WHEREAS by The Land Act, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the lands hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

Carngham Gold Field Common.—The Gold Field Common

An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is empowered to pass bye-laws for the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, and public thoroughfares, and suppression of nuisances: Be it ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Moonambel, that the owners or occupiers of any house or building encroaching in any way on the boundary line of any of the streets within the said municipality, shall, on being required by the said municipal council, move such house or building back to the surveyed line of such street or streets before the expiration of the 16th day of April, 1864; and no house or building shall encroach so far on any street as to prevent, interfere with, or hinder the making or repairing of any of the surveyed roads or streets within the said municipality, after the expiration of notice in writing to the owner or occupier of any house or building so encroaching as aforesaid from the said municipal council, ordering the removal of such house or building within fourteen days from the date of the service of such notice. GENERAL Meetings of the board shall be held every alternate Monday at Two o'clock p.m.

2. During the sittings of the board the office shall be open to the public.

3. Special meetings may be summoned by the clerk, upon his receiving a written requisition signed by three members of the board, stating the matter to be brought forward at such meeting. The clerk to give at least three days' notice by letter to each member of the board.

4. The first business at each meeting of the board shall be to read the minutes of the preceding meeting; and when confirmed and signed by the chairman, no further discussion shall be permitted thereon.

5. At all meetings of the board the reading of correspondence, the presentation of petitions, and the bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of all motions.

6. On the presentation of petitions, the only question that may be entertained shall be, that the petitions be received, and, if necessary, be referred to a committee.

7. All petitions addressed to the board must be presented by a member of the board, who shall be responsible for its being in form and respectfully worded.

8. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business the chairman or any two members of the board and any business the chairman or any two members of the board and any business the chairman or any two members of the board must hink fit, anotice of motion having been given at a former general meeting.

9. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member giving notice, or some momber authorized by him, be present. Notices not proceeded with shall be struck off the paper.

10. No bye-law shall be finally passed at the meeting at which its first proposed, nor until the next general meeting of the board, and such bye-law shall in the meantime remain open for the inspection of the ratepayers during office hours free of charge.

11. Any member shall have power to move for a call of the 11. Any memoor shall have power to move for a can of the whole board to rescind any motion previously passed during the official year, and on such motion being carried, the clerk shall give notice thereof to each member not then present.

12. In all matters of order or practice the chairman's ruling shall be final, and he shall state the same without comment or

shall be final, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

13. Every motion and amendment, whether carried or lost, shall be entered on the minutes, with the name of the mover and seconder, if any; and, on a division thereon, the votes shall be recorded, and likewise the attendance of members at each general or special meeting.

14. One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but all amendments shall be put and discussed before the original protion.

15. All questions shall be decided by open voting, except the board shall otherwise determine.

16. 30. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for any assessment, and in the event of its not being paid, either when called for or at the office of the board before the expiration of one month, legal proceedings may be taken for its recovery.

31. The collector shall, at intervals of not more than two days, pay into the hands of the treasurer all moneys received by him on account of the board.

32. The treasurer and collector shall present their accounts at each general meeting of the board.

33. When any tender is accepted the tenderer shall, with two sufficient sureties, enter into a bond, or pay the sum of Ten per cent. on the amount of the contract, at the option of the board, as security for the due and faithful performance of the work contracted for by him; and in either case Seventy per cent. only will be paid on the work done while in progress; the balance, with deposit, if any, will be paid when the work is completed as above.
