PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the peace shall be established and holden in certain places therein named, and such other places and districts within the said colony as the Lieutenant Governor thereof shall appoint; and that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony, from time to time, to define and appoint by proclamation the limits and boundaries of such places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden, and such limits, districts, places, and times respectively to revoke, alter, or vary as the said Lieutenant Governor shall think fit: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint that the times at which the Courts of General Sessions of the peace in Victoria shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five shall be the times specified under the respective names of the several places hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF McIVOR.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fifteenth day of June, 1863, a Road District was proclaimed under the designation of "The Heathcote Road District:" And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the ninth day of May, in the present year, the boundaries of the said district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the area of the said district and the amount of the last general rate therein are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Heathcote Road District to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, and do define the boundaries of the said shire in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF McIVOR.—Commencing at a point on the River Campaspe, due west of Mount Caniel; thence due east to the River Goulburn; thence southerly by the said river to the Stony Creek; thence southerly by the Stony Creek to the northern boundary of Banks and Boyd's pre-emptive right; thence west by the northern boundary of the said pre-emptive right and a direct line to a point two miles west of the northern boundary of the said pre-emptive right; thence by a line due south to the Sugar Loaf Creek; thence by the centre of Sugar Loaf Creek southerly to its junction with Mollison's Creek; thence by the centre of Mollison's Creek south-westerly through the township of Pyalong to its junction with Spring Gully, shown on the country map of Dalhousie as having its source at "Permanent Springs;" thence further westerly by the centre of Mollison's Creek to its source; thence by a direct line to the south-east angle of allotment 2, in the parish of Baynton; thence by a direct line to the centre of Pohlman's Creek; thence north-westerly by the centre of Pohlman's Creek to the northern boundary of the parish of Baynton; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the same parish to the north-west angle of allotment 16 of the same parish; thence by a direct line bearing westerly to the centre of Piper's Creek at a point due east of the south-east angle of portion 3, section 1, parish of Emberton; thence northerly by the centre of Piper's Creek to its junction with the Campaspe River; thence by the centre of the said River Campaspe northerly to the commencing point; excepting the borough of Heathcote.

And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the fourteenth day of August, 1863, the boundaries of the said district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas the area of the said district and the amount of the last general rates therein are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district heretofore proclaimed and called the Marong Road District to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF MARONG.

THE CARLSRUHE ROAD DISTRICT ADDED TO.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighth day of February, 1859, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Karlsruhe Road District:" And whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the twenty-first day of January, 1861, the boundaries of the said district were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to add thereto a portion of the parish of Baynton and other adjacent lands not heretofore included in any road district: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said addition to the Karlsruhe Road District by including therein a portion of the parish of Baynton and other adjacent lands not heretofore included in any district, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do hereby re-define the whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

Commencing at the north-west angle of portion 8 in the parish of Langley; thence due east to the centre of Piper's Creek; thence northerly by the centre of Piper's Creek to due east of the south-east angle of portion 3, section 1, parish of Emberton; thence by a direct line bearing easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 16 in the parish of Baynton; thence by the northern boundary of said parish of Baynton easterly to the centre of Pohlman's Creek; thence south-easterly by the centre of Pohlman's Creek to the south-east angle of allotment 2 in the parish of Baynton; thence by a direct line to the head of Mollison's Creek; thence northerly, easterly, and southerly by the centre of Mollison's Creek to the junction of the southern branch of said creek, forming portion of the western boundary of the Pyalong Road District; thence southerly by the western boundary of the Pyalong Road District and a direct south line to the electoral boundary of the county of Bourke or southern boundary of the electoral district of Dalhousie; thence westerly to the north-west angle of the Lancefield Road District; thence southerly by the western boundary of the Lancefield Road District to the north-east angle of the Woodend, Newham, and Rochford Road District; thence southerly and westerly by the northern boundary of the last-named road district to the north-west angle of the parish of Newham; thence south by the western boundary of the parish of Newham to the south-east angle of the parish of Karlsruhe; thence west by the south boundary of the parish of Karlsruhe to the centre of the River Campaspe; thence north-westerly by the centre of the said river to the west boundary of the parish of Karlsruhe; thence north by the western boundaries of the parishes of Karlsruhe and Langley to the commencing point.

THE SUBDIVISIONS OF THE DONNYBROOK AND WALLAN-WALLAN ROAD DISTRICT.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twelfth day of December, 1864.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time after the first annual election or general election, as the case may be, or first appointment of members of the district board, for any original or proclaimed district thereafter sometimes called "single district," the Governor in Council, if it seem fit, may, and if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said district, shall within three months after the receipt of the same divide the district into two, or, if the Governor in Council shall see fit, into three separate electoral subdivisions, thereafter called subdivisions, by such names as shall by such Order in Council be assigned to the same, and in and by such Order in Council the boundaries of the subdivisions shall be set forth; provided that no such division shall be made within three months before any day appointed for holding any election of members of the district board in or for such district: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the tenth day of August, 1863, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Donnybrook and Wallan-wallan Road District:" And whereas the Governor in Council has received a petition signed by more than twenty persons liable to be rated under the said Act in respect of rateable property in the said road district, praying for the division of the same into three subdivisions: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the Donnybrook and Wallan-wallan Road District into three separate electoral subdivisions in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, by the names hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, and doth hereby set forth the boundaries of the said several subdivisions in manner following, that is to say:—

THE DONNYBROOK SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the north-west corner of section 44, parish of Darraweit-guim; thence bounded on the west by the western boundary of said section; thence on the south by portion 16, parish of Bolinda; thence on the west, south, and east, by the Broadmeadows, Epping, and Woodstock Road Districts, to the north boundary of portion 27, parish of Kalkallo; and thence by a line bearing due west to the commencing point.

