GENERAL SESSIONS DISTRICTS OF SALE, JAMIESON, AND WOOD'S POINT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions of the peace shall be established and holden in certain places therein named, and such other places or districts within the said colony of Victoria as the Governor thereof shall appoint; and that it shall be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, from time to time, to define and appoint by proclamation the limits and boundaries of such places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden, and such limits, districts, places, and times respectively to revoke, alter, and vary as the said Governor shall think fit: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-first day of January, 1861, the General Sessions District of Sale was defined, and the boundaries of the said district were altered by another Proclamation bearing date the first day of February, 1861: And whereas by another Proclamation, also bearing the last-mentioned date, the General Sessions District of Jamieson was defined: And whereas by another Proclamation, bearing date the fifth day of December instant, a Court of General Sessions was appointed to be held at Wood's Point: And whereas it is expedient to alter the two first-mentioned districts and to appoint a district within which the Court of General Sessions appointed to be held at Wood's Point shall have jurisdiction: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the districts within which the Courts of General Sessions held at Sale and Jamieson have jurisdiction; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby appoint that the said Courts of General Sessions held at Sale and Jamieson, and the Court of General Sessions appointed to be held at Wood's Point, shall be held in and for the districts hereinafter defined, that is to say:—

The Court of General Sessions of the peace holden at Sale shall have jurisdiction in and for the district of Sale, comprising all that portion of Victoria hereinafter described, viz. (The above district is diminished by deducting therefrom a portion at its eastern boundary. The amended boundaries of the district are as follows):—Commencing at the confluence of Merriman's Creek with the sea; thence by that creek to its most northern source; thence by a straight line westerly to Hobson's Bridge; thence by the road from the said bridge to Buncup-buncup Creek; thence by that creek to its source in the range dividing the sources of the Yarra-yarra River from those of the La Trobe River; thence by that range easterly and north-easterly to Mount Baw-baw; thence by a straight line north-easterly to Mount Useful; thence by the range dividing the sources of the Macalister River from those of Aberfeldy River to the Great Dividing Range; thence by a straight line northerly to Mount Buller; thence by a straight line northerly to Mount Howitt; thence by the Dividing Range to Mount Selwyn; thence by the Dividing Range to Forest Hill; thence by a line south-easterly to Cape Howe, being the boundary between Victoria and New South Wales; thence by the sea-coast to the com-

mencing point; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

The Court of General Sessions of the peace holden at Jamieson shall have jurisdiction in and for the district of Jamieson, comprising all that portion of Victoria hereinafter described, viz. (The above district is diminished by deducting therefrom a portion at its southern boundary. The amended boundaries of the said district are as follows):—Commencing at Mount Pleasant, on the Goulburn River; thence by a straight line south-easterly to the junction of the Rubicon River with the Goulburn River; thence by the Rubicon River to its source in the Dividing Range; thence by the Dividing Range to Mount Arnold; thence by a straight line north-easterly to a point on the Big River one mile below Enoch's Point; thence by a straight line south-easterly to the range dividing the sources of the Goulburn River from those of the Big River; thence by the spur dividing Flourbag Creek from Gaffney's Creek to the junction of the last-named Creek with the Goulburn River; thence by a straight line east to the Dividing Range; thence by a straight line north-easterly to Mount Buller; thence by a straight line northerly to Mount Howitt; thence by the Dividing Range to Mount Selwyn; thence westerly by the range dividing the waters of the King River from those of the Broken River to the most eastern source of the last-named river; thence by a straight line south-westerly to the source of Collins Creek; thence westerly by the Mount Battery Range to Mount Battery; thence by a straight line north-westerly to the source of Sandy Creek in the Barranhet Range; thence by that range north-westerly and south-westerly to a point north of the north-west angle of the township of Merton; thence south by a straight line including the said township to Puzzle Range; thence by that range south-easterly to the source of Frenchman's Creek; and thence by a straight line south-westerly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

The Court of General Sessions of the peace holden at Wood's Point shall have jurisdiction in and for the district of Wood's Point, comprising all that portion of Victoria hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the junction of Gaffney's Creek with the Goulburn River; thence westerly by the range between Gaffney's Creek and Flourbag Creek to the summit of the range dividing the sources of the Goulburn River from those of the Big River; thence north-westerly by a straight line to a point on the Big River one mile below Enoch's Point; thence south-westerly by a straight line to Mount Arnold; thence southerly and easterly by a line running parallel with and one mile westerly and southerly from the Great Dividing Range to a point one mile south of Sinclair's Valley; thence by a straight line south-easterly to the summit of Mount Baw-baw; thence by a straight line north-easterly to the summit of Mount Useful; thence northerly by the range dividing the sources of the Macalister River from those of the Aberfeldy River to the Great Dividing Range; thence by that range north-easterly to a point due east from the point of commencement; and thence west by a straight line to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-third day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.
