ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

HER Majesty's Principal Secretary of Sate for the Colonies has, in three several Despatches bearing date respectively the 24th, 25th, and 26th of December, 1863, intimated to the Governor that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise her power of disallowance in respect of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 27th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates whereof are hereto subjoined, viz.—No. 172.—An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Ninety-two thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and the further sum of Five hundred thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three. [Assented to 5th August, 1863.]

No. 173. An Act to remove doubts as to the validity of acts done by John George Forbes, Esquire, as Commissioner of Insol-vent Estates for the Geelong Circuit District. [Assented to 2nd September, 1863.]

WHEREAS by The Land Act, 1862, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the unnapropriated Crown lands within the town boundary of Heywood, comprising about 500 acres, to be a Town Common in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act.

Description of Bartholomew Burke, alias Moore, Charged with the Murdder of Mary Burke, at Wooler, on or about the 9th Strumber, 1858.

Irish, aged about 43, 5 feet 75 or 8 inches high, medium build, dark complexion, hair, whiskers, and moustache, probably now turning grey; formerly a soldier in H.M. 40th regiment at Melbourne, acting as officers' servant, discharged in 1857. He afterwards lived with his wife at Gisborne or Kyneton. About 1860 he worked at Kew for two contractors, named respectively Morgan and Sobie, being then known by the name of Moore. In 1849 (? 1859) he worked at Cardiner and Cheltenham under two contractors, named respectively Dwyer and Malone, at the time when one George Oldham was murdered there by one Regan. About two years ago he was at work stone-breaking near theilpough Inn, Plenty road. His general appearance is that of a laborer. During his military service he was for some time employed on escort duty.

BYE-LAW NO. 1.—STANDING ORDERS TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL.

1. The business of the council at all ordinary meetings shall be conducted with open doors, unless it shall become necessary to exclude strangers on account of their disorderly conduct.

2. The council shall commence business so soon after the time notified as there is a sufficient number of councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum directed by law, but if at the expiry of an hour from the time specified there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the council at the meeting; and the names of all councillors present shall be recorded in the minute book by the secretary.

3. The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the council, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

4. The reading and ordering on reports of special committees and of officers, the receiving of deputations, and the reading of memorials, shall follow the correspondence.

5. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and be presented by a member of the council, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

6. On the presentation of a petition or memorial no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given as hereinafter provided, and the only questions that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be, that the petition be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

7. No report of a committee shall be considered or adopted on its presentation shall be considered or adopted on its presentation shall be considered or adopted on the occasion of its presentation shall be considered or depreted on the orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of fo

11. No bye-law shall be made save by a "special order" of the council, as provided for by sections 138 and 174 of Act of Parliament No. 176.

12. No motion in which it is proposed to adopt any address or standing order, shall be entertained, unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such petition or standing order; and the draft so submitted shall in no case be taken into consideration until it shall have been referred to the legislative committee, who shall report thereon, and the mover of every such proposition shall be pro hâc vice a member of such committee.

13. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be pro hâc vice a member of such committee.

14. Before any motion is put from the chair, in case the mover is not prepared with his motion in writing, the secretary shall take down the same in writing, and may obtain the signatures of the mover and seconder.

15. It shall be competent for any councillor, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each councillor, by post, of the day for which the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration, and any councillor not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, shall be liable to a penalty of Ten shillings, unless reasonable cause for

such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council; the fines to be applied by the council to charitable purposes.

16. On any motion being put from the chair, the secretary may be required by any member to enter in the minute book the names of the councillors who voted thereon, and specify whether such councillors voted for or against the motion so put from the chair.

17. All reports sent in to the council by any councillor or councillors thereof, or by any officer of the council, shall be written on sheets of large foolscap paper, on one side only, a broad margin being left, so that they can be properly bound together.

18. Any councillor moving or seconding any motion or amendment, shall be held to have spoken on that notion or amendment.

19. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the president shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

No councillor shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment hist proposed; and the president shall, without waiting for the interposition of the council, call to order any councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment. After the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

21. The president when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule of precedent applicable to the case without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final pro hat vice in each case 22. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand up when addressing the council in discussion of any question.

23. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a councillor immediately upon the same being used.

25. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment between, but not more.

26. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the council, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendments oc arried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

27. The president shall, on taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the first question in the affirmative, and then in the negative; and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority, and the council shall vote in all cases by show of hands. Provided always, that if at any such meeting there be an equality of votes in the election of the president, it shall be decided by lot which of the councillors having an equal number of votes shall be the president.

28.
