PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.
QUEENSLIFF.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and eighty-five householders resident at and near Queenscliff, in the county of Grant, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders resident within the area hereinafter described, and delineated on a plan which accompanied the petition, and that they desire that such area should be declared a municipal district, viz.:—"Commencing on the shore of Bass's Straits at a point where intersected by the west boundary line of the Battery Reserve, in the parish of Paywit, in the county of Grant; thence along the shore of Bass's Straits to Point Lonsdale; thence along the shore of Lonsdale Bay to Shortland's Bluff; thence along the shore of Port Phillip Bay to Swan Point; thence round Swan Island and along the southern shore of Swan Bay, including Rabbit Island, to the north-east angle of allotment 1, block 3, in the said parish; thence by a line bearing south-westerly to the commencing point, the last-mentioned line being the southern boundary of the Indented Heads road district."

And the petitioners pray as follows:—
"Your petitioners therefore pray that your Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council, will declare by proclamation the locality before mentioned a municipal district, by the name of 'The Municipal District of Queenscliff.'"

THE accompanying Proclamation by His Excellency the Governor of South Australia, and Notices referring thereto, are published for general information.

South Australia, to wit.

Proclamation by SIR DOMINICK DALY, Knight, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's province of South Australia and the dependencies thereof, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an ordinance of the Governor of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, being No. 24 of 1854, intitled, *An Act to amend the Laws of the Customs in South Australia*, it was, *inter alia*, enacted by section 61 "that it should be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, from time to time, by any order

under his hand, to appoint, at any port within the said colony, the proper places to be legal wharfs for the lading and unloading of goods, and to define the bounds and extents of any such wharfs upon which particular goods may be laden or unladen." And whereas it is deemed desirable to appoint the places hereinafter mentioned to be wharfs within the meaning of the said recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Dominick Daly, Governor-in-Chief of the province aforesaid, in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in me by the aforesaid ordinance, and of all other powers me thereunto enabling, do, by this my order, appoint Mannum, on the River Murray, to be a port under the provisions of the second section of the above-recited ordinance, the boundaries of the said port to be as follows, viz.:—"The north-eastern boundary to be the north-east side of section 114, extended fifty yards in the river; the south-eastern boundary to be an imaginary line drawn in the said River Murray fifty yards from the right bank, running parallel to the south-eastern boundaries of sections 114, 518, 519, and an unnumbered section adjoining on the south-west side of section 519; the south-western boundary to be the south-west side of the unnumbered section extended to fifty yards in the river; the north-western boundary to be the line bounding the sections herein referred to on the north-west. And I further, by this my order, appoint the following at the said port of Mannum to be legal wharfs for the lading and unloading of all goods into and from the said port, and I do also order and define the following to be the bounds and extent of such wharfs:—First, The whole of the river frontage of the unnumbered section herein referred to; second, The jetty on section 114, and river frontage one hundred yards south-west of the said jetty.

Given under my Hand and the Public Seal of the said Province, this ninth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

NOTICE TO MERCHANTS, AGENTS, AND MASTERS OF VESSELS
TRADING ON THE RIVER MURRAY.

REFERRING to *Gazette* notice of 1863, proclaiming Mannum to be a port on the River Murray, I hereby give notice that merchants, agents, and others will be required to give, at the Custom House at this port, forty-eight hours' clear notice prior to their landing or shipping goods from the wharfs established at Port Mannum, when an officer will be dispatched, free of expense, to the applicant; and I hereby give further notice that goods landed or shipped, except under the provisions of the laws relating to the customs, and in presence of an officer of customs, will be forfeited, and the parties concerned in the illegal shipment or landing of the same will be liable to the penalties imposed by such customs laws.

RULES AND REGULATIONS TO CONDUCT THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE STANLEY DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

THE business of the board shall be conducted with open doors.

2. The regular meetings of the board shall be held on the first Monday in each month, at Twelve o'clock noon, or as soon as a quorum of five is present; but should there be no quorum after the lapse of half an hour the meeting shall lapse, a minute being taken of the members present.

3. Special meetings may be summoned by the clerk, upon his receiving a written requisition, signed by three members, stating the matter to be brought forward at such meeting. The clerk shall give notice thereof to each member, by post, not less than seven nor more than ten clear days before such meeting.

