DISALLOWANCE OF ACT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in accordance with the provisions of an Act of the fifth and sixth years of the Reign of Her Majesty, chapter seventy-six, intituled, *An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Dieman's Land*, on the eighth day of June, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the Act hereinafter mentioned was assented to by the Governor of Victoria in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty: And whereas Her Majesty has been pleased, by an Order in Council (subjoined hereto), bearing date the nineteenth day of July, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, to disallow such Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do by this Proclamation signify Her Majesty's disallowance of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered ninety-five, and intituled, *An Act to provide for the better regulation and discipline of Armed Vessels in the Service of Her Majesty's Local Government in Victoria*.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

At the Court at Osborne House, Isle of Wight, the 19th day of July, 1863.

PRESENT:

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the 6th year of Her Majesty's Reign, entitled, *An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*, it is amongst other things enacted, that whenever any Bill which shall have been presented for Her Majesty's assent to the Governor of New South Wales shall, by such Governor, have been assented to in Her Majesty's name, it shall be lawful, at any time within two years after an authentic copy of such Bill shall have been received by the Secretary of State from such Governor, for Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to declare Her disallowance of such Bill: And whereas, by another Act passed in the 14th year of Her Majesty's Reign, entitled, *An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies*, it was provided amongst other things that the provisions of said first-mentioned Act concerning the disallowance of Bills should apply to and be in force in the Colony of Victoria; and whereas the said provisions are maintained in force, as regards Bills passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said colony, by a subsequent Act, passed in the 19th year of the Reign of Her said Majesty, entitled, *An Act to enable Her Majesty to assent to a Bill as amended of the Legislature of Victoria to establish a Constitution in and for the Colony of Victoria*: And whereas on the 8th of June, 1860, the Governor of the said Colony of Victoria assented to a certain Bill passed by the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the said Colony, entitled, *An Act to provide for the better regulation and discipline of Armed Vessels in the Service of Her Majesty's Local Government in Victoria*: And whereas the said Bill so assented to has been laid before Her Majesty in Council, and it is expedient that the said Bill should be disallowed by Her Majesty: Now therefore Her Majesty, in pursuance of the afore-mentioned Acts of Parliament, and in exercise of the powers reserved to Her Majesty therein, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, declare Her disallowance of the said Act.

And the Most Noble the Duke of Newcastle, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

ADDITIONAL CLAUSE TO GENERAL BYE-LAW, No. 5, RELATING TO "SHEPHERDING CLAIMS."—[12th November, 1863.]

A meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Sandhurst, begun and holden at Sandhurst, in the said district, on the twelfth day of November, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that it is to say:—

SHEPHERDING CLAIMS.

In order to prevent shepherding, all holders of alluvial claims must be present on his or their claim every lawful day (after that on which the claim was taken possession of), between the hours of Twelve and One o'clock p.m. Any miner or miners not complying with the requirements of this clause shall be deemed to have forfeited his or their claim or share, unless in case of dispute such absence can be justified by reason of the miner or miners being engaged in procuring timber, washing earth, or doing other necessary work in connection with the disputed claim; and further, the warden may, at discretion, declare any alluvial claim forfeited, on the ground that the same has not been fairly and energetically worked during the time that it has been held by any miner or miners. This clause shall not apply to puddling claims.

The undersigned members of the said mining board concurred in making the foregoing addition to the general bye-law, No. 5.
