NOMINATION OF VICE-CONSULS.

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Despatch of the Secretary of State for the Colonies to be published.

SIR.—I have the honor to inform you that it has been determined, that in all colonial Governments (excepting British North America) in which there may be present a foreign consul-general, it shall be competent to such consul-general to propose to the Governor any vice-consul whom he may wish to name at any of the places situated within that Government, and that the Governor will be at liberty to accept such nomination provisionally, subject to the consul-general's reporting it to his own Government, and to the Governor's reporting it to Her Majesty's Government, with a view to the ultimate decision respecting the recognition of the vice-consul.

If the foreign consul-general wish to appoint a vice-consul in some colony neighboring to the one at which he is stationed, as, for example, a consul-general at Sydney has lately wished to name vice-consuls in the neighboring colonies of Queensland and of South Australia, there will be no objection to the consul-general's proposing the appointment to the Governor of the neighboring colony, who will then be at liberty to accept such nomination provisionally, subject to the same conditions as are above stated in the case of a vice-consul named within the limits of the Government where the consul-general is resident.

**MINING OPERATIONS UNDER THE WATER RE-
SERVE. PARISH OF BALLAARAT.**

*At the Government House, Melbourne, the twelfth day of
January, 1863.*

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made on the first day of September, 1862, holders of miners' rights were authorised to prosecute mining operations under the water reserve in the parish of Ballarat, subject to the conditions and restrictions therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to modify such conditions and restrictions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the said Order in Council in manner hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:-

1. So much of the first and third clauses of the said Order in Council as provides that mining operations shall be conducted in such a manner as not to break or disturb the natural surface of the ground, and that no debris shall be allowed to accumulate on the said reserve, is hereby rescinded.

2. Holders of miners' rights shall be permitted to break the surface of the ground and sink not more than three (3) shafts within the boundaries of the said land, the sites to be occupied by such shafts, and the areas to be covered by the debris brought

out of the same, to be subject to the approval of the warden of the district, or the mining surveyor or other duly authorised officer.

3. All the conditions and restrictions prescribed in the said Order in Council, except the conditions hereby rescinded, shall be observed by all persons who may mine on the said reserve, as if this Order had not been made.

And the Honorable George Samuel Evans, LL.D., shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
