THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE SHIRE OF CORIO.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the thirty-first day of October, 1864.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time after the first annual election or general election as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions; hereinafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding an election of members of the district board in or for such district; and it is also enacted that every shire shall after the Proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and have been such and the same district as such shire was at the time of such Proclamation, and save as aforesaid and save where herein otherwise expressly provided all the provisions of the said Act relating to districts shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such shire and be read accordingly: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the thirteenth day of June, in the present year, the shire of Corio was constituted: And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by more than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said shire, praying for the division of the said shire into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the shire of Corio into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE LARA RIDING.—Commencing at a point in the centre of Sutherland's Creek, opposite the south-west angle of portion 37, parish of Youang; thence north-westerly by the centre of Sutherland's Creek to the south boundary of the parish of Anakie, at the south-west angle of Griffin's pre-emptive right; thence east to the south-east angle of the said parish; thence due north to the centre of the Little River opposite the north-east angle of portion 108, parish of Anakie; thence westerly by the centre of the Little River to a point opposite the west boundary of a road forming the western boundary of portions 123, 124, and 115, parish of Balliang; thence north by the west boundary of said road and a direct line to a point due west of the north-west angle of portion 103 of the last-named parish; thence due east to and by the north boundary of the parish of Balliang to the centre of the Balliang Creek; thence south-easterly by the centre of the said creek to its intersection with the centre of the Little River; thence westerly by the centre of the Little River to the north-west angle of portion 17, in the parish of Wardi Youang; thence due south by the east boundary of the parish of Lara to the south-east angle of portion 60, in the last-named parish; thence west by the south boundary of said portion 60 to the centre of the Duck Ponds; thence southerly by the centre of the Duck Ponds to a point opposite the south-west angle of portion B, parish of Woornyalook; thence due west by the south boundary of portion B, parish of Moranghurk, to a point opposite the north-east angle of portion 174 of the parish last named; thence due south to the south-east angle of portion 150, parish of Moranghurk; thence west by the south boundary of same portion to a point opposite the north-east angle of portion 127, parish of Moranghurk; thence south to the south-east angle of portion 126, in the same parish; thence west to the east boundary of the parish of Youang; thence north by the east boundary of same parish to the south-east angle of portion 21, parish of Youang; thence by a line due west to the centre of Sutherland's Creek; thence by the centre of Sutherland's Creek to the commencing point.

THE PEAK RIDING.—Commencing at the south-east angle of portion of 126, parish of Moranghurk; thence north to the south boundary of portion 150, in the same parish; thence east to the south-east angle of portion 150 in the above parish; thence north by the south boundary of portion B in the same parish; thence east to the centre of the Duck Ponds; thence northerly by the centre of the Duck Ponds to a point on the southern boundary of portion 60, parish of Lara; thence east

to its east boundary; thence north to the centre of the Little River; thence easterly by the centre of the Little River to the intersection of the centre of Balliang Creek; thence southerly and easterly by the centre of the Little River to its mouth; thence by a line south and the sea-coast south-westerly to the mouth of Limeburner's Bay; thence by the east shore of the said bay to the south boundary of portion B, parish of Woor-nyalok; thence by a line west to the commencing point.

THE MOORPANYAL RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of the Moorabool River with the River Barwon; thence by the centre of the River Moorabool to the intersection of the centre of Sutherland's Creek; thence northerly by the centre of Sutherland's Creek to the south-west angle of portion 37, parish of Youang; thence east to the south-east angle of portion 21 of the same parish; thence south to a point opposite the north-west angle of portion 106, parish of Moranghurk; thence east to Limeburner's Bay; thence southerly by the coast line to a point opposite the south-east angle of portion 58, parish of Moorpanyal; thence southerly and westerly by the southern boundaries of the parish Moorpanyal to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

DISTRICT FOR BEER LICENSES.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirit Sale Statute*, 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that a beer license shall authorise the licensee to sell and dispose of, not earlier than Six o'clock in the morning nor later than Eight o'clock in the evening, any ale or beer to be drunk in the house or on the premises described in such license, except in the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or in any borough, and if the premises described in such license be subsequently to the granting of such license brought within any borough, such license shall expire at the end of the then current year; provided that upon the application by the council of any borough the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare the whole or any part of such borough a district wherein beer licenses may be granted, and may on a like application revoke any such proclamation: And whereas the council of the borough of Buninyong has made application that the whole of the said borough may be declared a district under the proviso of the Act above recited: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare the whole of the borough of Buninyong to be a district wherein Beer Licenses may be granted.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

'STANLEY' ROAD DISTRICT.

BYE-LAW OF THE DISTRICT ROAD BOARD, MADE TO REGULATE THE CONDUCT AND PROCEEDINGS THEREOF.

THE business of the board shall be conducted with open doors.

2. The ordinary meetings of the board shall be held on the first Friday in each month, at Eleven o'clock a.m., or as soon thereafter as a quorum of three shall be present; but should there be no quorum present within one hour from the time appointed for such meeting, then such meeting shall stand adjourned as required by clause 133 of the Act numbered 176, 27th Victoria. A minute to be taken to that effect by the clerk and entered on the minute book.

