ACTS OF PARLIAMENT LEFT TO THEIR OPERATION.

HER Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in three several Despatches bearing date respectively the 24th, 25th, and 26th of December, 1863, intimated to the Governor that Her Majesty will not be advised to exercise her power of disallowance in respect of the Acts of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the 27th year of Her Majesty's reign, the numbers, titles, and dates whereof are hereto subjoined, viz. :—

No. 172.—An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Ninety-two thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and the further sum of Five hundred thousand pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-three. [Assented to 5th August, 1863.]

No. 173.—An Act to remove doubts as to the validity of acts done by John George Forbes, Esquire, as Commissioner of Insolvent Estates for the Geelong Circuit District. [Assented to 2nd September, 1863.]

No. 176.—An Act to establish Road Districts and Shires and generally to provide for the administration of local affairs without the limits of Boroughs. [Assented to 2nd September, 1863.]

No. 177.—An Act to prevent the Adulteration of Articles of Food or Drink. [Assented to 2nd September, 1863.]

No. 178.—An Act to further alter and amend the Laws relating to the Corporations of the City of Melbourne and of the Town of Geelong respectively, and to extend and apply other existing Acts thereto. [Assented to 2nd September, 1863.]

COMMON-TOLL ROAD.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the District Board of the North Ovens Road District has complained to the Governor in Council that they ought, by reason of the traffic passing along a road hereinafter mentioned being common to their own district with the district in which tolls are payable upon such road, to have a share of such tolls in the manner provided in the 25th clause of *The Local Government Act, 1863*: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the portion of road hereinafter mentioned to be a Common-toll road, for the purposes and within the meaning of the provisions of the said Act relating to common-toll roads, viz.—

The portion of the road known as "The Sydney Road" extending from the southern boundary of the borough of Wangaratta to the northern boundary of the North Ovens road district, shall be a Common-toll road of the said borough of Wangaratta and North Ovens road district.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains un-sold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the unappropriated Crown lands within the town boundary of Heywood, comprising about 500 acres, to be a Town Common in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act.

PROPOSED EXTENSION OF THE HEATHCOTE ROAD DISTRICT.

THE District Board of the Heathcote Road District has applied for the extension thereof, as shown on a tracing, for the following reasons:—

1st. Because portion of the parish of Axedale, now included in the Strathfieldsaye Road District, intercepts what should be the natural boundary of this district, viz., the Campaspe River, up to which the applicants have to construct roads, and also intercepts the boundary of the electoral division of Heathcote B, which it is deemed important to maintain unbroken as provided for in clause 284 of *The Local Government Act, 1863*, and with as much reason as was held to justify the severance of portions of this district for the purpose of their being annexed to the Waranga and the Seynour Road Districts.

2nd. Because a portion of the area applied for (marked blue on the tracing and contiguous to the south-west corner of the road district) is not at present included in any road district, and if added to this district will aid in raising the rates to the amount requisite for the purpose of obtaining the conversion of the road district into a shire.

INCENDIARISM.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS on the morning of Friday, the 8th of last January, a bush fence belonging to James Campbell Telford, Swinton's Station, Glenorchy, was maliciously set on fire and destroyed: And whereas at Eleven at night on Tuesday, the 2nd instant, another fence belonging to the same owner was found to be on fire in three several places, and about one mile thereof was destroyed: And whereas Mr. Telford has offered a reward of Fifty pounds for the detection of the incendiary: Notice is hereby given that a reward of Fifty pounds (supplemental to the reward offered by Mr. Telford) will be paid by the Government for such information as shall lead to the conviction

DESCRIPTION OF BARTHOLOMEW BURKE, *alias* MOORE, CHARGED WITH THE MURDER OF MARY BURKE, AT WOOLFERT, ON OR ABOUT THE 9TH SEPTEMBER, 1858. Irish; aged about 43, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, medium build, dark complexion, hair, whiskers, and moustache, probably now turning grey; formerly a soldier in H.M. 40th regiment at Melbourne, acting as officers' servant, discharged in 1857. He afterwards lived with his wife at Gisborne or Kyneton. About 1860 he worked at Kew for two contractors, named respectively Morgan and Sobie, being then known by the name of Moore. In 1849 (? 1859) he worked at Gardiner and Cheltenham under two contractors, named respectively Dwyer and Malone, at the time when one George Oldham was murdered there by one Regan. About two years ago he was at work stone-breaking near the Plough Inn, Plenty road. His general appearance is that of a laborer. During his military service he was for some time employed on escort duty.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the grave or vault is opened.
2. Orders for interment must be given at the office of the trustees before the hour of five p.m. the previous day.
3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death must be stated at the time of giving the order.
4. The procession to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.
6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.
7. Application for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument in the cemetery, to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to the person applying, on payment of the charges set forth in schedule A.
8. The trustees, if required, will cause all common graves to be dug, at an extra expense of One pound (£1); but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them. And in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent in writing of such person must be left with the order.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences, to be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owners.
10. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair must be removed by order of the trustees without notice to the owner.
11. No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
12. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof, is liable to punishment, as prescribed by the 14th section of the Act 17th Victoria No. 12.
13. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
14. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