4. The order of business shall be as follows:—

1. Reading and confirming minutes.
2. Reading copies of letters sent.
3. Reading letters received and ordering thereon.
4. Reception of and reading petitions.
5. Reports of permanent committees.
6. Reports of special committees.
7. Orders of the day.
8. Motions of which previous notice shall have been given.
9. Giving notices of motion.

5. The minutes of a previous meeting, when confirmed, shall be signed by the chairman, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy.

6. All petitions addressed to the board must be presented by a member of the board, who shall be responsible for its being in proper form and respectfully worded.

7. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member may, however, bring forward any business he may think fit, a notice of motion having been given through the clerk seven clear days.

8. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member giving notice, or some member authorised by him, be present; notices not proceeded with shall be struck off the notice paper.

9. No bye-law shall be finally passed at the meeting at which it shall be first proposed, nor until the next monthly meeting of the board, and such bye-law shall in the meantime remain open for the inspection of the ratepayers, at the office of the board, free of charge.

10. Any member shall have power to move for a call of the whole board to rescind any motion previously passed during the official year, and on such motion being carried, the clerk shall give notice thereof, by post, to each member.

11. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the board.

12. In all matters of order or practice the chairman's ruling shall be final, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

13. Every motion or amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the name of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded.

14. One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

15. All questions of the board (excepting the election of officers) shall be decided by open voting.

16. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment, and any business undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

17. No motion, the effect of which would rescind a motion previously carried during the official year, shall be entertained, unless by a call of the board, and once negatived shall not again be introduced.

18. Any member using any offensive expression towards another member, shall, if required by the board, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology.

19. Any member may require the clerk to take down the particular words used by a member, immediately on the same being used.

20. Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution of the board on the adoption of the resolution to be protested against, and the protest shall be entered in the minute book, and be signed by the member or members protesting.

21. Notices of motion may, in cases of emergency, be dispensed with, provided that not more than three members be present.

22. No election for any officer, excepting the office of treasurer, at the disposal of the board, shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given in a local newspaper inviting qualified applications.

23. All contracts shall be made by tender, advertised twice in a local newspaper, unless the board shall otherwise direct. Tenders shall be endorsed and addressed to the chairman, and be only opened at the time of their consideration. The names of the tenderers with the amount of tender shall be entered on the minutes of the board. The security in all cases of contract shall be Ten per cent. on the amount specified in the tender (or two securities to the satisfaction of the board), and shall be paid over by the contractor to the treasurer, and the moneys so paid shall be lodged in the bank with the other moneys of the board, and shall not be repaid to the contractor until he has obtained his certificate from the engineer of the board that the works under his contract are satisfactorily performed.

24. No officer or member of the board shall have any pecuniary interest directly or indirectly in any contract of the board.

25. Payments will be made monthly, by cheque signed by the chairman and treasurer, and countersigned by the clerk.

26. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for any assessment, and in the event of its not being paid before the expiration of one month, legal proceedings may be taken for its recovery.

27. The collector shall, not less than once in eight days, pay into the hands of the treasurer of the board, all moneys received by him, and shall receive a receipt from the treasurer of the board for the amount paid in, and shall furnish the clerk with an account of such moneys.

28. That the treasurer and collector shall give such security as the board may from time to time require.

29. The treasurer and collector shall present their accounts at each monthly meeting of the board.

The changes in the council have been the resignation of Councillor Martin, 13th October, and the election of Councillor Roberts in his room.

Detailed statements of receipts and expenditure are appended, by which it will be seen the council have been actively engaged in public works.

Immediately the Land Act became law, a bye-law in accordance therewith, for the election of managers to the Common, was adopted; and upon the same being sanctioned by Government, the council elected Messrs. Powell, Southey, and Batten, as managers. Since then, Mr. Southey has resigned, and Mr. Herd has been elected a manager in his room.

Notwithstanding the existing arrangement by which this council collect tolls at the Barwon Bridge, the Government have sanctioned the bye-law of the Newtown and Chilwell Council, to collect tolls at their new bridge unconditionally. The chairman has protested to the Government, as by this act of theirs, the income of this council has been reduced without a proportionate relief from its liabilities.

