GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS.

I.—DISTRIBUTION OF PUBLIC MONEY.

No school shall receive aid from the Board of Education—

1. Unless it shall be under the management of a Local Committee of not less than five persons, either appointed before the 1st September, 1862, or if at a subsequent period, who shall have been approved of or appointed by the Board.

2. Unless it shall be kept open on each school day for at least four hours, two of which in the forenoon, and two in the afternoon, shall be consecutive and devoted to secular instruction alone.

3. Unless the head teacher shall have received a certificate of qualification from the Board, or temporary permission to act.

4. Unless it be attended by a sufficient number of scholars, according to the terms of the *Common Schools Act*.

5. Unless the other requirements of that Act be satisfied.

6. Unless the following conditions be complied with :—

(a.) That it shall at all times be open to inspection by the Board, or by any member thereof, or by any of its authorized officers.

(b.) That such records be kept, and such returns made, as the Board may deem necessary.

(c.) That in the case of new buildings the school-room contain not less than eight square feet for each child in average attendance, and that the walls be not less than ten feet in height to the eaves; that in all cases the school-room be sufficiently warmed, ventilated, and drained; that there be proper and separate offices for both sexes; that there be a play-ground attached, or other satisfactory provision made for physical exercise; and that the school be properly provided with the amount of school furniture and apparatus, books, maps, &c., necessary for the efficient conduct of such school.

(d.) That it be subject to all general regulations of the Board, and to such directions as may be necessary for carrying them into effect.

7. Upon the report of the Inspector, that the above regulations and conditions have been complied with, Common Schools will be qualified to receive aid, but not in any case to an amount exceeding £2 for every £1 raised by fees and local contributions.

8. No aid will be granted towards the building or repairing of schools, unless the site shall have been vested for educational purposes in the Board.

9. The Board reserve to themselves the right to judge of the expediency of establishing or maintaining schools subject to the provisions of the *Common Schools Act*; and all grants must depend upon the funds placed at the disposal of the Board.

ALLOWANCES TO SCHOOLS.

10. Masters and mistresses of schools in connection with the Board will receive fixed salaries of £100 and £80 respectively, if classified by the Board in the First Division of Competency, or equivalent; and of £75 and £60 respectively, if classified in the Second Division of Competency, or equivalent. Payment of these allowances will be made to the teachers monthly.

11. Masters and mistresses classified in the First and Second Classes of Honors, or equivalent, will be qualified to receive the following augmentations upon their fixed salaries :—

First Class Honors	Masters, £60; Mistresses, £40.
Second Class Honors	Masters, £30; Mistresses, £20.

12. These augmentations, however, will be paid upon the following scale :—

Where the average attendance is 40 and above,	10 per cent.
Where the average attendance is 50 and above,	20 per cent.

And so on increasing 10 per cent. for every ten scholars in average attendance.

13. Assistants, when employed, will be paid at the minimum rates of salary for masters and mistresses, but no augmentation will be allowed.

14. An assistant will be allowed for every fifty in average attendance.

15. A workmistress will be allowed in schools having an average attendance of from thirty-six to fifty, where the head teacher is not a female, and will be paid at the rate of £30 per annum.

16. In addition to the above payments, the following allowances will be made to schools at the end of each half-year, ending on 30th June and 31st December respectively :—

(a.) For every scholar who has attended 100 meetings of the school, if situated in a municipality, or 90 meetings if not so situated—

1. If above seven years of age, 8s., subject to passing an examination in reading, writing, and arithmetic, as in Appendix E.; and on their passing the above examination, 4s., if they pass the additional examinations in grammar and geography under the same standard, viz., 2s. for each.

2. If under seven years of age, 5s., subject to reduction or forfeiture on a report from the Inspector that such children are not instructed suitably to their age.

(b.) For every evening scholar who has attended sixty evening meetings of the school, 10s., subject to passing an examination in reading, writing, and arithmetic, as in Appendix E.; and for those who have passed this examination, 5s., on their passing the additional examinations in geography and grammar under the same standards, viz., 2s. 6d. for each.

17. Attendance, morning or afternoon, cannot be reckoned for any scholar who is not present at the calling of the roll; nor attendance in the evening for any scholar who has been under instruction less than one hour and a half: the time of calling the roll to be inserted in the Time Table.

18. Evening attendances may not be reckoned with morning or afternoon attendances in making up the prescribed minimum of 100 or 90 attendances.

19. Evening attendance may not be reckoned for any scholar under *twelve years of age*.

20. For every scholar who has attended at least 100 or 90 times respectively in the morning or afternoon, for whom 8s. is claimed, there shall be forfeited 2s. 8d. for failure in reading, 2s. 8d. in writing, and 2s. 8d. in arithmetic.

21. For every scholar who has attended at least 60 times in the evening, for whom 10s. is claimed, there shall be forfeited 3s. 4d. for failure in reading, 3s. 4d. in writing, and 3s. 4d. in arithmetic.

22. For any child who has attended at more than one school in connection with the Board, during the half year, the attendances at the former school may be counted in making up the 100 or 90 attendances, respectively; but, a certificate shewing the number of such attendances, and the standard attained, signed by the teacher and correspondent of the Local Committee of the former school, must be produced to the Inspector previous to examination under standards.

