ADDITIONAL REGULATION UNDER "THE LAND ACT, 1862."

REFERRING to the Regulations relating to the issue of licenses by or under the authority of the Board of Land and Works for occupation of Crown Lands under the 53rd clause of *The Land Act, 1862*, published under date of 1st July, 1862, the Governor in Council has approved of the following additional regulation relating to the occupation of Crown Lands under such licenses, viz.:-

The right to occupy and use Crown Lands under license for any of the purposes specified in the first division of the before-mentioned regulations will cease if the prescribed fees, payable in advance, be not paid within fourteen days after the date when such license should be renewed.

Notice to this effect will be given by the Board of Land and Works in the *Government Gazette* to the holders of licenses who fail to make the required payments of fees in due time, and that if the fees in arrear be not paid within fourteen days after the publication of such notice, their right of occupation under license will be liable to be forfeited, and the lands will be re-let by the Board of Land and Works, or otherwise appropriated.

APPLICATIONS FOR REWARDS FOR THE DISCOVERY OF GOLD FIELDS IN VICTORIA.

PERSONS deeming themselves entitled to rewards for the discovery of Gold Fields in the colony of Victoria are requested to make application to the undersigned on or before the 22nd January, 1864, and to furnish the following information:-

1. A description of the locality in which the discovery was made, sufficient to indicate its position and distinguish it from other Gold Fields, together with the approximate distances of the prospector's claim from the nearest gold working at the time of discovery, and from the nearest town.
2. The nature of the workings, depth and character of sinking, &c.
3. The time at which the discovery was made, giving the exact date if possible.
4. The names in full of the discoverers.
5. The name of the Government Officer (if any) to whom the discovery was reported, and the time at which such report (if any) was made.

Each applicant should furnish, in addition to the above, any documentary evidence which he may consider important.

Unless the above information is placed in the hands of the board on or before the 22nd January, 1864, the claim will not be considered.

Claims for rewards for discoveries made in 1862 cannot be entertained, a previous board having been appointed for their consideration; neither will discoveries be considered for which any reward has been paid by the colony.

THE COLONIAL LETTERS PATENT (IMPERIAL) ACT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Imperial Parliament, passed in the session held in the twenty-sixth and twenty-seventh years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to determine the Time at which Letters Patent shall take effect in the Colonies*, it is, amongst other things, enacted that the said Act shall take effect in each of Her Majesty's Colonies and Possessions so soon as the same shall be proclaimed therein by the Officer administering the Government thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of the Colony of Victoria, do hereby proclaim the said Act, a copy of which is hereto subjoined, and do declare the same Act to be proclaimed accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

VICTORIÆ REGINÆ.

CAP. LXXVI.—*An Act to determine the Time at which Letters Patent shall take effect in the Colonies.* [28th July, 1863.]

WHEREAS Her Majesty hath from time to time caused to be made under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of *Great Britain and Ireland* divers Letters Patent intended to take effect within Her Majesty's colonies and possessions beyond the seas: And whereas doubts are entertained respecting the period at which such letters patent have taken or may hereafter take effect within such colonies and possessions, and it is expedient that such doubts should be removed: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. No such letters patent heretofore made shall (unless otherwise provided therein or by other lawful authority) be deemed to have taken or shall take effect in any such colony or possession as aforesaid until the same were or shall be publicly made known or acted upon therein: Provided that any act or thing heretofore done or purporting to have been done in pursuance or under authority of such letters patent shall be as valid and effectual as if the same letters patent had taken effect at the date of the making thereof.

Existing letters patent not to take effect in colonies till published or acted on.
Acts done under such letters patent valid.

2. No such letters patent hereafter to be made shall (unless otherwise provided therein or by other lawful authority) take effect in any such colony or possession until the making of the same shall have been signified therein by proclamation or other public notice.

Future letters patent not to take effect in colony till publication.

3. Any such letters patent by which any person may be hereafter appointed to any office or employment within any of such colonies or possessions shall (unless otherwise provided therein or by other lawful authority) become null and void in respect of such colony, unless the same shall be so signified as aforesaid within the following period; that is to say, within nine calendar months in case such colony or possession shall be to the eastward of *Bengal in the East Indies*, or to the west of *Cape Horn in South America*, or in any other case within six months after the making thereof.

Appointments by letters patent to be void unless published within six or nine months.

4. The Act, chapter ninety-one, of the ninth and tenth years of Her Majesty, intituled *An Act to continue certain Patent Commissions until the Exhibition of the Commissions revoking them*, is hereby repealed.

5. This Act shall take effect in each of Her Majesty's colonies and possessions so soon as the same shall be proclaimed therein by the Officer administering the Government thereof.

