QUEEN'S COUNSEL.

THE Governor in Council has directed the following Regulations to be published for general information.

REGULATIONS TO BE OBSERVED ON THE APPOINTMENT OF QUEEN'S COUNSEL. APPROVED BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL ON THE 7TH OF DECEMBER, 1857.

1. Except in the case of barristers who shall have held the office of Attorney or Solicitor General, no barrister shall be appointed Her Majesty's Counsel except on the recommendation of the Chief Justice to the Governor in Council.
2. On every such appointment the usual fee of Five guineas shall be paid for the patent at the office of the Chief Secretary.
3. For every license to appear against the Crown in cases in which the services of any of Her Majesty's Counsel may be dispensed with, a fee of One guinea shall be paid at the same office.
4. That a copy of these regulations be forwarded by the Attorney General to His Honor the Chief Justice.

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SALE.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereinafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to the Governor by the householders in the town and parish of Sale, in the district of Gipps Land, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act, and no counter-petition, in accordance with the terms of the said Act, has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SALE—Commencing at the north-west angle of suburban allotment 74; thence east one hundred and eighty chains, more or less, to the north-east angle of suburban allotment 88; thence south one hundred and eighty-seven chains, more or less, to Flooding Creek; thence by Flooding Creek westerly and northerly to the south-west angle of suburban allotment 74; thence by the west boundary thereof north to the point of commencement.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Sale."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this tenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereinafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eleventh day of July, One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the locality therein described was declared to be the Municipal District of Sandridge: And whereas a petition, signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident in the said district, has been received, praying that such district may be varied and altered in manner hereinafter mentioned: And whereas the substance and prayer of the said petition have been published as directed by the said Act, and no counter-petition, in accordance with the terms of the said Act, has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation vary and alter the said district, and I do hereby declare that, in lieu of the district the boundaries whereof are described in the above-mentioned Proclamation, the district hereinafter described shall be and constitute the Municipal District of Sandridge, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-east angle of the municipality; thence northerly and north-westerly by the eastern and north-eastern boundaries thereof to the south bank of the Yarra Yarra River; by that bank of the river westerly to the limits of Footscray municipality; by those limits south and west to the Yarra Yarra River; by the east bank of that river southerly to its confluence with Hobson's Bay; and by the high-water line of Hobson's Bay easterly to the point of commencement: save and except all piers, jetties, and wharfs now existing or at any time to be hereafter made, such piers, jetties, and wharfs being hereby specially excluded from the area of the said municipal district.

MUNICIPALITY OF MOONAMBEL.

BYE-LAW No. 6.—FOR PREVENTING DAMAGE TO FOOTPATHS AND WATER-CHANNELS, AND FOR REGULATING THE FORMATION OF PRIVATE AND COMMON CROSSINGS.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is *inter alia* enacted that it shall be lawful for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the care and management of the roads, public paths, streets, and public thoroughfares: Be it therefore enacted by the Moonambel Municipal Council, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency, no person shall ride, drive, or lead any horse, or beast, or shall drive or wheel any cart, barrow, carriage, or other vehicle upon or across any of the public footpaths or water-courses of the municipal district of Moonambel, except at a crossing made as hereinafter prescribed, or shall in any way cause damage to the said public footpaths, or water-courses, or any of them. And be it further enacted by the council aforesaid, that all persons having, or that may hereafter have, roadways for carts or other wheeled vehicles across the footpaths now formed, or that may be hereafter formed by the council aforesaid, shall at their own expense construct and maintain a crossing-place over the water-channel and footpath in the following manner:—In streets where a stone or wooden kerb is now or may hereafter be laid, the crossing shall be paved with stone pavement or broken metal the whole width of the footpath from the building line to the pavement of the water-channel, and shall be enclosed on both sides with a stone or wooden kerb of the same size and description as the street kerbing, which it shall join with a gentle curve. The water-channel must not in any way be altered or obstructed. In streets where a footpath is or may be formed, and where no kerbing is laid, suitable wooden bridges shall be provided and fixed over the water-channel so as to leave a free passage for the water underneath, said bridge to project into the public roadway not less than four feet from the outer edge of the footpath; and the crossing-place over the footpath, whether paved, metalled, or gravelled, shall be maintained in such manner that it shall be at all times as clear and dry as the footpath itself immediately adjoining such crossing-place. Any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall, on conviction thereof, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £50.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 6, made by the municipal council of Moonambel, has been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 6th day of August, 1863.

MUNICIPALITY OF MARYBOROUGH.

BYE-LAW No. 24.—FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH, AND THE SUPPRESSION OF NUISANCES CAUSED BY THE OVERFLOW OR SOAKAGE OF WATER-CLOSETS AND CESSPOOLS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the preservation of the public health and the suppression of nuisances: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Maryborough, that the owner or occupier of any house or premises shall not allow the contents of any water-closet, privy, or cesspool to overflow or soak therefrom so as to be a nuisance or injurious to the health of the inhabitants, after written notice from the local inspector of nuisances to such owner or occupier to abate the same.

Any person guilty of any neglect or breach of this bye-law shall forfeit and pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law No. 24, made by the municipal council of Maryborough, has been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 10th day of August, 1863.

The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. 7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

9. BYE-LAW No. 21.—FOR LEVYING A RATE OF THREEPENCE IN THE POUND, FOR CARRYING OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THE FITZ ROY WARD IMPROVEMENT ACT, 17 VICTORIA No. 31, AND FITZ ROY WARD IMPROVEMENT ACT, 24 VICTORIA No. 110.

The council have endeavored to induce the magistrates at the central court to reduce the poundage fees, but hitherto without success.

Petitions have been adopted and presented to Parliament against the Loop Line Scheme, the Newspaper Bill, and the clause in the Local Government Bill empowering the Corporation of Geelong to claim a portion of the tolls collected on the roads leading into their district; and in regard to the latter question, a deputation, consisting of Councillors Powell, Herd, and Mackenzie, were appointed, and proceeded to Melbourne, to use their exertions against the same.

In addition to other subjects on which the council have been engaged, the health reports have been prepared and forwarded; various statistics have been provided for the Government; and the progress of the Municipal Act Amendment Bill has been watched.
