WHEREAS by The Local Government Act, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seen fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions or to a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupen become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the first day of June, 1863, the boundaries of the Waranga road district were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor in Council to make an addition to the said road district by the extension of the northern boundary thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the said addition to the Waranga road district by the extension of its northern boundary, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and do hereby re-define the whole of the said road district added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act, 1863, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for ten or more inhabitants of any part of Victoria not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district, and of whom each one shall possess property rateable under the said Act within the area next thereinafter mentioned, to sign and present to the Governor a petition setting forth that the area, which shall by metes and bounds be described in such petition, contains not less than forty square miles, and rateable property whereof the net annual value is not less than Five thousand pounds, and praying that such area may be constituted a road district; and it is also enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon being satisfied that the statements set forth in the petition are true, and that it is desirable to comply with the prayer thereof, to constitute such part of Victoria, under such name as shall in and by the same Order in Council be assigned thereto, a new road district; and the words "proclaimed district," where used in the said Act, shall be deemed to mean such new district: And whereas a petition signed by more than ten inhabitants of the area or part of Victoria hereinafter described, possessing rateable property in such area, has been signed and presented to the Governor, setting forth the matters and things required by the said Act, and due notice of such petition has been published as provided by the said Act, and in compliance with the prayer thereof, an Order in Council, bearing even date herewith, has been made to constitute the said area a new road district: Now therefore I. Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby constitute and proclaim the part of Victoria hereinafter described to be a new road district, under the name assigned thereto, in and by the Order in Council hereinbefor

mentioned, that is to say:—

THE ECHUCA ROAD DISTRICT.—Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Goulburn due north of the northern angle of the Ardpatrick Run; thence northerly by the centre line of the Goulburn River to its junction with the River Murray; thence by the course of the River Murray to the point where the eastern boundary of the Swan Hill road district intersects it; thence southerly, by the eastern boundary of the said district, to the northern boundary of the Campaspe road district; thence east by the said northern boundary of the said district to the centre of the Campaspe River; thence northerly by the centre of the Compaspe River to a point where it is intersected by the south boundary line of the village reserve; thence by a direct line having a north-easterly bearing to the commencing point.—(63.1693.)

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act to make provision for the sale of fermented and spirituous liquors and of refreshments in certain districts, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by notice in the Government Gazette, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said colony to be a district subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called a Special Licensing District, and to define the boundaries of such district, and from time to time to vary, alter, and revoke such boundaries and any such notice and proclamation: And whereas under and by virtue of divers proclamations under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date respectively the 16th day of February, 1853, the 21st day of January, 1859, the 18th day of June, 1860, the 12th day of August, 1861, and the 15th day of August, 1863, the portion of the colony now included within the boundaries of the borough of Castlemaine, amongst other localities, became subject to the provisions of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to exclude the whole of the said borough, excepting the portion thereof occupied for the purposes of the Melbourne and Murray River Railway, from the operation of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby revoke so much of the said borough occupied for the purposes of the Melbourne and Murray River Railway.

NOTICE TO MARINES.

LIGHTHOUSES have been erected on Foul Point and Round Island in the entrance of Trincomalic Harbor. The lights are of the following description, and will be exhibited from sunset to sunrise every night after the 1st of February, 1864:—

Foul Point.—A flash light showing a brilliant flash every half minute, which is plainly visible 17 miles in clear weather, from a vessel's deck elevated 18 feet above the sea; a faint light is shown between the flashes, which is not visible beyond a distance of 7 miles.

Round Island.—A fixed bright light

If such inspector shall be reasonably satisfied that any such cattle so inspected by him as aforesaid are actually infected with the said disease called pleuro-pneumonia, or any other infectious or contagious disease, he shall forthwith give notice to that effect to the owner of such cattle, or to the person in charge thereof, and it shall be the duty of such owner or person in charge, within twenty-four hours after such notice, to destroy the same.
- If such cattle shall not be so destroyed within twenty-four hours after such notice as aforesaid, it shall be lawful for the inspector to cause the same to be destroyed forthwith.
- 4. Any person hindering or preventing the said inspector 4. Any person hindering or preventing the said inspection from mustering or inspecting any cattle under the provisions of of these regulations, or refusing or neglecting to destroy any cattle within twenty-four hours after notice given, as provided by clause No. 2 of these regulations, or in any way offending against these regulations, shall forfeit and pay any sum not less than One pound nor more than One hundred pounds.

REGULATIONS UNDER PROVISIONS OF "DISEASED CATTLE ACT, 1861."

In pursuance of the power in me vested, I, James A. R. Menzies, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Southland, do hereby make and issue the following Regulations for

the management of Quarantine Grounds within the province of Southland.

- 1. It shall be lawful for an inspector of cattle, appointed under the said Act, if he shall think fit to direct that cattle reasonably suspected to be infected with pleuro-pneumona, or any other infections or contagious disease, shall be removed to the nearest quarantine ground, there to remain until the said inspector permits the same to be removed.
- 2. The owner or person in charge of any animal sent to the quarantine ground by order of the inspector, shall pay to the said inspector a fee of Ten shillings for every such animal.
- 3. The person who shall be appointed to take charge of the quarantine ground shall burn or bury the remains of any animal which shall die in quarantine; and for every such animal so dying the owner or person having charge of it before it was sent into quarantine shall pay to the inspector a fee of Fivo shillings to compensate for the subsequent expenses.
- 4. Any person hindering or preventing the removal to any quarantine ground of any cattle so reasonably suspected of being infected as aforesaid, which shall have been directed by the inspector to be removed to such quarantine ground, or in any way offending against those regulations, shall forfeit and pay any sum not less than One pound nor more than One hundred pounds.

BYE-LAW NO. 24.—FOR REGULATING THE ELECTION OF MANAGERS OF THE SANDRIDGE BOROUGH COMMON.

WHEREAS by section 69 of the Act of Parliament 25 Victoria No. 145, intituled, An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the sule and occupation of Crown Lands, it is provided that the council of any municipal district within or in the vicinity of which any town or municipal common is situated, shall elect annually, in such manner as they may by bye-laws prescribe, three persons to be the managers of such town or municipal common, and may at any time remove any one or more of such managers, and elect others in their stead: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the borough of Sandridge:—

1. That the election for the appointment of managers of the Sandridge Borough Common shall be held annually at the second ordinary meeting of the council subsequent to the date of the annual election of councillors, with the exception of the first election of managers, which shall take place at the first meeting of the council subsequent to the publication of this present bye-law in the Government Gazette.

2. That at any meeting for the election of managers, any member of the council may propose the names of the same number of persons as there are vacancies to be filled up, and in the event of there being more persons proposed than there are vacancies, the voting shall be on cards provided for the purpose, on which the voter shall write the name or names of the candidate or candidates he supports, and sign his own name. The result of such election shall be entered on the minutes of the day, and the voting cards shall be kept in the town clerk's office for twelve months as a record.

3. That when any one or more vacancies occur, through death, resignation, or removal by the council of any manager or managers during his or their term of office, the council shall as speedily as possible elect, in the same manner as hereinbefore provided, a person or persons to fill such vacancy or vacancies.

4. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, it shall be lawful for the said council, instead of proceeding to the nomination and election of managers aforesaid, to adjourn any such meeting from time to time, as they may think proper, and the election taking place at any such adjourned meeting shall be equally relief. shall be equally valid.
