SITES FOR COMMON SCHOOLS.

IT is hereby notified, in pursuance of the 8th section of *The Land Act, 1862*, that it is the intention of the Governor in Council to permanently reserve from sale the lands hereinafter described, for the purposes of Common Schools, at the under-mentioned places, and that deeds of grant thereof will be issued to the Board of Education appointed under the Act No. 149, viz.:—

ALBERTON—Two acres, county unnamed, parish of Alberton, allotments 14, 15, 16, and 17 of section 6: Bounded on the north by Thomson street, bearing N. 68° E. four chains; on the east by allotment 13, bearing S. 22° E. five chains; on the south by allotments 5, 4, 3, and 2, bearing S. 68° W. four chains; and on the west by allotments 19 and 18, bearing N. 82° W. five chains.

AMHERST (BACK CREEK)—Two acres, county of Talbot, parish of Amherst, allotments 9 and 10 of section 7, township of Talbot: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 7, section 7; bounded on the north by allotments 7 and 8, bearing east five chains; on the east by Hume street, bearing south four chains; on the south by allotments 11, 12, 13, and 14, bearing west five chains; and on the west by Stanley street, bearing north four chains to the point of commencement.

DENNINGTON—Three roods eleven perches, county of Villiers, parish of Wangoom, being allotments 7, 11, and 12, section 6: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 8; bounded on the east by Tylden street, bearing north two chains; on the north by allotments 6 and 13, bearing west four chains thirty links; on the west by the esplanade, bearing S. 10° 30' E. two chains two links; and on the south by allotments 10 and 8, bearing east three chains ninety-five links to the point of commencement.

ECHUCA—Two roods, county unnamed, parish of Echuca, part of allotment 1, section 12, township of Echuca: Commencing at the south-west angle, being the intersection of Hare and Anstruther streets; bounded on the west by Hare street, bearing N. 12° W. two chains; on the north by the remainder of allotment 1, bearing N. 78° E. two chains fifty links; on the east by the remainder of allotment 1, bearing S. 12° E. two chains; and on the south by Anstruther street, bearing S. 78° W. two chains fifty links to the point of commencement.

ELTHAM—Two acres, county of Evelyn, parish of Nullumbik, allotment 2, section 11: Commencing at the south-west angle; bounded on the south by allotment 3, bearing N. 79° 16' E. three chains fifty links; on the east by allotment 1, bearing north three chains ninety-seven links; on the north by Dalton street, bearing west six chains fifty links; on the west by a curved line whose radius is seven chains fifty links, chord bearing south-easterly, following said curved line southerly to the point of commencement.

THE UNITED BOROUGH AND GOLD FIELD COMMON OF CHILTERN, comprising Chiltern Borough Common and Chiltern Gold Field Common, both of which commons were described in a Proclamation bearing even date herewith. And the said United Common shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the above-mentioned commons.—(63.H.6552.)

RULES AND REGULATIONS, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE ACT 17 VICTORIA 12, FOR THE PLEASANT CREEK GENERAL CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken, or a vault re-opened.

2. On application for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule.

3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.

4. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the fees mentioned in the schedule.

5. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones must be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owners.

6. All persons destroying the fences, or in any manner injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

7. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

8. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined on payment of the charges set forth in schedule.

9. When a meeting of the trustees is required, the same to be called by the secretary. Three to form a quorum.

10. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.