23. Every scholar for whom the grants dependent upon examination are claimed may be examined for the same standard at two successive half-yearly examinations, after which he must be presented for examination in a higher standard; but no scholar who has passed his examination for the first six months need be presented for examination in the following six months, unless for a higher standard, to entitle to the allowance in respect of such scholar.

24. For every scholar who has attended 90 or 100 times respectively, in the morning or afternoon, and who shall have passed according to the highest standard, an allowance of 4s. will be made.

25. After one month's notice the grant may be reduced or withdrawn upon the Inspector's report for faults of instruction or discipline on the part of the teacher, or for failure on the part of the Local Committee to remedy any such defect in the school premises as seriously interferes with the efficiency of the school, or to provide proper furniture, books, maps, and other apparatus of elementary instruction.

26. Any Local Committee objecting to the Inspector's classification of the scholars according to the various standards in Appendix E., or to his report upon the building, instruction, or discipline, may appeal to the Board of Education, and every such appeal must be made within twenty-one days from the receipt by the Local Committee of notice of such classification or of a copy of such report, as the case may be, and must state fully the reasons for the same.

27. No grant will be made in respect of any teacher or teachers who shall at any time knowingly and wilfully present for examination, or make any claim on behalf of any scholar who shall be by these rules disqualified from such presentation or claim; or who shall make a false entry respecting such child, knowing the same to be false, or not knowing the same through gross negligence; and such disability shall continue for a period of five years from the date of the discovery of such false entry.

TRAINING SCHOOLS.

28. Upon being satisfied that sufficient provision has been made by the Local Committees for the lodging, boarding, teaching, and moral discipline of teachers in training, the Board may, on application by them, declare certain schools in Melbourne or its neighbourhood, Training Schools.

29. Each such school shall be licensed to receive a certain number of male or female teachers in training, or both male and female, the number of each to be limited by the Board.

30. The Local Committee of each such school shall be entitled to receive annually a sum not exceeding £200 in aid of the salary of the superintendent of male teachers in training, and not exceeding £150 in aid of the salary of the superintendent of female teachers in training; and also for each male teacher in training who shall have successfully passed the examinations and stood the tests hereafter mentioned, payment at a rate not exceeding £45 per annum, and for each female not exceeding £40 per annum; and a further sum of £10 for each such teacher in training, who shall receive a teacher's certificate.

31. Any male person of the age of 18 years, desirous of becoming a teacher in training, who shall forward to the Board a certificate of moral conduct, as in Rule 59, and a certificate of sound health signed by a licensed medical practitioner, and who shall pass the entrance examination in Appendix I., before an officer appointed by the Board, shall, upon obtaining a certificate to that effect, be qualified to become a teacher in training; and each such person on becoming a teacher in training shall contribute annually a sum not exceeding £25 towards the expenses of his maintenance—the amount to be fixed by the Local Committee.

32. Females of the age of 17 years, desirous of becoming teachers in training, shall become qualified on the same terms, and on becoming teachers in training shall contribute annually a sum not exceeding £20 towards their maintenance.

33. Pupil teachers having completed their course, or Monitors under the late National Board, upon passing for the highest class of pupil teachers, will be admissible for examination to become teachers in training at 17 years of age for males, and 16 for females, and the Board will pay for them their annual contributions towards their maintenance.

34. During each half-year examinations will be held of all teachers in training, and any teacher in training who is found not to have made sufficient progress will forfeit all claim to further support from the public funds.

35. Any teacher in training may present himself for examination for a teacher's certificate at any such examination, and shall, if found qualified, receive such certificate.

36. Any teacher in training who shall fail to present himself for four successive examinations after his entrance, or who so presenting himself shall fail to entitle himself to a certificate, shall forfeit all claim to further support from the public funds. These three rules apply equally to female teachers in training.

37. Teachers at present in training at any school supported by the late Denominational Board, will not be required to undergo any examination on entrance.

38. The details of the examinations will be found in Appendix I.

39. The boarding establishments in connection with Training Schools shall be under the supervision of the Senior Inspector, who shall report specially upon them to the Board not less than once in every six months.

AID TO NEW SCHOOLS.

40. Attention is directed to section X. of the Common Schools Act, as follows:—

“No new school not being an infant school shall receive aid from the consolidated revenue which shall be established within two miles of a school already receiving aid from the consolidated revenue unless there shall be such a number of pupils not being pupils of the first school whose parents shall undertake in writing that they shall attend the proposed school as with the average number of pupils in attendance for six months at the school already receiving aid shall amount to two hundred unless some natural obstacle shall intervene between the two schools which shall prevent the attendance of the pupils at such other school or unless one of the two schools shall be for boys alone and the other for girls alone. Provided that no school shall be an infant school within the meaning of this clause unless all the pupils be under the age of eight years.”

41. Subject to the provisions of the above section, aid may be granted on the following terms:—

1. SCHOOLS VESTED IN THE BOARD.

(a) BUILDINGS.

42. Before any grant is made towards building a School-house, the Board are to be satisfied that a necessity exists for such a school, that an eligible site has been granted by the Crown, or (if otherwise procured) that a satisfactory conveyance will be executed to the Board, and that the applicants are prepared to raise by private contribution at least one-half of the whole sum which the Board deem necessary for the erection of the house, providing necessary furniture, &c., such furniture to be the property of the Board for the purposes of the school.

