LICENSES FOR REMOVING SURFACE STONE, SAND SALT, LOAM, SHELLS, GRAVEL, AND TEA-TREE BRUSH.

REGULATION.

REFERRING to the Regulations under *The Land Act, 1862*, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 2nd July, 1862 (second division), the Board of Land and Works hereby notify that the licenses now issued weekly for removal of surface stone, sand, salt, loam, shells, gravel, and tea-tree brush, may in future be issued quarterly, if the persons who apply for such licenses shall desire to have them granted for such a period. In such cases the quarterly fee to be £2 10s. payable in advance, and the license to be issued from the General License Book.

TOLL-GATES IN THE BALLAARAT ROAD DISTRICT.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has confirmed the following Order made by the Ballaarat District Road Board, in accordance with the Act of Council 16 Victoria No. 40.

ORDER FOR THE ERECTION OF TOLL-GATES.

At a meeting of the Ballaarat District Road Board, held in the Board Room at Learmonth, on Friday, the 27th day of March, A.D. 1863: It was ordered that tolls be established at the four following places within the Ballaarat Road District, and that the charges mentioned in the Governor's Proclamation of the 29th September, A.D. 1862, promulgated in the *Gazette* of 30th September, 1862, be levied at the toll-houses about to be erected at the said four places, namely—

First—On the main Ballaarat and Raglan road, adjoining the intersection of that road by the municipal boundary of Ballaarat, with two check-gates on the intersecting parish road.

Second—On the main Amherst and Lexton road, at the intersection of that road by the parish boundary road of the parishes of Ballaarat and Dowling Forest, with a check-gate on the last-mentioned road.

Third—At the point of intersection of two parish roads in the parish of Ballaarat, at the north-east angle of allotment No. 12 of section C in the said parish, with one check-gate.

Fourth—On the main Ballaarat and Creswick road, opposite the south-east angle of allotment No. 3 of the parish of Ballaarat, with two check-gates.

It was also further ordered, that on and after the date on which tolls shall commence to be levied at the abovementioned places the collection of tolls at the junction of the Amherst and Lexton main roads, in the parish of Dowling Forest, established under Order of this Board, dated 25th July, A.D. 1862, shall be discontinued.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof shall not exceed nine square miles, and which shall contain a population of householders not less three hundred, may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area shall be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it is further enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district may be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, shall have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, may, if he shall think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation may define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, may vary and alter, but so as in no case, save as thereafter mentioned, to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined shall be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to the Governor by the householders resident at and near Queenscliffe, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF QUEENSCLIFFE.—Commencing at the north-west angle of the Battery Reserve, in the parish of Paywit, in the county of Grant; thence along the northern boundary of that reserve to the shore of Lonsdale Bay; thence along the shore of Lonsdale Bay to Shortland's Bluff; thence along the shore of Port Phillip Bay to Swan Point; thence round Swan Island and along the southern shore of Swan Bay, including Rabbit Island, to the north-east angle of allotment 1, block 3, in the said parish; thence by a line bearing south-westerly to the commencing point.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Queenscliffe."

BYE-LAW No. 22.—TO COMPEL OBSERVANCE TO BE PAID TO THE SURVEYED LINE OF STREET IN THE FUTURE ERECTION OF BUILDINGS AND FENCES, ALSO TO PROVIDE FOR THE REMOVAL OF BUILDINGS AND FENCES NOW STANDING IN ANY WAY ON THE STREETS.

BE it ordered and directed by the municipal council of Amherst, in accordance with the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, the owners or occupiers of any house or building, or of any land where the fence in any way encroaches on the boundary line of any street, road, common thoroughfare, or public reserve within the said municipality, will be required to move such house, building, or fence back to the surveyed line of such street or streets; and if any house, building, or fence shall encroach so far on any street, road, common thoroughfare, or public reserve, as to prevent, interfere with, or hinder the making, maintaining, or repairing of any of the surveyed roads, streets, common thoroughfares, or public reserves within the said municipality, then it shall be lawful for the municipal council, or their authorised officer, by notice, in writing, to the owner or occupier of any house or building, or of any land where the fence encroaches as aforesaid, to order the removal of such house, building, or fence within fourteen days from the date hereof. And be it further ordered and enacted as aforesaid, that any person failing or neglecting or refusing to comply with the provisions of this bye-law, on the expiration of the term above mentioned in such notice as aforesaid, shall be liable and subject to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, such penalty to be recovered and recoverable in the manner provided by the said Act.

This bye-law shall not interfere with the existing rights of any person mining thereon for gold.

Any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.