THE BEVERIDGE SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the north-west corner of section 44, parish of Darraweit-guim; thence bounded on the west by the western boundaries of sections 38, 37, 32, and 31, to the north-west corner of the last-mentioned section; thence on the north by a line bearing east to the Woodstock Road District; thence on the east by the said road district to the north boundary of portion 27, parish of Kalkallo; and thence on the south by a line bearing west to the commencing point.

THE WALLAN-WALLAN SUBDIVISION.—Commencing at the south-west corner of section 36, parish of Darraweit-guim; thence bounded on the west by the west boundary lines of said section 26 and 25 north to the parish boundary; thence on the north by the northern boundaries of the parishes of Darraweit-guim and Wallan-wallan; thence on the east and south by the road districts of Whittlesea and Woodstock to the south-east corner of section 27, parish of Merriang; and thence on the south by a line bearing west to the commencing point.

And the Honorable James Forrester Sullivan shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

JURY LISTS TO BE PREPARED FOR THE JURY DISTRICTS OF WOOD'S POINT AND BALLAN.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating Juries*, it is amongst other things enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police, and sheriffs, shall, within such time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, mat-

ters, and things in and towards preparing, correcting, allowing, sending, and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by Orders in Council made on the fifth and nineteenth days of December instant, it is ordered that county courts shall be holden at Wood's Point and Ballan, the same being places at which county courts have not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that jury lists shall be prepared for the respective jury districts of Wood's Point and Ballan, and that the several acts required by law be done within the times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

The Clerk of Petty Sessions at Wood's Point shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury list for the jury district of Wood's Point, on or before Monday, the second day of January next ensuing; such list shall be prepared forthwith, and the notice prescribed by the eighth section of the said Act shall be affixed, as provided by that Act, on Sunday, the fifteenth and twenty-second days respectively of January aforesaid; the court of petty sessions at Wood's Point shall revise such list on Tuesday, the thirty-first day of the same month; such list shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Thursday, the second day of February, 1865; and the jury book shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Monday, the thirteenth day of February aforesaid.

The Clerk of Petty Sessions at Ballan shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury list for the jury district of Ballan, on or before Monday, the second day of January next ensuing; such list shall be prepared forthwith, and the notice prescribed by the eighth section of the said Act shall be affixed, as provided by that Act, on Sunday, the fifteenth and twenty-second days respectively of January aforesaid; the court of petty sessions at Ballan shall revise such list on Monday, the thirtieth day of the same month; such list shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Wednesday, the first day of February, 1865; and the jury book shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Monday, the thirteenth day of February aforesaid.

And the Honorable Archibald Michie, Her Majesty's Minister of Justice for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

RESCINDING PROCLAMATIONS BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF OTAGO DECLARING CERTAIN PORTS AND PLACES BEYOND THE COLONY OF NEW ZEALAND INFECTED DISTRICTS.

WHEREAS on the eighteenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, I, John Hyde Harris, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in exercise of the powers vested in me in that behalf, did, by Proclamation published in the *Provincial Government Gazette*, proclaim and declare all the Australian Ports, with the exception of Gipps Land and Mornington, to be an Infected District within the meaning of the *Diseased Cattle Act*, 1861: And whereas on the sixteenth day of February last, in exercise of the powers vested in me in that behalf, I did, by Proclamation published in the said *Gazette*, proclaim and declare Gipps Land and Mornington aforesaid to be an Infected District within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas on the sixth day of May last, in exercise of the powers vested in me in that behalf, I did, by Proclamation published in the said *Gazette*, proclaim and declare the colony of Tasmania and all the ports and places therein, to be an Infected District within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient that the said three several Proclamations should be wholly rescinded: Now therefore, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me in this behalf, I do hereby rescind, and declare to be wholly rescinded, the said three hereinbefore recited Proclamations, and every part thereof.

ALL fees and charges must be paid to the treasurer before the ground is opened.

- The hours of interment will be from sunrise till sunset.
- Graves to be dug by the sexton, who must receive orders at least twenty-four hours before the hour of interment.
- The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death, must be given at the time of giving order.
- Application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees; a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the charges set forth in schedule A.
- In case of an interment to be made in any private vault or grave, the consent, in writing, of the proprietor must be left with the order.
- All persons destroying the fences or otherwise injuring the cemetery will be prosecuted as the law directs.
- The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the same.
- All meetings of trustees to be convened by circular from secretary by post.
- The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.
