PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore J. Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the lands hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the abovesaid provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

BRIGHT TOWN COMMON.—The common for the town of Bright shall comprise the land hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the junction of the Deep Creek and the Ovens River; thence by a line bearing east three hundred and seventy-five chains; thence by a line bearing south eighty chains; thence by a line bearing west three hundred and seventy-five chains; and thence by a line bearing north eighty chains to the commencing point. Area, 3000 acres.—(63.G.2183.)

BUCKLAND GOLD FIELDS COMMON.—The gold field common at Buckland (described, amongst others, in a Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, 1861) is hereby abolished.—(63.G.2183.)

MORSE'S CREEK AND BUCKLAND GOLD FIELDS COMMON shall comprise the land hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the south-western angle of the boundary of the town common for Bright; thence on the southern boundary thereof on a line bearing east two hundred and fifty chains; thence by a line bearing south two hundred and eighty chains; thence by a line bearing west two hundred and fifty chains; and thence by a line bearing north two hundred and eighty chains to the commencing point. Area, 7000 acres.—(63.G.2183.)

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

A PORTION OF GIPPS LAND DECLARED A CLEAN DISTRICT UNDER THE PLEURO-PNEUMONIA ACT, No. 136.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria (Number 136), intitled, "An Act to amend an Act intitled *An Act to prevent the further spread of the disease in Cattle called Pleuro-pneumonia*," it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation which shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, declare any part of the colony in which the said disease is not known to exist, a "clean district," and shall by such Proclamation define the boundaries of every such district, and after such publication no cattle, unless certified to be free from disease by a commissioner appointed for that purpose, shall be taken into any such district until such Proclamation is revoked: And whereas by a Pro-

clamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-second day of September, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, the whole of the district of Gipps Land was declared a "clean district" under the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to declare that only a portion of the said district shall be deemed a "clean district." Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation above referred to; and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare so much only of the said district of Gipps Land as lies south and west of the Rivers McAlister, Thomson, and La Trobe, according to the description annexed hereto, to be a "clean district," within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the sea coast, on the south side of Lake Reeves, and bearing north-westerly to the south-east angle of Lake Wellington, near Seacombe township; thence bounded on the north by the south side of Lake Wellington, bearing westerly to the junction of Lake Wellington and La Trobe River; thence bounded on the north-east by the La Trobe River, bearing westerly to the junction of the La Trobe and McAlister Rivers; thence bounded on the north-east by the McAlister River, bearing north-westerly, and by a line bearing north-westerly to a mountain range between Mount Buller and Jamieson township; thence bearing south-westerly along the summit of said range to the northern boundary of the county of Evelyn; thence bounded on the west by the county of Evelyn, and bearing south-easterly and westerly to the junction of the counties of Evelyn and Mornington; thence bounded on the west by the county of Mornington, bearing southerly to the sea coast; thence bounded by the sea coast and Corner Inlet, bearing south-easterly, northerly, and north-easterly to the point of commencement.