43. The Board will determine from the information afforded, the dimensions of the proposed building.

44. The Board will not contribute to the ornamenting of school-houses, but merely to such expenditure as may be necessary for having the children accommodated in plain substantial buildings. If buildings of another description be preferred, the whole of the extra expense must be provided by the applicants,

45. The plans, estimates, and specifications must be satisfactory to the Board ; when approved and sealed they may be returned to the promoters of the school for use, but must be lodged in the Education Office before a grant is paid.

46. The private contributions must be paid to the credit of the Board of Education at the Bank of Victoria, Melbourne.

47. Instalments at a rate not exceeding £75 per cent. on the value of the works executed will be paid on the certificate of the committee and architect.

48. The Board will require that within one month after the notification of a grant shall have been made, the Local Committee shall state definitely whether the grant is accepted or not ; that within six months after the notification of the grant, the whole of the local subscriptions, or such portion as the Board shall deem sufficient for the purpose, shall have been paid in ; and that within nine months after the notification of the grant, building operations shall have been actually commenced. In the event of failure in carrying out any of these conditions the grant will lapse.

(b) REPAIRS.

49. Before any grant is made towards repairing a school-house, the Board are to be satisfied that such repairs are necessary, and that at least one-half of the whole sum will be locally contributed.

50. The provisions of Rules 45, 46, 47, and 48, relative to buildings, will apply to grants for repairs.

2. SCHOOLS NOT VESTED IN THE BOARD.

51. The Board will entertain applications for aid to new schools, not proposed to be vested in the Board ; but this aid can only be granted under the rules for the allowances to schools.

52. Forms of application (See Appendix F.) may be obtained on application to the Secretary.

II.—INSPECTION OF SCHOOLS.

54. For the purposes of inspection, the colony will be divided into districts.

55. In each district there shall be an Inspector, whose duty it shall be to visit periodically each school in his district, and to report to the Board as to the results of the examination of the children under standards as in Appendix E., and also as to the observance of the regulations and conditions of the Board, and more particularly under the heads set forth in Appendix H. It will also be the duty of the Inspector to report upon all applications for aid to new schools according to the forms in Appendix F., and generally to carry out the instructions of the Board.

III.—EXAMINATION AND CLASSIFICATION OF TEACHERS.

56. The appointment and dismissal of all teachers in schools receiving aid from the Board rest with the Local Committees, but each teacher appointed must have his qualifications, both as to character and general fitness, approved by the Board, and the dismissal of any teacher must be sanctioned by the same.

57. Certificates of qualification will be divided into four classes, and will be granted upon examination by officers appointed by the Board, the details as to which will be found in Appendix D. But all teachers who have been classified under the late National or Denominational Board will be entitled, without examination, to a classification equal to that enjoyed by them under either of those Boards, and a certificate in accordance with this rule will be granted by the Board of Education ; and teachers who have held schools under either of the late Boards for three consecutive years immediately preceding the 1st October, 1857, will be entitled, without examination, to a special certificate, upon obtaining a report from an Inspector that their schools are well conducted ; and teachers holding certificates of merit from Her Majesty's Inspectors of Schools in Great Britain and Ireland, who have actually received a recognition by either of the late Boards, will receive a similar recognition by the Board of Education, and will, without examination, be entitled to a certificate accordingly.

58. The value of the certificates issued by the Board relative to those of the late National and Denominational Boards will be seen in the following table:—

Board of Education.	Denominational School Board.	National School Board.
Second division of competency	Second division of competency	Probationers.
First division of competency	First division of competency	First and second divisions of third class.
Second class honors ...	Third and fourth honors ...	First and second divisions of second class.
First class honors ...	First and second honors ...	First, second, and third divisions of first class.

59. Examinations will be held periodically at Melbourne, and such other central places as the Board may appoint (due notice of which will be given), when all candidates who present themselves for examination, and who produce a certificate of moral character from a clergyman registered under the Marriage Act, Chairman of a Local Committee, or Justice of the Peace, will be entitled to be examined for a certificate of competency. Candidates must bear their own travelling expenses.

60. The Board will not recognise the appointment of teachers (other than sewing mistresses) unless written agreements be entered into between such teachers and their respective Local Committees. Teachers in such agreements must engage to conform to all regulations which are, or may be, from time to time prescribed, either by the Board of Education or by their Local Committees (provided that the regulations of these latter be not in contravention of those of the Board), and must agree not to resign without giving a month's notice. Duplicates of such agreements must be deposited in the office of the Board within one month of their being entered into, or the Board will not recognise any claim for school payments for the period suffered to elapse. Local Committees shall notify to the Board their intention of dismissing any teacher one month previous to actual dismissal, and shall also notify the same to the teacher; but they may, in extreme cases, suspend him from the performance of his duties during that period.

61. The Board will regard the taking part in elections for members of the Legislature, except by voting, as incompatible with the performance of the duties of teachers of common schools.

62. Pupil teachers may be appointed in schools by the Local Committees. The details affecting their appointment, examination, and classification, will be found in Appendix B.

63. The different Appendices, containing subjects of examination, will be subject to periodical revision, of which due notice will be given.

64. No teacher shall receive a certificate of the first division of head teacher unless he has been employed in a school for at least two years.

IV.—COURSE OF SECULAR INSTRUCTION.

65. The course of instruction laid down in Appendix C. shall be followed in all schools receiving aid from the Board; but the Local Committees may encourage the introduction of singing, drawing, and other branches of instruction, under the sanction of the Board.

