ESCORTS BY RAILWAY.

THE Police Escorts hitherto run by railway to and from Ballarat and Sandhurst and Melbourne, will be discontinued from and after the 1st of April proximo; and the treasure hitherto brought by the police branch escorts to the lines of railway at Sandhurst, Castlemaine, Ballarat, &c., will in future be deposited in, and delivered at, the gold offices at those places instead of at Melbourne.

There being no gold office at Kyneton, the fortnightly escort to that place from Blackwood will be discontinued from the same date; but on the first Tuesday in each month the police will, if desired, accompany persons conveying treasure from Blackwood to Kyneton; not taking charge of, or incurring any responsibility with respect to, the treasure.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act to amend an Act intitled "An Act to amend the law relating to the Post Office,"* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, to make, or cause to be made, arrangements with the Postmaster General in England, or with the authorities of any British possession or foreign country, for the following objects, that is to say:

(3.) For the appointment, determining, and collection of postage and rates of postage upon letters, packets, and newspapers, conveyed between the colony aforesaid and such kingdom, possession, or country, and for the exemption of such letters, packets, and newspapers from all or any rates:

(4.) For the division or appropriation and mutual accounting for and payment of money so collected:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the following rate of postage on letters, in pursuance of an arrangement with the Imperial Government, shall be published in the *Government Gazette*:—

UNITED COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that where there are two or more neighboring commons the Governor in Council may proclaim that the same shall be a common under the name of "The United Town and Gold Field [or, as the case may be] Common of" for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the neighboring commons hereinafter mentioned shall be a United Common, under the following name, that is to say:—

THE UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON OF MORTLAKE shall comprise the Mortlake Town Common, described in two several Proclamations bearing date respectively the eighteenth day of February, 1861, and the twenty-second day of December, 1862, and the Farmers' Common at Mortlake, described amongst others in a Proclamation bearing date the eighteenth day of March, 1861; and shall be for the benefit of all persons entitled to commonage on either of the said commons.—(64J.1902.)

COMMON INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act, 1862*, it is amongst other things enacted, that when any Crown land remains unsold in or within five miles of any municipal district, or upon or within five miles of any gold field, or in or within five miles of any town not contained in any municipal district, or within any agricultural area of which at least one-fourth part has been selected, the Governor in Council may proclaim such land to be a municipal common, or a gold fields common, or a town common, or a farmers' common respectively, as the case may be; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any common proclaimed before or after the passing of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

BROWN'S AND SCARSDALE BOROUGH COMMON, described, amongst others, in a Proclamation bearing date the twentieth day of April, 1863, under the designation of Brown's and Scarsdale Municipal Common, shall be and the same is hereby increased by adding thereto the following area, viz.:—County of Grenville, (2000) two thousand acres, more or less: Commencing at the north-east angle of the existing common; thence by part of the north boundary of the borough of Brown's and Scarsdale east to the north-east angle thereof; thence south by part of the east boundary of the borough aforesaid about two hundred chains to a point bearing east from the south-east angle of the existing common; thence west to the said south-east angle; thence northerly by Smythe's Creek to the point of commencement; being the unappropriated Crown lands within the above-described area. Total approximate area of common, including portion already proclaimed, 7600 acres, as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(64I.1865.)