BYE-LAW NO. 1.—STANDING ORDERS TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL.

- The business of the council at all ordinary meetings shall be conducted with open doors, unless it shall become necessary to exclude strangers on account of their disorderly conduct.
- The council shall commence business so soon after the time notified as there is a sufficient number of councillors in attendance to constitute a quorum directed by law, but if at the expiry of an hour from the time specified there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the council at the meeting; and the names of all councillors present shall be recorded in the minute book by the secretary.
- The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the council, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.
- The reading and ordering on reports of special committees and of officers, the receiving of deputations, and the reading of memorials, shall follow the correspondence.
- Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and be presented by a member of the council, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.
- On the presentation of a petition or memorial no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given as herein after provided, and the only questions that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be, that the petition be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.
- No report of a committee shall be considered or adopted on its presentation, nor until due notice shall be given. All such reports shall be read and received *pro forma*, and, if ordered by the council, printed for distribution among the councillors, to be considered at any subsequent meeting.
- If, in the report of a committee, there are distinct recommendations contained in such report, such report shall not be adopted until the sense of the council has been taken separately on each.
- The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration; any councillor may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the secretary previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration; and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they are given.
- No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, in writing, be present when the business is called on. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.
- No bye-law shall be made save by a "special order" of the council, as provided for by sections 138 and 174 of Act of Parliament No. 176.
- No motion in which it is proposed to take action on any petition, or in which it is proposed to adopt any address or standing order, shall be entertained, unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such petition or standing order; and the draft so submitted shall in no case be taken into consideration until it shall have been referred to the legislative committee, who shall report thereon, and the mover of every such proposition shall be *pro hac vice* a member of such committee.
- The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be *pro hac vice* a member of such committee.
- Before any motion is put from the chair, in case the mover is not prepared with his motion in writing, the secretary shall take down the same in writing, and may obtain the signatures of the mover and seconder.
- It shall be competent for any councillor, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole council for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each councillor, by post, of the day for which the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration, and any councillor not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, shall be liable to a penalty of Ten shillings, unless reasonable cause for

such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the council; the fines to be applied by the council to charitable purposes.

16. On any motion being put from the chair, the secretary may be required by any member to enter in the minute book the names of the councillors who voted thereon, and specify whether such councillors voted for or against the motion so put from the chair.

17. All reports sent in to the council by any councillor or councillors thereof, or by any officer of the council, shall be written on sheets of large foolscap paper, on one side only, a broad margin being left, so that they can be properly bound together.

18. Any councillor moving or seconding any motion or amendment, shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

19. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time, the president shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

20. No councillor shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed; and the president shall, without waiting for the interposition of the council, call to order any councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment. After the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

21. The president when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule of precedent applicable to the case without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final *pro hoc vice* in each case.

22. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand up when addressing the council in discussion of any question.

23. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a councillor immediately upon the same being used.

24. Any councillor may, of right, require the production of any of the documents of the council relating to the question or matter in discussion.

25. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any councillor to move one other amendment thereon, but not more.

26. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the council, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion, and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

27. The president shall, on taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the first question in the affirmative, and then in the negative; and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands as to which party has the majority, and the council shall vote in all cases by show of hands. Provided always, that if at any such meeting there be an equality of votes in the election of the president, it shall be decided by lot which of the councillors having an equal number of votes shall be the president.

28. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undispensed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the council.

29. Any councillor may enter his protest against any resolution of the council, provided such protest is not inconsistent with truth, or disrespectful to the council. Notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest signed by the councillor or councillors protesting, and specifying the reason for protesting, must be entered, before the next regular meeting of the council, by the protesting councillor, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the secretary's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of the council, the same to be considered also a part of such minutes.

30. A notice of motion may be dispensed with in cases of emergency, where the council considers it necessary to do so, there being not more than one councillor absent at such council meeting.

31. No election to any vacant office at the disposal of the council shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.