V.—SCHOOL FEES.

66. The rate of school fees will be regulated by the Local Committees, but is not to exceed *ten shillings a month, or two shillings and sixpence a week*, unless with the special sanction of the Board, nor is it to be less than *three shillings a month or ninepence a week* for any single scholar. When more than one attend from the same family, the fee for each may be reduced to *sixpence*. In Infant schools the fee may be reduced at the discretion of the Local Committee to *sixpence* per week. No child unless under eight years of age can be regarded as an infant.

67. Any Local Committee desirous of having singing or drawing taught in their school, may, with the sanction of the Board, charge a fee not exceeding *one penny* per week for singing, and *one penny* per week for drawing, to be paid to the teacher imparting such instruction (who must be approved of by the Board) by every child above seven years old attending such school, in addition to the ordinary school fee, and the Board will supplement such payment with an equal amount.

68. School fees should, in every case, be paid in advance, and amounts not paid at the end of the half-year will not be taken into account in considering the amount which should be raised locally (Rule 7).

69. In the case of Orphans, Deserted Children, and of those whose parents are unable to pay the prescribed fees, a minimum fee will be paid by the Board. But in every such case a certificate must be furnished to the Local Committee, signed by a Justice of the Peace or Registered Clergyman, in form of A. or B., Appendix K., and a copy thereof forwarded to the Board, and the Board will require to be satisfied that such case really exists. Every such certificate must be renewed half-yearly.

VI.—MISCELLANEOUS.

LOCAL COMMITTEES.

70. The Board will receive nominations of members for Local Committees for approval or appointment.

71. The approval or appointment of Local Committees of Common Schools rests with the Board, who have the power, with the consent of the Governor in Council, of removing such Committees.

72. One month's notice of the intention of the Board to appoint or remove Local Committees or members thereof will be given in the *Government Gazette*, and all appointments of Local Committees or of members thereof will also be notified in the *Government Gazette*.

73. A Local Committee must consist of not less than five members, of whom the Correspondent must be one.

74. The Correspondent is the organ of the Local Committee, and must be appointed by them. He has not the power of taking independent action in any matter connected with the school, but must communicate with the Board in the name and on behalf of the Committee.

75. The duties of the Local Committees will be:—

- (a.) To appoint the necessary number of teachers, enter into agreements with them, and remove them when requisite, subject to the provisions of the Act and of these regulations.
- (b.) To recommend to the Board the proportion in which the allowances made by them to schools shall be distributed between the head teacher and his assistants, if any.
- (c.) To regulate, subject to the rules above laid down, the rate of school fees for children attending their school, to make arrangements for their collection, and to decide what proportion of them should be paid to the head teacher and assistants respectively in such school, and what proportion should be applied to other school purposes; such scheme of distribution to be approved by the Board.
- (d.) To keep full and correct accounts of the total receipts and expenditure of their school, to be produced when required by an Inspector of the Board.
- (e.) To visit the school at short intervals, and record upon the school rolls the results of their visits, together with the number of children found present at the time of visiting.
- (f.) To hold periodical examinations of the children, and make returns of children of destitute parents, orphans, &c., after having satisfied themselves that such children are fit objects of bounty.

EVENING SCHOOLS.

76. Evening schools will be subject to the regulations affecting day schools, so far as they are applicable. They must be under the same Local Committees, if in connection with day schools, and will be subject to inspection.

77. The allowances to evening schools are set forth under the head of "Allowances to Schools."

SCHOOL-HOUSES.

78. Every school receiving aid from the Board must have the words "Common School" placed conspicuously on the exterior of the building.

79. The Board will not permit schools vested in them to be used as places of public worship, nor will they allow any common school to be used for political purposes.

SCHOOL BOOKS AND REQUISITES.

80. The Board will provide such books and school requisites as they may deem necessary or fit for the use of common schools, and these will be furnished at as low a rate as possible to Local Committees and teachers. Local Committees may require the scholars to pay for them, but not at prices higher than those charged by the Board, plus the cost of carriage.

81. The Board will publish from time to time a list of the books in stock, for the information of Local Committees and teachers.

HOLIDAYS IN COMMON SCHOOLS.

82. The following shall be the holidays observed in common schools:—

- (1.) All Saturdays and Sundays.
- (2.) The Government holidays as set forth in the Civil Service Act.*
- (3.) All such special holidays as may be proclaimed in the *Government Gazette*.
- (4.) Such other holidays as shall be determined by the Local Committees, but which must not, taken with the holidays mentioned in (2) and (3), exceed thirty days in one year.

83. No part of the four hours for secular instruction required by the 11th section of the Common Schools Act, shall be set apart before Nine o'clock in the morning, nor after Four o'clock in the afternoon.

84. These Rules and Regulations shall commence and take effect on and after the First day of March, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four.

* The following are the holidays specified:—New Year's Day, Christmas Day, Good Friday and the three following days, Whit-Monday, the Anniversaries of the Birthday of Her Majesty, of the day of the Separation of Port Phillip from New South Wales, and of the day of the Proclamation of the Constitution Statute.

APPENDIX A.

No. CXLIX.

An Act for the better Maintenance and Establishment of Common Schools in Victoria.

[18th June, 1862.]

