GEELONG AND WARRNAMBOOL MAIN ROAD.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and the Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, to proclaim, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, the roads in the said colony which shall be and be deemed main roads under the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the road leading from Geelong to Warrnambool, hereinafter described, to be a Main Road under the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

Commencing on the south-west boundary of the town of Geelong; thence crossing the River Barwon, bearing in a south-westerly direction *via* the parishes of Barrarbool, Duneed, and Modewarre, to the township of Winchelsea; thence south-westerly to the township of Colac; thence westerly to the Pirron Yaloak Creek; thence north-westerly to the township of Camperdown; thence south-westerly *via* Terang and Panmure to the municipal boundary of Warrnambool.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventeenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the lands hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

QUEENSLIFFE TOWN COMMON (described, amongst others, in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of February, 1861) is hereby abolished.—(63.H.7219.)

No. 86.—AUGUST 25, 1863.—1.

QUEENSLIFFE MUNICIPAL COMMON shall be and comprise all the unappropriated Crown lands within the municipal boundary of Queenscliffe.—(63.H.7219.)

WEDDERBURNE TOWN COMMON shall be and comprise the land hereafter described, viz.:—The unappropriated Crown lands within the town reserve of Wedderburne, and the following portion of land, viz.: Commencing at the south-west angle of suburban allotment 3; thence east to the north-west angle of allotment 1, by the west and south boundaries of that allotment south and east and a line east to the west boundary of the Gold Field Common No. 2, Wedderburne; thence south thirty-seven chains, more or less; thence west to the east boundary of township reserve of Wedderburne; thence north by part of the east boundary of the township to the point of commencement; as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, about 1600 acres.—(63.G.6331.)

MUNICIPALITY OF MARYBOROUGH.

BYE-LAW No. 25.—FOR MAKING AN ASSESSMENT AND IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPENCE IN THE POUND, FOR THE YEAR ENDING 4TH MAY, 1864.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is authorised and required to assess all property in houses or lands within the limits of such municipal district (except property belonging to Her Majesty), according to its fair average annual value, and to impose a rate on all such properties for the current year: And whereas the council of the municipal district of Maryborough has caused a valuation of all rateable property within the said district, under the said Act, to be made, amounting to the sum of £18,519 10s.: And whereas all appeals against such valuation have been finally made and determined, and such valuation has been amended as provided by the said Act: And whereas such amended valuation amounts to the sum of £17,445: Be it therefore enacted by the said municipal council, that all the several properties in houses and lands within the limits of the said district be and the same are hereby assessed, for the current municipal year ending 4th May, 1864, according to the several amounts of annual value respectively affixed to the same in the said valuation or assessment, amounting in the aggregate to the aforesaid sum of £17,445; and that a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound for the current year, on the said annual value of the said respective properties, be and the same is hereby imposed and levied, one moiety to be collected on and after twenty days from the issue of the notices, and the other on and after the fifth day of January, 1864.

The foregoing Bye-law No. 25, made by the municipal council of Maryborough, has been assented to by the Governor in Council, on the 17th day of August, 1863.

Printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering. The tenders for each station will be accepted or rejected separately. Tenders may be for either of the supplies required, oats, bran, hay, or straw only, and if all be included in one tender, it will be accepted for one article only if advisable. As much forage as the storage will accommodate will be drawn at a time for the convenience of contractors. The price must be per ton for hay and straw, and per bushel for oats and bran, including delivery at the stations and all charges; bags to be returned when empty. The net weight only after deducting the tare is to be charged. The names and addresses of the tenderers and of their proposed sureties must be stated at full length. All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for _____" (as the case may be), and deposited in the box at the Government Stores, King street, or if sent by post they must be addressed to the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne. The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender. The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS.

- The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.
- The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.
- The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.
- The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.
- Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.
- Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.
- In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.
- If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.
- When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.
- A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

FINANCE.

The half-year was commenced with a debt of £4988 4s. 1d. Owing to the delay in Parliament in passing the new Municipal and Appropriation Acts, the usual grant-in-aid from the general revenue has not been received, and the debt has therefore only been reduced to £4232 10s. 8d., instead of being paid off as it would have been had the promised measures been fully carried out.

An assessment for the current year has been completed, on which a rate will be struck in a few days.

The income from the general market has suffered a decrease, mainly from improper use of railway goods shed and weighbridge for market purposes.

The income from the cattle market continues satisfactory.

MISCELLANEOUS.

In compliance with numerous applications, the council has withdrawn many of the restrictions on mining on the street, and during the half-year has allowed it generally to be carried on. This has necessitated the appointment of a constable solely to see that the conditions imposed by the council are adhered to.

Applications to the Government on several matters, which have occupied much time and trouble on the part of the council, are still pending, some owing to the recent change of ministry, such as the grant of lands for the Inglewood tramway, connection of cattle market with the railway, cession of Sandhurst cemetery, proclamation of streets, &c.

Owing to the absence of power of appeal from the Court of Mines without the consent of the judge, the council was not able to have set aside a judgment given therein against them, and the law costs for the half-year have been thereby greatly increased.

ELECTIONS.

At the annual municipal election in January, Messrs. Casey, Garsed, and Holmes were declared elected in the place of the retiring councillors.

In February, on the application of Dr. Boyd, a committee to scrutinise the ballot-papers was appointed, and it appeared that some errors had been made in computing them. After this Mr. Edward Garsed ceased attending the meetings of the council, and Mr. James Moore, one of the candidates at the annual election, took his seat.

In March Mr. John Holdsworth resigned his seat in the council, and Dr. Boyd was elected in his stead.