Councillor Mackenzie has attended in Melbourne as delegate to the Municipal Conference on several occasions.

An application has been made to Government for a grant of land near the toll-house, for the purpose of erecting a market-house and holding a market thereon.

Bye-law No. 21, for the election of managers to the common, and No. 22, for making an assessment and striking a rate of Ninpence in the pound for the year 1862-3, has been assented to.

The Municipal and Charitable Institutions Commission have visited the district, and have been furnished with the information and returns that they requested.

The Health Reports have been duly prepared and forwarded.

Forming and draining the Town Hall Yard and approach.

Forming, curbing, and channelling 6½ chains of Eureka street, and filling in and forming a portion of the Market Reserve, west of Main street.

Curbing and channelling 14 chains of Eureka street, east of Main street.

Making and fixing 15 additional lamp posts in various parts of the municipality.

Lighting and maintaining the various lamps throughout the municipality, and constructing one lamp post at railway.

Repair and maintenance of the various streets, including the forming and metalling of 110 chains of streets.

Repairing footpaths in Victoria street.

Furnishing and spreading 1323 cubic yards of quartz.

Forming and metalling 16 chains of Stawell street and constructing a timber bridge over the River Yarroee.

Forming and metalling 7½ chains of Bradshaw street.

Pitching invert of bridge in Esmond street.

Repairs to weighbridge, labor, material, &c.

Filling excavation in allotment 6, section O, Main street.

Constructing two water-carts for watering streets, and watering Main and Bridge streets.

WORKS IN PROGRESS.

Clearing Nos. 6 and 7 storm-water channels, and culverts leading therein.

Curbing, channelling, and metalling 15 chains of Barkly street.

Forming Scott's parade and Edden street, and filling excavations.

NOTE.—December is the month in which public works are brought to completion.

APPLICATION TO THE GOVERNMENT, GRANTED.

Proclamation of the Town Hall reserve.

APPLICATIONS TO THE GOVERNMENT, UNDER CONSIDERATION.

Cemetery.—This matter remains in the same position as at the time of the last report, the council have deferred further action awaiting the result of new legislation on the matter in connection with the proposed Municipal Corporations Bill.

Main road channels.—That the pitching with bluestone of the channels on both sides of the Main road may be completed and raised to proper levels for drainage. The only progress made towards obtaining the execution of this most-necessary work, since the last report, is the promise of the Honorable the Commissioner of Roads, that when the estimates were passed the subject should have his favorable consideration.

Warrenee station.—That a railway station be erected at Warrenee.

Storm-water channel.—That the Government would complete the remaining portion of this channel, so as to give an outlet to the portion already made, and the drainage of the district.

Vehicles bye-law.—For its sanction to a bye-law for the regulation of public vehicles.

SURVEY OF THE STREETS AND RESERVES.

This most important work, which is being carried out by the district surveyor, has been progressing since the council's last report, yet not to such an extent as was anticipated, but doubtless the number of buildings and the irregular manner in which the ground is occupied, in consequence of the work being so long delayed, gives rise to especial difficulties. The council has, however, at no time lost sight of the urgent necessity for its uninterrupted completion.

RAILWAY.

In consequence of a rumour which obtained circulation, to the effect that an order had been issued to discontinue the delivery of goods from the Eastern Station after a certain date, a memorial was presented to the council by the inhabitants, praying that it would use its influence to prevent the same being carried into effect; the council thereupon sent a deputation to the Honorable the Commissioner of Railways, who stated that no such order had been made that he knew of, nor would he give effect to any such arrangement without consulting the council. The foot-crossing over the railway, promised to be constructed at Ryce street, has not yet been commenced, but it is hoped the Government will proceed with it shortly.

STORM-WATER AND SLUDGE CHANNEL.

The council deeply regrets having to state, that the hopes expressed in its last report, in reference to the completion of this most important and essential work, have not been realised. The present Government, regardless of the encouragement given by the former Government to the council, has uniformly refused its repeated and urgent applications. The council,

nevertheless, purposes to renew its efforts on the re-assembling of the Parliament, seeing that the health of the whole district greatly depends on the proper completion of this work, and being of opinion that the Government can have no reasonable excuse for leaving it in its present unfinished state.

