Each applicant should furnish, in addition to the above, any documentary evidence which he may consider important.

Unless the above information is placed in the hands of the board on or before the 22nd January, 1864, the claim will not be considered.

Claims for rewards for discoveries made in 1862 cannot be entertained, a previous board having been appointed for their consideration; neither will discoveries be considered for which any reward has been paid by the colony.

THE SHIRE OF RIPON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas the area of the district hereinafter named, and the amount of the last general rate therein, exceed the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Carngham and Beaufort Road District to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

THE HAMPDEN AND HEYTESBURY ROAD DISTRICT ADDED TO.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-ninth day of June, 1863, the boundaries of the Hampden and Heytesbury road district were altered and defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to add a portion of the parish of Terang to the said district: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the addition of the said portion of the parish of Terang to the Hampden and Heytesbury road district aforesaid, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do hereby re-define the whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point in the centre of the Emu Creek due north of the eastern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence by the centre line of said creek, bearing westerly and southerly to the north-east angle of the parish of Glenormiston; thence west by the north boundary of said parish to its north-west angle; thence south by the west boundary of said parish to the south-west angle of the said parish; thence south to and by the west boundary of the parish of Terang to a point in the centre of Mount Emu Creek; thence easterly by the centre of said creek to the south-east angle of the parish of Terang; thence by a line due south to the centre of Curdie's Creek; thence by the centre line of said creek to the sea-coast; thence by the coast line south-easterly to a point in the centre of the Gellibrand River; thence by the centre line of said river, and by the east boundary of the county of Heytesbury, to the south-west angle of section xv, in the parish of Pirron Yaloak, county of Polwarth; thence northerly by the east coast of the Tiran-gower Morass, and by the centre line of the Pirron Yaloak Creek to the Lake Corangamite; thence by the western and northern shores of the Lake Corangamite to the inlet of the Salt Lagoon which forms part of the source of the Woody Yaloak Creek; thence easterly by the said inlet and the western and eastern shores of the said lagoon to the source of the Woody Yaloak Creek; thence north-westerly by the said creek to a point opposite to the south boundary of the parish of South

Naringhil; thence west to and by the said south boundary to the eastern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence by the said boundary to the commencing point.—(63,2501.)

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application of any district, from time to time to appoint what road or parts of roads shall be main roads, and every such appointment on the like application from time to time to revoke; and every such Order in Council shall be published in the *Government Gazette*; And whereas the Boards of certain Road Districts have severally applied for the appointment of the Main Roads hereinafter mentioned; Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint the Roads hereinafter mentioned to be Main Roads within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say:—

The Main Road extending from the northern boundary of the borough of Heathcote *vid* Axedale to the eastern boundary of the borough of Sandhurst.

The Main Road extending from the southern boundary of the Dandenong township reserve to the south-eastern boundary of the Cranbourne township reserve.

The Main Road extending from the northern boundary of the borough of Ballarat to the southern boundary of the borough of Creswick; from the northern boundary of the borough of Creswick to the southern boundary of the borough of Clunes; from the northern boundary of the borough of Clunes to the southern boundary of the borough of Amherst.

And the Honorable James Macpherson Grant, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
