bag containing silver; a silver watch, and an American coach driving-whip, besides other property since recovered.
