A LL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken or a vault re-opened.

2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule.

3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that the relatives of deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.

4. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the fee mentioned in schedule A.

5. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, must be ept in repair and proper condition, at the expense of the

owners.

6. All persons destroying the fences, or in any manner injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

7. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

A detailed account of the receipts and expenses is open at the Town Clork's Office for the inspection of ratepayers.

The financial statement shows that the overdraft at the bank has increased £3005 3s. 4d. since the last report, which is caused partly by not having received any portion of the grant-in-aid during the past half-year, and partly by the extensive contracts for public works which are now almost completed.

The remaining two acceptances drawn by Messrs. Borland and Lockhart, on account of the market building, jointly amounting to the sum of £631 18s. 4d., became due on the 29th of May. The bank refused to cash them on account of not being previously advised of their becoming due, in connection with the increased overdraft. The acceptances were renewed by the drawers for the term of three months.

The annual assessment commenced being made on the 13th February; the appeals were heard on the 29th of April. There were 20 notices of appeal, 7 were reduced and 13 confirmed. There are 2894 properties assessed, the amount of the assessment is £76,747, upon which a rate of One shilling in the pound has been duly made.

A committee of the council was convened on the 2nd of June to consider their financial position, with a view to its amendment, and recommended that, in consideration of the reduced value of property, and consequently in the assessment, likewise in the amount appropriated by the Government in aid of the municipality, that the working expenses be reduced by having the streets cleaned and the lamps lighted by contract, likewise by altering the officers' salaries to the following scale:—