3. Special meetings shall be summoned by the clerk upon his receiving a written requisition, signed by three members, stating the subject matter to be brought forward at such meeting, notice whereof shall be given to each of the members not less than four (4) nor more than seven (7) clear days before such meeting.

4. The order of business at ordinary meetings shall be as follows:—1. Reading and confirming minutes. 2. Reading copies of letters sent. 3. Reading letters received. 4. Reception of and reading petitions. 5. Reports of committees (if any) and reports of officers of the board. 6. Orders of the day. 7. Motions of which previous notice shall have been given. 8. Passing accounts. 9. Giving notices of motion.

5. The minutes of a previous meeting, when confirmed, shall be signed by the chairman, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy.

6. All petitions addressed to the board must be presented by a member thereof, who shall be responsible for its being in proper form and respectfully worded.

7. Orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business the chairman think fit to bring forward.

8. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member giving notice, or some other member authorised by him in writing, be present to proceed with the same when called upon. Notices not proceeded with shall be struck off the notice paper.

9. No resolution passed at any meeting of the board shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless in accordance with clause 136 of *The Local Government Act, 1863*.

10. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand while addressing the board.

11. In all matters of order or practice the chairman's ruling shall be final, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

12. Every motion or amendment shall be entered on the minutes with the name of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded.

13. One amendment only shall be discussed at a time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

14. All questions shall be decided by open voting.

15. Any member having a notice or amendment to propose, shall address the chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall be silent, until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the chair shall be allowed to proceed.

16. The mover of any motion or amendment and the seconder thereof shall be held to have spoken when moving or seconding such motion or amendment; and no member shall be allowed to speak twice on the subject under discussion, except by way of explanation; the original mover of a motion or amendment shall have the right of reply, after which the motion or amendment, as the case may be, shall be put to the vote.

17. If two or more members rise at the same time, the chairman shall decide which of them are entitled to priority.

18. Any member of the board may demand the production of documents relating to the matter under discussion.

19. Any member may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, and the protest shall be entered in the minute book, and the member or members so protesting shall sign the same.

20. Any member may require the clerk to take down the particular words used by a member immediately on the same being used.

21. Any member using any offensive expression towards another member, shall, if required by the board, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology; and any member refusing to make such apology, shall pay a fine of One pound for every such offence.

22. All contracts shall be made by tender, of which five days' notice at the least shall be given in some newspaper circulating in the district. Tenders to be endorsed, and addressed to the chairman, and be only opened at the time of their consideration, and shall be accompanied with a preliminary deposit according to the following scale:—If under Forty pounds, a deposit of Two pounds; and all above that amount a deposit of Five per cent.; and in the event of the successful tenderer declining to take up the contract, the preliminary shall be forfeited to the board. The deposits on unaccepted tenders to be returned after such tenders have been finally disposed of. The security in all cases of contract shall be Ten per cent. on the amount specified in the tender (or two sureties to the satisfaction of the board), and shall be paid over by the contractor to the treasurer, and the moneys so paid shall be lodged in the bank with the other moneys of the board; and shall not be repaid to the contractor until he has obtained his certificate from the engineer of the board that the works have been satisfactorily performed.

23. Any petition, application, or motion presented or made to the board, involving the expenditure of any moneys exceeding the sum of Ten pounds, shall not be considered by the board until its next meeting (unless in case of emergency); and no officer or member of the board shall incur any expenditure

on any works or any road exceeding the aforesaid sum, without having first obtained the sanction of the board for such expenditure.

24. All payments shall be made by cheque if over One pound, signed by the chairman and one other member of the board, and countersigned by the treasurer.

25. All officers of the board shall enter into a bond for the faithful performance of their several duties, and shall find such security as the board shall from time to time require.

26. In the collection of rates due to the board it shall be sufficient for the collector to call once, and if such rates are not then paid to him, a notice in writing or in print, or partly in writing and partly in print, duly signed by such collector, shall be left, stating that if the same be not paid at the office of the board within fourteen days from the date of giving such notice, legal proceedings may be taken for the recovery of the same.

27. The collector shall, not less than once in seven days, pay over to the treasurer, or to the bank appointed by the board for that purpose (and if to the bank shall immediately forward to the treasurer a duplicate pay-slip of such payments of), all moneys belonging to the board that may have come into his possession, and shall obtain a receipt for such moneys, which shall be a sufficient discharge; and every such collector shall, at each monthly meeting of the board, deliver to them true and perfect accounts, in writing under his hand, of all moneys received by him, and of all moneys paid by him to the said treasurer or bank; and shall, at any other time or times as shall be required of him by the board, furnish to them full and perfect reports, in writing under his hand, of any matter or thing pertaining to the duties of his office; and every such collector shall have power to sue in the name of the board before any justice for the recovery of any rates or other moneys to be collected by him due to the board.
