## LIGHTS, BEACONS, AND BUOYS IN VICTORIA.

The present notice will affect to a certain extent the notices to mariners which were inserted in the *Government Gazette* of the 15th January, 1861, and of the 3rd February, 1863, pages 76 and 237.

## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

**T**HE various changes and alterations herein mentioned will come into operation on or about the first day of January, 1864:—

### CAPE SCHANCK LIGHTHOUSE.

Notice is hereby given that with the view of enabling navigators to see the Cape Schanck Lighthouse better during thick or hazy weather, the tower will, on or about the above date, be painted *white* instead of *red*.

### POINT LONSDALE LIGHTHOUSE AND RED BEACON.

Notice is also given that the light and look-out house on Point Lonsdale will, on or about the above date, be painted *red and black* in alternate horizontal bands, each ten (10) feet deep, commencing at the top with red.

The above-mentioned lighthouse having been built close to and on the same line of bearing as the Point Lonsdale red ball beacon, hitherto used as a thwart mark for clearing the Lonsdale and Lightning Rocks, the beacon will, on and after the aforementioned date, be removed, and the lighthouse used for the mark instead.

### POPE'S EYE SHOAL BUOY.

On or about the aforementioned date, the Pope's Eye Buoy will be removed altogether, and the North Buoy shifted from its present position, about two cables' length in a S.W. by S. direction.

### SOUTH CHANNEL BUOYS.

The western Black Perch Buoy, No. 1 in the South Channel, will be shifted in a westerly direction from its present position

to the tail of the south-west spit at the southern entrance to Symond's Channel, and replaced by a third-class buoy.

**PRINCE GEORGE BANK BUOY.**

The Red Cone Buoy on Prince George's Bank, moored about N. by W. from the West Channel Lightship, will be painted black instead of red, its present color.

**POINT COOK BUOY.**

A Black Cone-shaped Buoy has been placed off Point Cook, in five fathoms, with the following bearings:—

Station Peak S. 78° W.  
West shoulder of Mount Macedon N. 28° W.  
Old Lighthouse, Gellibrand's Point N. 43° E.

**DROMANA MOORING BUOY.**

A Mooring Buoy, painted red, has been laid down in three (3) fathoms one cable's length from the outer end of Dromana Jetty.

**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim, increase, alter, and abolish the commons as hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

**BALLYSHANASSY TOWN COMMON**, described amongst others in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861, is hereby abolished.—(60.A.7165.)

**BULLAROOK AND SPRING HILL FARMERS' COMMON**—Containing an approximate area of Four thousand seven hundred and thirty-five acres, is hereby increased by adding thereto the following described area:—Four hundred and fifty acres, more or less, county of Talbot: Commencing at the south-west angle of Daylesford Gold Field Common; thence west to the north-east angle of portion 95, parish of Bullarook; thence north-westerly by a road forming the eastern boundaries of portions 94, 93, 92 A, 92, 89, 88, 85, 84, and part of 44, to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of Daylesford Gold Field Common; thence east to said north-west angle of Daylesford Gold Field Common; thence south-easterly by the western boundary of said gold field common, bearing S. about 18° E. two hundred and ten chains, more or less, to the point of commencement; being the unappropriated Crown lands within the above-described area, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—Total approximate area 5188 acres, more or less.—(63 H.10436.)

**DONCASTER, CARLTON, NUNAWADING, AND BULLEN UNITED FARMERS' COMMON**, described in a Proclamation bearing date the first day of December, 1863, is hereby increased by adding thereto the land comprised in the late Ballyshanassy Town Common (now abolished), extent three hundred and twenty acres, more or less, being section No. 110, in the parish of Nunawading, county of Bourke.—(63 G.10733.)