- Preamble.** WHEREAS there are now existing in the Colony of Victoria two Boards for the regulation of public education And whereas it is expedient to provide for the better maintenance establishment and management of common schools under a uniform system Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows—
- Repeal of 15. Vic. No. 7.** I. From and after the commencement of this Act an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of this colony made and passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled "*An Act to incorporate the Board of Commissioners for National Education*" shall be and the same is hereby repealed Provided always that all the real and personal estate and property whatsoever now vested in the Board constituted by that Act for the purposes of such Act shall vest in the Board hereinafter created.
- Denominational School Board dissolved.** II. From and after the commencement of this Act all powers vested in a certain Board appointed by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty-eight for the temporal regulation and inspection of the respective Denominational Schools of the colony within the district of Port Phillip and known as the Denominational School Board shall cease and determine and the said Board shall be and the same is hereby dissolved.
- All lands &c. held for educational purposes to continue vested in trustees.** III. All lands and school buildings which immediately before the commencement of this Act shall be held by trustees under grant from the Crown and used for educational purposes under the temporal regulation and inspection of the said Denominational School Board shall subject to the trusts on which the same were granted and to the proviso hereinafter contained remain vested in the said trustees after the dissolution of the said Board Provided always that a majority of the trustees of any such school may with the consent of the religious denomination with which the school is connected to be given in writing through the head or authorized representative of that denomination and with the consent of the Governor in Council either transfer the school and land held by the trustees to the Board hereinafter created or sell such lands or buildings and apply the proceeds to educational purposes of the same character connected with such denomination.
- Personal property of Denominational School Board to be transferred to Board of Education. Board incorporated.** IV. All personal property whatever belonging to the Denominational School Board shall immediately on the dissolution of the said Board be transferred to and vested in the Board hereinafter created.
- Governor to fill vacancies. May remove members.** V. The Governor in Council shall appoint five laymen as Commissioners who shall be a body politic and corporate by the style and title of "The Board of Education" and by that style and title shall have perpetual succession be able and capable to sue and be sued in all courts of law and equity shall have and use as occasion may require a common seal shall and may accept purchase and hold to them and their successors as members of the said corporation to and for the uses thereof real and personal estate and property of every kind and the Governor in Council shall fill up any vacancy in such Board of Education as shall occur by the death or resignation or disqualification of any of the members and shall have power to remove any member or members of such Board and to appoint another or others in his or their stead Provided that no person so appointed shall continue to act as a member of the said Board for a longer period than five years unless reappointed by the Governor in Council Provided also that any member of the Board absenting himself from more than four consecutive duly convened meetings of the Board without the leave of the Board shall *ipso facto* be disqualified from acting as a member thereof Provided also that three of the said Commissioners shall form a quorum at any meeting of the said Board Provided always that no two members of such Board shall belong to one and the same religious denomination.
- Quorum of Board. No two members to be of the same denomination.**
- Duties of Board. Board to frame regulations and apportion moneys.** VI. The duties of the Board of Education shall be—
1. To frame general regulations for the distribution of all moneys granted by the Legislature and subject to the provisions of this Act to determine as they shall see fit upon the localities in which schools receiving aid from the consolidated revenue shall be established or maintained.
 2. To frame general regulations for the inspection of schools and the examination and classification of teachers to determine upon the course of secular instruction to be adopted in the schools to fix and from time to time to alter as the Board may think fit the fees to be charged to parents of children attending the schools and generally to do everything that may be necessary for carrying into effect this Act according to the true intent thereof.
 3. To recommend to the Governor in Council for appointment or removal of such officers as shall be deemed requisite for the proper carrying out of the regulations framed by them.
 4. To see that the moneys apportioned from the grant made from the consolidated revenue for the purpose of public education be applied to the objects for which they were granted.
- Governor in Council to appoint Inspector-General.** VII. The Governor in Council shall appoint a fit person to be Inspector-General of Schools whose duty it shall be to carry into effect the rules and directions of the said Board and the Governor in Council may from time to time remove such person from that office and so often as such person shall die resign or be removed shall appoint another fit person in his stead.
- Regulations if approved by Governor in Council to be published and laid before Parliament.** VIII. All general regulations which shall be framed by the Board of Education shall be laid before the Governor in Council and if approved by him shall be published in the *Government Gazette* after which they shall have the force of law and shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament within one month if Parliament be then sitting and if Parliament be not then sitting then within one month after the commencement of the next ensuing session thereof.

IX. No school unless for the deaf and dumb and blind shall receive aid from the consolidated revenue unless there shall have been during the preceding six months in such school an average daily attendance of not less than twenty pupils. School receiving aid must have at least twenty pupils.

X. No new school not being an infant school shall receive aid from the consolidated revenue which shall be established within two miles of a school already receiving aid from the consolidated revenue unless there shall be such a number of pupils not being pupils of the first school whose parents shall undertake in writing that they shall attend the proposed school as with the average number of pupils in attendance for six months at the school already receiving aid shall amount to two hundred unless some natural obstacle shall intervene between the two schools which shall prevent the attendance of the pupils at such other school or unless one of the two schools shall be for boys alone and the other for girls alone. Provided that no school shall be an infant school within the meaning of this clause unless all the pupils be under the age of eight years. Establishment of new schools regulated.

XI. In every school receiving aid from the consolidated revenue four hours shall be set apart during each school day for secular instruction alone and of such four hours two shall be before noon two after noon and shall in each case be consecutive. Four hours' secular instruction daily.

