## COMMON-TOLL ROAD.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Councils of the Boroughs of East Collingwood and Fitz Roy have complained to the Governor in Council that they ought, by reason of the traffic passing along the road hereinafter mentioned being common to their own districts with the district in which tolls are payable upon such road, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 254th clause of *The Local Government Act*, 1863: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the road hereinafter mentioned to be a Common-toll road, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to Common-toll roads, viz.:-

The road known as The Upper Plenty Road, extending from the north end of Brunswick street, in the Borough of Fitz Roy, to the northern boundary of the Upper Plenty or Morang road District, shall be a Common-toll road of the said Boroughs of East Collingwood and Fitz Roy and of the Upper Plenty or Morang Road District and the Epping Road District.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this third day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

## THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE SHIRE OF WINCHELSEA.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the third day of October 1864.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

Major-General Chute

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act*, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time after the first annual election or general election as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, hereinafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the Proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such Proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where herein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the seventeenth day of May, in the present year, the shire of Winchelsea was constituted: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by more than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said shire, praying for the division of the said shire into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the shire of Winchelsea into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:-

THE WEST RIDING.—Commencing at the north-west angle of section VII., in the parish of Hesse, in the county of Grenville; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of sections VII., II., and I., of the parish of Hesse, to the western boundary of the parish of Murdook; thence northerly by the west boundary line of said parish to the centre of the Warrambine Creek; thence easterly by the centre line of the said creek to its junction with the River Barwon; thence southerly and westerly by the centre line of the said river to its confluence with Birregurra Creek; thence by the centre line of the said creek to a point due south of the dividing line of allotments B and C of section XII., in the parish of Birregurra, in the county of Grenville aforesaid; thence northerly by the said dividing line to the Geelong and Warrnambool main road; thence north-easterly along the said main road to a point due south of the east side line of allotments 50 and 57 of the last-named parish; thence north to the south side of section CIV., in the parish of Gellibrand; thence further north by the western boundary lines of Gellibrand and Hesse to the commencing point.

**THE CAPE OTWAY RIDING.**—Commencing at a point on the sea-coast due south of the south-west angle of the parish of Murroon, in the county of Polwarth; thence due north to the River Barwon, at said south-west angle; thence by the centre line of said river northerly to a point due east of the south boundary line of allotment N, section XXVIII, in parish of Birregurra, in county aforesaid; thence westward to the south-west angle of said allotment; thence northward to the south boundary of allotment A of section XXII, in said parish; thence south-east along the south boundary of said allotment to its south-east angle; thence due north along the eastern boundaries of allotments A, B, C, D, and E of said section XXII, to the north-east angle of said allotment E; thence westward to the south-east side line of a Government road (bounding the said allotment E on the north-west); thence north-east along the side line of said road and of allotment E of section XIX, in parish aforesaid, to a point due south of the dividing line of allotments B and C of said section XIX; thence northerly by said dividing line to a point in the centre of Birregurra Creek; thence easterly by the centre line of said creek, and by the centre line of the River Barwon to the junction of Hopkins Creek; thence south-easterly by the centre line of said creek, and by a line to the Salt Creek; thence by the centre line of the said creek to the sea-coast north of Point Roadknight; thence southerly and westerly by the sea-coast to the commencing point.

**THE EAST RIDING.**—Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Barwon due north of the north-east angle of the parish of Carrung-e-murnong, in the county of Grant; thence westerly and southerly by the centre line of the said river to Hopkins Creek; thence south-easterly by the centre line of the said creek, and by a line to a point in the centre of Salt Creek, due south of the south-west angle of the parish of Jan-juc; thence north by the western boundary lines of the parishes of Jan-juc and Parapara to the north-east angle of the parish of Cherang-gherang; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the last-named parish to the east boundary of the parish of Lake Lake Wollard; thence northward along the east boundary lines of the parishes of Lake Lake Wollard and Carrung-e-murnong to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## MORDIALLOC AND SOUTH MOORABBIN CEMETERY.

### RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE MORDIALLOC AND SOUTH MOORABBIN GENERAL CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. By the 8th section of the Act, "Any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and his or their representatives, for ever."

3. Application for such permission to be made to the trustees at the cemetery. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule marked B, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule A.

4. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of any two of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relatives and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.

5. Orders for interment to be given either to the sexton, or at the office of the trustees, on the previous day, that six working hours' notice, from Seven a.m. to Six p.m. be given of each interment, or in default thereof an extra fee be charged of Five shillings, and Seven shillings and sixpence, for a public or private grave respectively, except when the necessity of immediate interment shall be certified by a legally qualified medical practitioner.

6. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to con-

struct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto, must be left with the order.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive; and from Ten a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months, except on Sundays, when the usual and only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five o'clock, p.m., throughout the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave-stones, to be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, or covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the eighth section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

11. The plans of all fences to be submitted to the trustees. All wooden fencing must be after a mode to be seen on application.

12. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

13. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

14. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule.

15. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against, as directed by the 14th section of the Act of Council.

13. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

Persons tendering are requested to state whether they propose to convey the mails on horseback or in a carriage; in the latter case, they are to state the description of vehicle they intend to use and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

It is particularly requested that the tenders for each service may be written on separate forms, and that the number of the service may be plainly endorsed on the outside of the cover.

The general conditions referred to in the printed form of tender, and upon which the tender is to be made, can be inspected by persons proposing to tender, either at the General Post Office or at any Post Office in the colony.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.