**ELLESMERE AND NOLAN FARMERS' COMMON**—The Farmers' Common described, amongst others, as situated at Ellesmere and Nolan, in a Proclamation bearing date the fourth day of March, 1861, is hereby abolished, and the land hereafter described shall be and constitute Ellesmere and Nolan Farmers' Common, viz.:—Three thousand three hundred and eight acres, more or less, county unnamed, parish of Ellesmere: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 23, parish of Ellesmere; thence west one hundred and ninety-two chains nineteen links; thence south one hundred and seventy-two chains thirteen links; thence east one hundred and ninety-two chains nineteen links; and thence north by part of the west boundary of a reserve for township and the west boundary of allotments 27, 26, 25, 24, and 23, one hundred and seventy-two chains thirteen links to the point of commencement, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne; deducting from above-described area all sold or otherwise legally appropriated land.—(63 H.10665.)

**MCCALLUM'S CREEK GOLD FIELD COMMON**, described amongst others in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861, containing an area of two thousand six hundred acres, more or less, is hereby increased by adding thereto six hundred and fifty acres, more or less, described as follows: Commencing at the south-west angle of the Carrisbrook Farmers' Common; thence by part of the southern boundary of that common, bearing north-easterly about thirty chains to the reserve for agricultural areas; thence south by said reserve two hundred and fifty chains, more or

less, to a point bearing west about twenty-four chains from the south-west angle of allotment 27, section 6, parish of Craigie; thence west to the east boundary of the Craigie and Edlinton Farmers' Common; thence by part of the east boundary of last-named common, and part of the existing east boundary of McCallum's Creek Gold Field Common north two hundred and forty chains, more or less, to the point of commencement; deducting all sold or legally appropriated land, as shown on plan deposited in Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Total approximate area 3250 acres.—(63 G.10374.)

## REGISTRAR GENERAL'S REPORT ON THE VITAL STATISTICS OF MELBOURNE AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1863.

ACTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper, East Melbourne, North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Richmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood, and Richmond), South Yarra and Prahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Dousta Galla and Keilor, Boroondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the Temperature in the shade at Melbourne, deduced from the mean of twenty-four hourly observations taken at the Melbourne Observatory on each day during the month of October, 1863:—

The deaths during the month slightly exceeded those in October, 1862, but were considerably fewer than those in the same month of either 1861 or 1860. They also numbered 13 less than those occurring in the month of September.

The proportions of males and females who died during the month were 58 and 42 per cent. respectively. Those of persons under and over five years of age were respectively 63 and 37 per cent. The mortality of young children still remained unprecedently low.

The greatest mortality occurring in any one day was 13 deaths on the 14th. Only 2 deaths were recorded on the 10th and 26th. The death of a male at 77 years, that of another at 78 years, and that of a female at 75 years, occurred during the month. These aged persons all succumbed to old age.

The deaths from external causes numbered 11, and were thus reported:—A carpenter 60 years of age was accidentally drowned, and a butcher 53 years of age was found drowned in the Yarra, a child of 4 years and another of 17 months were also drowned, a butcher aged 21 was killed by a cart wheel passing over him, an ironmonger aged 51 died of a fractured spine, and a female child 4 years of age of a fractured skull, a girl of 4 died of a scald, an infant of a day old was suffocated by its mother in bed in the Lying-in Hospital, a teacher aged 35 cut his throat in the Fitz Roy gardens, and a female aged 35 committed suicide in a similar manner.

No less than 62 deaths, or 31 per cent. of the whole number which took place, occurred in public institutions, as follows:—Melbourne Hospital, 44; Benevolent Asylum, 3; Immigrants' Home, 4; Immigration Hospital, 1; Lying-in Hospital, 3; Collingwood Stockade, 1; St. Vincent de Paul's Orphanage, 1; Yarra Bend Asylum, 5.

Of the 74 children who died under the age of five, 41, or 55 per cent., were males, and 33, or 45 per cent., were females; 42 were under one year old, 14 were between one and two years, 7 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

Of the 127 deaths of persons beyond five years of age, 76, or nearly 60 per cent., were of males, and 51, or about 40 per cent., were of females; of those dying, 6 were between five and ten years of age, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 5 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 19 were between twenty-five and thirty, 16 were between thirty and thirty-five, 10 were between thirty-five and forty, 16 were between forty and forty-five, 10 were between forty-five and fifty, 11 were between fifty and fifty-five, 5 were between fifty-five and sixty, 4 were between sixty and sixty-five, 2 were between sixty-five and seventy, and 3 were upwards of seventy-five years of age.