XII. No applicant shall be refused admission to any school receiving aid from the consolidated revenue on account of the religious persuasion of such applicant. No religious test.

XIII. Children whose parents or guardians are in destitute circumstances and unable to pay the ordinary school fees shall be entitled to admission into any common school receiving aid from the consolidated revenue under such regulations and on such conditions as the Board may think fit. Destitute children entitled to gratuitous education.

XIV. No school shall receive aid from the consolidated revenue unless it be under the management of a local committee of not less than five persons who shall be approved of by the Board of Education and whose names shall be published in the *Government Gazette* and also in some local newspaper if any. Provided that no teacher shall be appointed to or dismissed from such school whose qualifications shall not be approved of or dismissal sanctioned by the Board of Education. Appointment of teachers.

XV. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Act all teachers who have been classified under either of the Boards hitherto in existence and known as the National and Denominational School Boards shall be entitled without examination to a classification equal to that enjoyed by them under either of the aforesaid Boards. Classification of present teachers.

XVI. Notice of all applications for aid to new schools shall be published in the *Government Gazette* for one month previous to such aid being granted. Aid to new schools.

XVII. No grant from the consolidated revenue shall be made in aid of buildings or repairing school premises unless the site of such premises shall have been vested for educational purposes in the Board of Education. Aid to buildings.

XVIII. It shall be lawful for the Board of Education from time to time to appoint and remove local committees and to establish schools in such localities as the Board shall deem fit subject to the provisions of this Act. Provided that no local committee shall be removed without the consent of the Governor in Council. Provided also that where a local committee shall have been appointed for any school previously to the commencement of this Act the same committee shall until removed in manner aforesaid continue and be the committee of the said school under this Act. Provided further that one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette* of the intention of the Board to appoint or to remove any local committee. Board may appoint local committees.

XIX. It shall be lawful for the Board of Education to sell or otherwise dispose of all school property which shall be or become vested in them and to re-invest the proceeds of such sale or disposal in the purchase of land or in the erection of buildings for educational purposes under the provisions of this Act. Board may dispose of school property vested in them.

XX. After the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two no school whose average attendance shall for a period of six months be below forty pupils and after the thirty-first day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two no school within a municipal district whose average attendance shall for a period of six months be below sixty pupils shall receive aid from the consolidated revenue unless it shall be at a distance of not less than two miles from the nearest school receiving aid from the consolidated revenue or unless some natural obstacle shall intervene between the two schools which shall prevent the attendance of the pupils at such other school or unless one of the two schools shall be for boys alone and the other for girls alone or unless one of the two schools shall be an infant school within the definition of infant schools hereinbefore contained. Number of pupils necessary to entitle schools to receive aid after 31st December, 1862.

XXI. The Board shall in the month of January in each and every year lay before the Governor in Council a report of the condition of the schools under their supervision and a general statement of accounts and copies of such reports and statements and accounts shall be laid before both Houses of Parliament within one month if Parliament be then sitting and if Parliament be not then sitting then within one month after the commencement of the next ensuing session thereof. Annual report to be laid before Governor in Council and Parliament.

XXII. This Act shall commence and take effect from and after the first day of September One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two. Commencement of Act.

APPENDIX B.

REGULATIONS AS TO THE APPOINTMENT, EXAMINATION, CLASSIFICATION, AND SALARIES OF PUPIL TEACHERS.

1. The Board of Education will not grant salaries to pupil teachers unless the Inspector of the district can report—

- (a.) That the masters or mistresses of schools applying for such salaries are competent to carry the pupil teachers through the course of instruction provided for them.
- (b.) That the school itself exhibits a proper efficiency, discipline, and organization.
- (c.) That the candidates are fit to be placed in the fourth class (hereafter to be described), and are of sound and healthy constitution, and free from any physical defect likely to impair their efficiency as teachers.

2. Pupil teachers will be divided into four classes, hereafter described, according to their proficiency.

3. A general examination will be held of pupil teachers at the end of every year, both orally and by means of papers, which all pupil teachers will be required to attend under pain of forfeiting their salaries. At this examination they will be classed for the ensuing year.

4. Every pupil teacher will be expected to advance at least one class at each annual examination, and those who undergo two annual examinations without promotion will forfeit their claims to aid altogether.

5. Pupil teachers will be paid at the following rates, one-third of which must be defrayed by local contributions :—

6. Teachers will be required to give six hours' instruction to their pupil teachers in each week, out of school hours.

7. Pupil teachers will be allowed at the rate of 1 for every 35 children in average attendance.

8. No pupil teacher shall be under 12 years of age.

The following are the subjects which will be required to be known by the candidates for admission to the several classes respectively :—

FOR THE FOURTH OR LOWEST CLASS.

- Reading.*—To read fluently the Irish National Board's Third Book of Lessons, or some book equivalent to it.
- Writing and Composition.*—To write out neatly in small hand, with correct spelling, any passage dictated from the Third Book, or its equivalent.
- Grammar.*—To point out the parts of speech in a simple sentence.
- Geography.*—To have a knowledge of the elements of geography, and the outlines of the map of the world.
- Arithmetic.*—To write from dictation, sums in the first four rules of arithmetic, simple and compound, and work them correctly, and to know the tables of weights and measures.
- Needlework for Girls.*—To sew neatly and to knit.

