REGULE GENERALES.

Saturday, the twenty-fifth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three.

THAT all acts of a merely ministerial nature, in the Equitable, Ecclesiastical, and Divorce and Matrimonial Causes Jurisdictions of this Court, such as the signing and issuing of writs, decrees, orders, probates, and letters of administration, signing decrees, orders, and allocators, previously settled, which, according to the rules and practice of this Court, are required to be done or signed by the Master in Equity, may, during his absence on leave, published in the *Gazette*, be done or signed by the Chief Clerk in the office of the said Master, or other person in that behalf appointed by the Judges.

MEMORANDA FOR THE INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE OF APPLICANTS FOR LEASES OF LAND UNDER THE 47TH SECTION OF *The Land Act, 1862*.

THE sum of £1 must be forwarded with every application, to defray the cost of inserting the requisite notice of the same in the *Government Gazette*. Applications unaccompanied by this amount will not be entertained or recorded.

Land comprised in the ten millions of acres reserved for agricultural areas is not available for leasing under the 47th section of *The Land Act, 1862*.

In the column appropriated for that purpose, a plan of the land applied for must be furnished by an authorised surveyor* from actual survey on the ground. Where a long traverse survey has been necessary to connect the site applied for with a fixed point in a Government survey, as required, it may be shown on a separate sheet; and in such cases (to facilitate the preparation of the description for the *Gazette* notice) the distance and bearing in a direct line should be given, as well as the particulars of the traverse line.

Allotments that are applied for in unsurveyed localities should be of a rectangular form, and must in every instance contain at least two right angles; the boundary lines should conform either to the true meridian or to the magnetic meridian. The boundaries of a site comprised in a surveyed allotment must conform to the lines of the prior survey.

All leases under the 47th section of the Land Act will contain the condition, that not less than one-half the area of the site leased shall be cultivated during the first five years of the lease, in a proportion of not less than three acres annually; and as this section of the Act contemplates, and its operation is restricted to, the introduction of any useful plant, or industrial enterprise or process, either previously unknown or not generally known in Victoria, applications will not be entertained for leases of sites for vineyards, orchards, mulberry plantations, the cultivation of beet-root, &c. &c., merely for the purpose of raising the various products with a view to the disposal of them in a raw state, but must be accompanied by an undertaking to submit the products to the manufacturing process or processes contemplated by the purposes for which the lease is desired, and adapted to the nature of the crops. RULES AND REGULATIONS AGREED TO BY THE TRUSTEES OF THE COLERAINE CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground is broken or a vault re-opened.

2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the fees set forth in the schedule.

3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that the relatives of deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.

4. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the fee mentioned in schedule A.

5. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, must be kept in repair and proper condition, at the expense of the owners.

6. All persons destroying the fences, or in any manner injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.

7. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.

8. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined on payment of the charges set forth in schedule A.

9. When a meeting of the trustees is required, the same to be called by the secretary; three to form a quorum.

10. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration, from time to time, in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

Printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The tenders for each station will be accepted or rejected separately.

Tenders may be for either of the supplies required, oats, bran, hay, or straw only, and if all be included in one tender, it will be accepted for one article only if advisable.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

A detailed account of the receipts and expenses is open at the Town Clerk's Office for the inspection of ratepayers.

The financial statement shows that the overdraft at the bank has increased £3005 3s. 4d. since the last report, which is caused partly by not having received any portion of the grant-in-aid during the past half-year, and partly by the extensive contracts for public works which are now almost completed.

The remaining two acceptances drawn by Messrs. Lorland and Lockhart, on account of the market building, jointly amounting to the sum of £263 18s. 4d., became due on the 29th of May. The bank refused to cash them on account of not being previously advised of their becoming due, in connection with the increased overdraft. The acceptances were renewed by the drawers for the term of three months.

The annual assessment commenced being made on the 13th February; the appeals were heard on the 29th of April. There were 20 notices of appeal, 7 were reduced and 13 confirmed. There are 2894 properties assessed, the amount of the assessment is £76,747, upon which a rate of One shilling in the pound has been duly made.

A committee of the council was convened on the 2nd of June to consider their financial position, with a view to its amendment, and recommended that, in consideration of the reduced value of property, and consequently in the assessment, likewise in the amount appropriated by the Government in aid of the municipality, that the working expenses be reduced by having the streets cleaned and the lamps lighted by contract, likewise by altering the officers' salaries to the following scale:—

The collector's income is reduced in proportion by the diminution in the amount of the annual assessment.

The recommendation was adopted by the council.

The council have also resolved not to undertake further extensive works until the overdraft at the bank is consistently reduced, although, as must necessarily be the case in all young communities, the inhabitants in each part of the district are claiming their share of public improvement.
