## PROCLAMATION.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sie Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the Government Gazette, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him shall seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the colony of Victoria hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the

road district for the purpose.

Commencing at a point on the western boundary of the Yackandandah Road District due east of Mount Pilot; thence due west to a point which is due south of the eastern boundary of the Wahgunyah Gold Field Common; thence south to a point due west of the northern boundary of the Beechworth Road District; thence due east to the said boundary; thence

further east by the said boundary and a direct line to the western boundary of the Yackandandah Road District; thence north-westerly by the said boundary to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Wooragee Road District."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirtieth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

> CONVENTION BETWEEN HER MAJESTY AND THE KING OF THE BELGIANS, RELATIVE TO JOINT STOCK COMPANIES. Signed at London, 13th November, 1862.

#### [Ratifications exchanged at London, 8th December, 1862.]

HER Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and His Majesty the King of the Belgians, having judged it expedient to come to an understanding in order to define, within their respective dominions and possessions, the position of commercial, industrial, and financial Companies and Associations constituted and authorized in conformity with the laws in force in either of the two countries, have resolved to conclude a Convention for that purpose, and have named as their Plenipotentiaries, that is to say.—

Her Majesty the Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, the Right Honorable John Earl Russell, Viscount Amberley of Amberley and Ardsalla, a Peer of the United Kingdom, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, a Member of Her Britannic Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Her Britannic Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs; and the Right Honorable Thomas Milner Gibson, a Member of Her Britannic Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, a Member of Parliament, and President of the Committee of Privy Council for Affairs of Trade and Foreign Plantations;

And His Majesty the King of the Belgians, the Sieur Sylvain Van de Weyer, His Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary to Her Britannic Majesty, Grand Cross of the Order of Leopold, decorated with the Iron Cross, Grand Cross of the Order of Charles III. of Spain, of the Order of the Ernestine Branch of Saxony, of the Tower and Sword, of St. Maurice and St. Lazarus, Commander of the Legion of Honour, &c.;

Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed upon the following Articles:—

### ARTICLE I.

The high contracting parties declare that they mutually grant to all companies and other associations, commercial, industrial, or financial, constituted and authorized in conformity with the laws in torce in either of the two countries, the power of exorcising all their rights, and of appearing before the tribunals, whether for the purpose of bringing an action, or for defonding the same, throughout the dominions and possessions of the other power, subject to the sole condition of conforming to the laws of such dominions and possessions.

### ARTICLE II.

It is agreed that the stipulations of the preceding article shall apply as well to companies and associations constituted and authorised previously to the signature of the present convention, as to those which may subsequently be so constituted and

#### ARTICLE III.

The present convention is concluded without limit as to duration. Either of the high powers shall, however, be at liberty to terminate it by giving to the other a year's previous notice. The two high powers, moreover, reserve to themselves the power to introduce into the convention, by common consent, any modifications which experience may show to be desirable.

### ARTICLE IV.

The present convention shall be ratified, and the ratifications shall be exchanged at London in one month, or sooner if possible.