FOR THE THIRD CLASS.

- Reading.*—To read the Irish National Board's Fourth Book of Lessons, or some book equivalent to it, with fluency and proper emphasis, and to be acquainted with the subjects contained in the Third Book (or equivalent), except stories, fables, and poetry.
- Writing and Composition.*—To write from dictation, neatly and in small hand, with correct spelling and fair punctuation, any passage from the Fourth Book of Lessons, or its equivalent.
- Grammar.*—To know the first part, and first two chapters of the second part, of Morell's Grammar, or their equivalent.
- Geography.*—The Geography of Australasia.
- Art of Teaching.*—(1.) Ability to give a class a reading lesson, and to examine on the meaning of what has been read.
- (2.) Ability to drill a class in marching and exercises, and to conduct it through the movements necessary for preserving order.
- Needlework.*—Girls to instruct the younger ones in sewing and knitting.

FOR THE SECOND CLASS.

- Reading.*—To read with fluency and proper emphasis, to know the subjects of the Irish National Board's Fourth Book of Lessons, or its equivalent.
- Writing.*—To write from memory, neatly and in small hand, with correct grammar, spelling, and punctuation, the substance of a narrative read aloud.
- Grammar.*—To know the first two parts of Morell's Grammar or their equivalent, and the elements of parsing.
- Geography.*—The Geography of Europe, and the first four chapters of Sullivan's "Geography Generalized," or equivalent.
- Arithmetic.*—To vulgar and decimal fractions inclusive, interest, and mental arithmetic.
- Art of Teaching.*—To teach a class the rudiments of grammar and arithmetic, and to keep the class in attention, order, and activity.
- Needlework.*—Girls to exhibit increased skill in needlework.

FOR THE FIRST CLASS.

- Reading.*—To read with ease and expression either prose or poetry, and to know the subjects of the Fifth Book of Lessons, or its equivalent.
- Writing and Composition.*—To write from memory, neatly and in small hand, with correct grammar, spelling, and punctuation, the substance of an essay previously read.
- Grammar.*—The whole of Morell's Grammar, or its equivalent.
- Geography.*—The Geography of the World, and the mathematical and physical geography of Sullivan's "Geography Generalized," or its equivalent.
- Arithmetic.*—All the subjects contained in the Irish National Board's small work on arithmetic, with the elements of book-keeping.
- Art of Teaching.*—Ability to give a gallery lesson.
- Needlework.*—Girls to exhibit some skill in fancy work, and to do plain work well.

APPENDIX C.

PROGRAMME OF COURSE OF INSTRUCTION IN COMMON SCHOOLS.

With a view to uniformity in the course of instruction to be pursued in Common Schools, teachers will be expected to adopt the following programme in their daily teaching, and the Inspector will be instructed to report upon the schools in accordance therewith :—

Writing.—To copy single letters from the black board.
Arithmetic.—Addition and Subtraction Tables.

Reading.—To read the Irish National Board's Second Book of Lessons, or some book equivalent to it, fluently, and to spell any word in it.
Writing.—To write easy monosyllables from dictation.
Arithmetic.—Simple addition and subtraction, with the multiplication and money tables.
Grammar.—To know the article, noun substantive, and adjective.
Geography.—To know the continents and oceans, with their relative positions.
 Girls to be able to sew a little.
 Average age of children, about eight.

THIRD CLASS.

Reading.—To read the Irish National Board's Third Book of Lessons, or some book equivalent to it, fluently, and to spell any word in it.
Writing.—To write on paper from slips, and to write, spelling from dictation, easy sentences.
Arithmetic.—The four simple rules.
Grammar.—To point out the parts of speech in a simple sentence.
Geography.—To know the outlines of the maps of the World and of Australia.
 Girls to sew neatly.
 Average age of children, about nine.

FOURTH CLASS.

Reading.—To read the Irish National Board's Fourth Book of Lessons, or some book equivalent to it, fluently, with proper emphasis, and to comprehend the subjects read.
Spelling.—To write from dictation any passage in the Third Book of Lessons, or in some book equivalent to it.
Writing.—To write neatly on paper, large, round, and small hands.
Arithmetic.—The four compound rules, and reduction, with tables of weights and measures.
Grammar.—To know the etymology of the parts of speech.
Geography.—To know the countries and principal mountains and rivers of the several continents, and of Australia.
 Girls, increased skill in needlework.
 Average age of children, ten to eleven.

FIFTH CLASS.

Reading.—To read fluently and with proper emphasis any ordinary book or newspaper, and to comprehend the subjects read.
Spelling.—To write correctly from dictation.
Writing.—Same as Fourth Class, with the addition of Commercial Forms, such as those in Swan's Copy Book, No. 14.
Arithmetic.—To know simple proportion, practice, and mental arithmetic.
Grammar.—To know etymology thoroughly, and the elements of parsing.
Geography.—To know thoroughly the maps of Europe and Australia.
 Girls, increased skill in needlework.
 Average age of children, eleven to thirteen.

The subjects laid down for each class constitute the maximum of that class, but it is not intended to prevent the formation of more advanced classes, or to limit the number of subjects to those herein stated.

APPENDIX D.

Grammar.—To know the etymology of the parts of speech.

Geography.—To know the countries and principal mountains and rivers of the several continents, and of Australia.

STANDARD V.