WATER SUPPLY.

During the last half-year considerable progress has been made by the joint councils of Ballarat and Ballarat East in this important undertaking. A contract has been entered into for supplying 18-inch cast iron piping for the mains, to be imported from England, amounting to upwards of £15,000, the first delivery of which may be expected shortly to arrive. Plans of the necessary lands required for carrying out the scheme have been submitted to the Government for reservation to the council. Negotiations have been entered into for obtaining a loan of the required amount of money for completing the entire work. The present supply from Yuille's Swamp has been temporarily augmented by connecting the water from Kirk's Dam with the mains, at the junction of Eureka and Main streets, which will prevent scarcity during the present summer. Kirk's Dam has been completed by the Government and handed over to the council, and measures have been taken preparatory to the construction of a reservoir on a large scale at Beale's Swamp, and other works having for their object the conservation of all the water derivable from the various sources. A competent engineer, secretary, and collector, has been appointed, and every means adopted for accomplishing this most necessary work without delay.

LEGISLATIVE.

The Government having appointed a commission on Municipal and Charitable Institutions, and framed a bill to consolidate and amend the law relating to municipal institutions. The council has furnished to the commission the most ample statistics and information in its power, also its opinion on all the important subjects affecting municipal government, advocating amongst others—permanent endowment with land and local revenues, temporary grants-in-aid, power to make bye-laws for regulating building operations, the storage of mineral and other oils, the establishment of markets and cemeteries, the construction of wharfs, piers, sewerage, water supply, &c., in addition to the powers given in the existing municipal laws; and to levy fees, tolls, and dues.

A conference of municipal delegates from the various councils throughout the colony having had two sittings in Melbourne to consider the new Bill, and having suggested amendments, appointed a committee to watch the interests of the municipalities, and adjourned with the view of again assembling when the report of the commission is presented to the Government, in order to take such measures as may be deemed advisable to secure the powers and privileges sought for. These measures the Council is led to hope will result in a much improved system of municipal legislation throughout the colony.

WEIGHTS AND MEASURES.

The council congratulates the inhabitants on the fact, that at length the Government has effected provisions for the inspection of weights and measures (but only for avoirdupois and measures of capacity); the council, to facilitate the carrying out this necessary supervision, has appropriated a room at the Town Hall for the use of the Inspector, who will forthwith commence his duties.

CASTERTON TOWN COMMON.

THE following Rules have been adopted by the Managers of the Casterton Town Common, with reference to qualification to run cattle, amount of fees chargeable on the same, and regulations to be observed to entitle parties to graze stock on the Casterton Commonage.

1. That every land holder on the township of Casterton shall be entitled to run an equal number of cattle, provided they are their own *bona fide* property, and that all conditions connected with the same are duly fulfilled.

2. That the managers may allow others, residents within and beyond the township, to run stock on the same terms, provided they consider the commonage is not overstocked, or for the purpose of obtaining means to defray the expenses connected with the same, or for such and any other reason they may consider necessary to increase the number.

3. That the number of cattle running on the commonage shall be limited when considered advisable, notice being given to owners of stock of the maximum number allowed to each.

4. That the fees on stock be fixed and paid quarterly in advance, the first quarter to be at the rate of Three shillings for every head of cattle and Six shillings for every horse per annum, over six months old.

5. That the quarters shall commence on the first day of January, the first day of April, the first day of July, and the first day of October, and all stock upon which the fees have not been paid within ten days from the commencement of a quarter shall be treated as trespassers.

6. That all stock shall be registered with the managers and branded with the commons brand, and given in charge to the herdsman, and all cattle found running on the common unless duly registered and branded, are liable to be impounded or their owners summoned.

7. That no entire stock shall be allowed on the common unless approved of by the managers, and owners of such are required to send in notice in writing previous to permission being granted that they may be inspected.

8. That no person shall disturb or remove cattle without giving notice to the herdsman, and all persons making wrong entries in registering stock, &c., shall be prosecuted.

9. That the days of meeting be the first and third Saturday in each month, at Two o'clock p.m., at the Glenelg Inn, Casterton, when the managers will attend to hear complaints, &c.






