MUNICIPAL EXEMPTIONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained shall authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act with any public road, cemetery, market, wharf, aqueduct, or any other public work, place, or building, of what description soever, not erected, formed, or constructed by such municipal council, that may be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor, or respecting which provision shall have been or shall be made by any Act or Acts of Council: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the premises hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the councils of the municipal districts in which they are respectively situated: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the councils of the municipal districts in which they are situated respectively the following premises, that is to say:—

All buildings used by the Victorian Volunteer Force as Drill or Orderly Rooms.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

Any person guilty of any breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Twenty pounds.

And whereas it is estimated that the sum of Fifteen hundred pounds at least will be required by the municipal council of Kyneton for the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, to carry on the making and repairing of roads and other public works in the municipal district of Kyneton, and other expenses necessary in carrying into effect the provisions of the said Act (in addition to any tolls, rates, or dues which have been levied or authorised to be levied in the said district); and that such amount would be raised by a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the said municipal council of Kyneton, that a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound for the current municipal year ending the tenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, be levied and assessed on all property in houses and lands within the limits of the said municipal district, according to its fair average annual value, the same to be due and payable as follows, namely:—Two-thirds thereof on and after the first day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and the remaining one-third thereof on and after the first day of September, in the same year; except in cases where the amount of the said rate shall not exceed the sum of Two pounds five shillings, when the whole shall be due and payable in one sum on and after the said first day of May.

BANNOCKBURN ROAD DISTRICT.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BANNOCKBURN DISTRICT ROAD BOARD (1863).

THE business of the board shall be conducted on all ordinary occasions with open doors.

2. The regular meetings of the board shall be held at the office of the board on the second Tuesday of every month: at two o'clock in the afternoon in summer, and at one o'clock in the afternoon in winter. The business to commence as soon as the quorum of three is present; but, should a quorum not be present at the expiration of half an hour after the said time appointed for meeting, the same shall be entered, with a note of the members present, in the minute book, and the meeting shall lapse.

3. Special meetings may be summoned at any time by the secretary, upon receiving a written requisition signed by two members, provided he shall give to each member notice thereof by-post seven clear days before such meeting, stating the business to be brought forward.

4. At every regular meeting of the board, the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting for confirmation the minutes of any preceding meetings; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes then confirmed shall be signed by the chairman for the time being.

5. After the confirmation of the minutes, the order of business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable:—

1. Reading copies of letters sent.
2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
3. Reception and reading of petitions.
4. Reading and ordering on reports of special committees.
5. Orders of the day.
6. Motions of which previous notice shall have been given.
6. Every petition addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for the petition being respectfully worded.
7. On the presentation of a petition or the bringing up of a report, no debate shall take place thereon, unless notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only question that shall be entertained shall be that the petition or report be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

8. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of notice of motion: no such motion, however, shall be decided on at any meeting of the board unless notice thereof shall have been given to the secretary, in writing, by the member bringing it forward, at the meeting previous to that in which the same shall be taken into consideration.

9. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or a member authorised by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

10. No rule shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting.

11. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall, for that occasion, be a member of such committee.

12. Any rule may be suspended, *pro tem.*, in case of emergency, with the consent of the majority of the members present at any meeting of the board.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

13. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand up while addressing the board.

14. The presiding chairman's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

15. Every motion and amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder; and on a division thereon, the votes shall be recorded.

16. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

17. All questions before the board shall be decided by open voting.

18. No discussion will be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

19. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion that has already passed the board, shall be entertained during the same year, unless a call of the whole board shall have been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board that shall have been negatived by the board shall be again entertained during the same year.

20. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the board, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the board.

21. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately on the same being used.

CONTRACTS.

22. All contracts shall be made by tender, advertised not less than four times in a local newspaper, unless the board shall otherwise direct. Tenders shall be addressed to the chairman, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the board;

the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered in every case on the minutes of the board. When tenders shall have been accepted for an amount exceeding the sum of Thirty pounds sterling, the board may, if they deem fit, require a deposit of *ten per cent.* on the amount of the tender accepted, as security for the due performance of the contract.

23. No officer or member of the board shall have any pecuniary interest, either directly or indirectly, in any contract under the board.

PAYMENT OF MONIES.

24. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the chairman and one other member of the board, and countersigned by the secretary; and no such cheque shall be given unless passed at a meeting of the board.

LOCAL ASSESSMENT.

25. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due on the assessment roll; and in the event of any such amount not being paid to him, a notice shall be left, stating that unless the amount be paid to the secretary of the board before the expiration of fourteen days from the date thereof, legal proceedings will be taken for its recovery.

26. The collector shall, once a week at least, pay into such bank as the board shall direct, to the credit of such board, all moneys received by him from time to time, and at the same time furnish the secretary with an account of such moneys.

ACCOUNTS.

27. The collector and secretary shall present their accounts at each regular meeting of the board.

28. The secretary shall keep separate accounts of all local revenue and expenditure, distinguishing the main and parish roads of the district for the purposes thereof; all moneys collected by virtue of assessment to be placed to the credit of each parish in which the same may be collected.

At a meeting of the Bannockburn District Road Board, held at their office within the said district, on the tenth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, the foregoing rules were made and ordered to be forwarded to His Excellency the Governor in Council, for his approval in accordance with the Act of Council 16 Victoria No. 40, section 4.