Reading.—A few lines of poetry from a reading book used in the highest class in the school.

Writing.—A sentence slowly dictated once, by a few words at a time, from a reading book used in the highest class in the school.

Arithmetic.—A sum in compound rules (common weights and measures).

Grammar.—To know etymology thoroughly, and the elements of parsing.

Geography.—To know thoroughly the maps of Europe and Australia.

STANDARD VI.

Reading.—A short ordinary paragraph in a newspaper or other modern narrative.

Writing.—Another short ordinary paragraph in a newspaper or other modern narrative, slowly dictated once by a few words at a time.

Arithmetic.—A sum in practice or bills of parcels.

Grammar.—To be able to parse a simple sentence correctly, to correct an ungrammatical sentence, and to have a knowledge of the derivation of words.

Geography.—To know the geography of the World generally.

APPENDIX L.

INSTRUCTIONS TO INSPECTORS.

1. In the performance of your duty as Inspector of Common Schools under the Board of Education, you will bear in mind that the Board's superintendence extends only to the *temporal regulation and secular efficiency of Schools*. You will therefore carefully avoid all interference or expression of opinion either to the teacher or Local Committee respecting their arrangements, if they have any, for imparting religious instruction.

You will be careful, however, to report to the Board without delay any infraction of the XI. section of the Common Schools Act.

2. The Board will require you to inspect every school in your district once in each half-year, ending 30th June and 31st December.

After each inspection you will communicate with the Chairman of the Local Committee for the purpose of affording information concerning the condition of the school; and you will point out such violations of rule, or defects, if any, as you may have observed; and make such suggestions as you may deem necessary.

3. In the case of visits for examination under standards you will give intimation of such intended visits, and if from bad weather, or other reasonable causes, more children are absent from school than is ordinarily the case, you may allow the teacher two or at most three hours to assemble his scholars. You will however in all such cases assure yourself that those who are thus brought in are *bona fide* attendants of the school.

4. You will report to the Board the result of each inspection within fourteen days of its being made; you will use every care and diligence in ascertaining the state of instruction, discipline, organization, and the methods pursued in every school you inspect, and you will record the results on the forms G. and H.

5. When applications for aid to new schools are referred to you, you are to have an interview with the applicant, and also communicate with the inhabitants in the neighbourhood, with a view of ascertaining their opinions on the application, and whether they have any and what objections thereto. In reporting on new schools you will use the forms contained in Appendix F.

6. You will also supply the Board of Education with such information respecting localities in your district as they may from time to time require, and act as their agent in all matters in which they may employ you; but you are not invested with authority to decide upon any question affecting the establishment of, or withdrawal of aid from, a Common School.

7. You will be expected to devote yourself as far as possible to the actual inspection of the schools in your district. In inspecting a school, however, you will hear the teacher or teachers severally give lessons in your presence, and report the result of the same under the head of "Teachers."

8. You will keep a diary of all your transactions in connection with the Board, a copy of which you will forward weekly (*i.e.*, on Saturday) to the office in the form annexed.

9. At the end of each year you will prepare an annual report upon the condition of education in your district, which will, at the discretion of the Board, be published as an appendix to their annual report.

10. During Easter-week in each year you will attend at the office of the Board, with the view of conferring with the other officers of the Board upon the improvements which might be made in matters pertaining to inspection generally.

11. You will not leave your district without the permission of the Board.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the seventeenth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled, *An Act for Electric Telegraphs*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to appoint the amount of fees, rates, or dues to be demanded or received for the transmission or conveyance of any despatch, message, or communication by means of any such line, and for the due delivery thereof respectively, and for copies of any such despatch, message, or communication; and also, with the advice aforesaid, to make rules and regulations for the transmission and conveyance of all despatches, messages, or communications by means of any such line, and for the payment of such fees, rates, and dues, and generally for the conduct, management, working, and maintenance of any such line of communication; and any such fee, rate, or due, rule or regulation to increase or lower, repeal, alter, or vary respectively, and appoint and make such others as may be deemed expedient: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order appoint that telegraphic reports of the arrival of ships or vessels at any port in the colony, or off any part of the coast thereof, shall, if they contain no further or other information or intelligence, be deemed to be press messages within the meaning of the Order in Council of the 11th day of March, 1861, and be charged for accordingly in all cases in which such reports are intended for publication, but not otherwise.

And the Honorable Thomas Howard Fellows, Her Majesty's Postmaster General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act*, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the common hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

COSTERFIELD GOLD FIELD COMMON.—The area embraced within the following boundaries shall constitute a Gold Field Common at Costerfield, near Heathcote, for the use of the miners and other persons legally entitled to depasture stock thereon.—One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight acres, more or less, county of Dalhousie: Commencing at a point bearing N. 72° 50' E. one hundred chains, and N. 32° 27' E. three miles from the northern angle of allotment 8 on Mount Ida Creek, near the road from Heathcote to Kilmore and Melbourne; bounded on the south by a line bearing N. 72° 50' E. eighty chains; on the east by a line bearing N. 17° 10' W. two

hundred and thirty-three chains fifty links; on the north by a line bearing S. 72° 50' W. eighty chains; and on the west by a line bearing S. 17° 10' E. two hundred and thirty-three chains fifty links to the point of commencement; deducting from above-described area all sold or legally appropriated land, as shown on plan deposited in Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(64J.311.)
