## MAIN ROADS UNDER THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1863.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the tenth day of November, 1863.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application of any district, from time to time to appoint what road or parts of roads shall be main roads, and every such appointment on the like application from time to time to revoke; and every such Order in Council shall be published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the Boards of certain Road Districts have severally applied for the appointment of the Main Roads hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the Roads hereinafter mentioned to be Main Roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say:—

The Main Road extending from the boundary of the borough of Ballarat, *via* the township of Beaufort, to the boundary of the borough of Ararat.

The Main Road extending from the boundary of the borough of Newtown and Chivwell to the township of Inverleigh, and known as the Lower Western Road.

The Main Road extending from the boundary of the borough of Belfast, through the township of Macarthur, to the boundary of the borough of Hamilton.

The Main Road extending from the boundary of the borough of Portland through Heywood and Dartmoor towards Mount Gambier, as far as the boundary of this colony.

The Main Road extending from the boundary of the borough of Portland through Heywood towards Casterton as far as the boundary of the Portland Road District.

The Main Road extending from the northern boundary of the borough of Warrnambool by the township of Dennington to the eastern boundary of the borough of Belfast.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE BOROUGH OF SALE.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, shall extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) shall extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the borough of Sale shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

## HORSHAM TOWN COMMON.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby abolish the existing Town Common for Horsham, and do hereby proclaim another common in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

The Town Common described amongst others in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861, under the designation of Horsham, is hereby abolished; and the lands hereafter described shall be and constitute a Common for all householders of the town of Horsham, viz.:—One thousand four hundred acres, more or less, being the portions of land hereinafter described: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 2, section 3, parish of Horsham; thence north seventy chains; thence east to the Wimmera River, by that river south-westerly to a point due east of the commencing point; thence west to the point of commencement. Also, the unappropriated Crown land within the town boundary of Horsham, and allotments 3, 7, and 8, section 9, allotments 5, 6, and 7, section 8, allotments 1, 2, 3, 4, and 7 of section 6, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(63.G.8782.)

PETITION FOR A ROAD DISTRICT.  
BYLANDS AND GLENBURNIE.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the 6th clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*, notice is hereby given that a petition signed by thirty-four inhabitants of the parishes of Bylands and Glenburnie, in the counties of Bourke and Dalhousie, has been presented to the Governor, setting forth as follows:—

That they are inhabitants of a part of Victoria not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district.

That each one of the petitioners possesses property rateable under *The Local Government Act, 1863*, within the area hereafter mentioned, viz., "the parishes of Bylands and Glenburnie, the metes and bounds of which are as follow: Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Bylands; thence easterly and northerly by the south and eastern boundaries of the said parish to the northern boundary of the county of Bourke; thence east by the county boundary to a point due south of the south-east angle of Linton's pre-emptive right; thence north to the said south-east angle of the said pre-emptive right; thence north-westerly by the centre of the Sunday Creek to a point opposite the south bounds of sections 101 and 100, parish of Broadford; thence by a line from the said point to the eastern extremity of the said south bounds of sections 101 and 100 and to the western end of the said bounds at the south-west angle of section 100; thence by the centre of a reserved road which is north-east of sections 76, 77, 78, to a point in the eastern boundary of Pylong road district opposite the said centre of the said reserved road; thence by the said eastern boundary of Pylong road district to its junction with the north bounds of Willowmavin road district; thence to the north-east angle of the said district; thence to the south-east angle of Kilmore special survey; thence to the northern point of the eastern side of Greaves street, Kilmore; thence to the eastern point of the south side of Foot street; thence to the south point of the western side of Sutherland street; thence to the intersection of Sutherland street (west side) with Foot street; thence to the north-east angle of Springfield road district, parish of Forbes; thence by the eastern boundary of Springfield road district south to the commencing point."

That the area above described contains not less than forty square miles, and rateable property whereof the net annual value is not less than Five thousand pounds.

They further state that they are fully convinced of the necessity of making and improving the roads of the district owing to the increasing traffic and the increase of agriculture therein.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray your Excellency that the area hereinbefore described may be constituted a Road District by the name and style of 'The Bylands Road District.'"

The Governor in Council will take the above-mentioned petition into consideration upon the expiration of one month from the publication of this notification, in accordance with the said Act.

## MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORIZED WITHIN EXEMPTED LAND AT NEWSTEAD.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has, by Order made on the 10th day of November, 1863, under the authority conferred by the Gold Fields Act, 21 Victoria No. 32, authorized the holders of miners' rights to prosecute mining operations upon the unappropriated Crown lands within the town reserve of Newstead, on the conditions following, viz.:—

1. That the mining operations be conducted in such manner as shall be ordered by the mining surveyor or other duly authorized officer acting under the authority of the Honorable the Minister of Mines.

2. That if any damage be done to any street or any stream of water, or any appropriated or alienated lands within the town of Newstead, or if the mining operations shall be objected to on the ground that they would be injurious to the town, the Minister of Mines may, if he think fit, order that such mining operations shall be discontinued; and after such order shall have been given in writing, it shall not be lawful for any person to mine any longer on the lands referred to in such order.

#### MISCELLANEOUS.

#### BUTTLEJORK, HOLDEN, AND THE GAP UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMONS.

RULES and Regulations for the management of the United Town and Farmers' Commons of Buttletjork, Holden, and the Gap.

1. No farmer shall be entitled to the use of the commons unless he holds or occupies not less than ten acres of land within five miles of the boundary of said commons.

2. That each farmer entitled to the commonage shall be permitted to graze one head of cattle for every two acres he may have under cultivation during the current year.

3. Cultivation shall mean and be understood as ploughed land for crop, ploughed land for fallow, or self-sown crop intended to be harvested.

4. That all cattle sent to said commons shall have the owner or owners' brand (in legible and distinct characters or letters) on them, in order that the herdsman may be able to discover any strange cattle that may be at any time upon said commons. Parties removing their cattle will intimate the same to the herdsman by notice in writing.

5. All farmers applying for a license to depasture their cattle will be required to fill up a form, to be obtained from either of the managers or herdsman, setting forth the number of acres he has under cultivation, according to the intent and meaning of these Regulations, and also make a declaration before a justice of the peace as to the correctness of the same.

6. Any person found depasturing more cattle than what he has taken out a license for, the managers will have the power to cancel his license and prevent him the use of the common during that year.

7. The fees for all cattle, horses excepted, will be at the rate of Five shillings per head per annum, and for horses Eight shillings per head, payable in each case in advance. All cattle under six months old, free.

8. That the year shall commence on the 1st day of November, 1863, and end on the 31st day of October, 1864, and no less fees will be charged during the currency of said year.

9. That in no case will sheep be permitted to graze on said common without the written consent of all the managers.

10. In no case will either a bull or entire horse be permitted on the commons without the written consent of all the managers.

11. A record of all cattle, describing their brands, shall be kept by the herdsman for the inspection of any commoner, to enable him or them to discover strange cattle on the commons, who are requested, if possible, to communicate the same to the herdsman.

12. The herdsman will have the authority of the managers to impound any sheep or cattle found trespassing on said commons, an entry of which he will make in a book kept for that purpose, so that damages and fees arising from the same may be properly accounted for.

13. That all cattle suspected to be diseased belonging to commoners, the owners thereof shall (by order of the managers), after twelve hours' notice in writing, remove the same off said common; and in event of refusal, the owner shall be considered a trespasser, and be liable to the penalty inflicted or recoverable under and by virtue of the 129th clause of the Land Act, now in force in the colony of Victoria. And that the same cattle shall not be returned to the said common without the consent in writing of the managers first had and obtained.

14. It will be the herdsman's duty to see all the cattle under his charge once every 24 hours. Should any be missing during that time, he is to inform or notice the owners the day following, and make a memorandum in his book to that effect.

15. Should the fees collected be insufficient to pay the herdsman's wages and other contingencies connected with the management, an additional charge will be made on each commoner, in fair proportion to the number of cattle by him depastured, and each license granted will be under the condition that he can be sued for the same, and the amount to be recoverable before any justice of the peace.

16. That the herdsman will receive as fees the sum of Sixpence per head, from the managers, for every head impounded by him, trespassing on the said common.

17. Should the managers at any time consider the herdsman incompetent or neglectful of his duties, they can remove or discharge him without notice, and he can have no claim upon them for compensation whatever.

18. The managers do not hold themselves responsible for any neglect or irregularity of the herdsman; and can alter or amend these rules when they consider it necessary.