CAP. LXXXIV.—*An Act to confirm certain Acts of Colonial Legislatures.*

[28th July, 1863.]

WHEREAS doubts are entertained respecting the validity of divers Acts passed by the Legislature of *South Australia* for the purpose of altering the Constitution of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said colony, and respecting the power of Colonial Legislatures to make laws for the above purpose; and it is expedient to remove such doubts: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. In this Act of Parliament the term "Colonial Legislature" shall mean the authority (other than Her Majesty in Council) competent to make laws for any of Her Majesty's possessions abroad, except *India*, the *Channel Islands*, and the *Isle of Man*:

As to terms "Colonial Legislature" and "Governor."

The term "Governor" shall mean the officer lawfully administering the Government of any colony.

2. All laws heretofore passed or purporting to have been passed by any Colonial Legislature with the object of declaring or altering the Constitution of such Legislature, or of any branch thereof, or the mode of appointing or electing the members of the same, shall have and be deemed to have had, from the date at which the same shall have received the assent of Her Majesty or of the Governor of the colony on behalf of Her Majesty, the same force and effect for all purposes whatever as if the said Legislature had possessed full powers of enacting laws for the objects aforesaid, and as if all formalities and conditions by Act of Parliament or otherwise prescribed in respect of the passing of such laws had been duly observed.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR CHARLES HENRY DARLING, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Local Government Act, 1863*, it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any district, whether single or united, which shall contain an area of not less than one hundred square miles, the total amount actually paid in respect of the general rate then last made shall have amounted to One thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim, if it shall seem fit, such district, by such name as in and by such Order in Council may be assigned thereto, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, and such district shall thereupon be and be called such shire accordingly; and no district, after the proclamation thereof as such shire, save as by the said Act provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of electoral districts, shall be united with any other shire or district, or with any borough or municipal district: And whereas the area of the united district hereinafter named, and the aggregate amount of the last general rates therein, are not less than the area and amount in the said Act mentioned, and it seemed fit to make an Order in Council this day to proclaim the said united district to be a shire accordingly: Now therefore I, Sir Charles Henry Darling, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the united districts mentioned in my Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of December, 1863, and therein called the Maldon United Road District, to be a shire within the meaning of the said Act, by the name in and by such Order in Council assigned thereto, that is to say:—

THE SHIRE OF MALDON.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, and in the twenty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

APPLICATION FOR ANNEXATION TO METCALFE ROAD DISTRICT.

FROM SUTTON GRANGE.

THE Metcalfe District Road Board has forwarded an application, signed by ten persons (who state that they are owners of land to the extent of 8500 acres, and residents in the parish of Sutton Grange), requesting that the boundary of the Metcalfe road district may be extended so as to include "the land lying between a line to be drawn along the top of Mount Alexander, and including the northern boundary of the parish of Faraday."

The District Board has supplemented the request of the applicants by expressing its acquiescence therewith, and describing, with more precision, the land referred to (as ascertained at a conference) as follows:—"That tract of land bounded on the north by the Strathfieldsaye district; on the west by the crown of the Mount Alexander range; on the south by the parish of Faraday; and on the east by the Metcalfe district, together with all the parish of Faraday not included in the municipality of Chewton or the Fryers district."

COUNTER-PETITION UNDER "THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT."

FROM THE PARISH OF BYLANDS.

A PETITION has been presented to the Governor, signed by fourteen landowners and inhabitants of the parish of Bylands, in the counties of Bourke and Dalhousie, the tenor of which is as follows:—

The petitioners state that the said parish does not lie within any municipal or road district; that each of them possesses property therein rateable under *The Local Government Act*; and they describe the metes and bounds of the parish to be the following, viz.:—"Commencing at the south-east angle of the Springfield Road District, as proclaimed 5th August, 1862; thence north by the eastern boundary of the said district to a point due west of the south boundary line of the Kilmore township reserve; thence east to the south-east angle of the said reserve; thence south and east to the northern boundary of the county of Bourke; thence east by the county boundary to the western boundary of the Whittlesea Road District; thence south by the western boundary of the said road district to the north-east angle of the Donybrook and Wallan-wallan Road District; thence west by the northern boundary of the said last-mentioned road district to the commencing point; excepting

any portion of the municipality of Kilmore which may be within the above-described boundaries."

The petitioners next object to a petition presented by the inhabitants of the parishes of Bylands and Glenburnie, praying that those parishes may be constituted a road district, to be called "The Bylands Road District" [the substance of which petition was published in the *Gazette* of 17th November last, page 2562], and they state their reasons for objecting to be—1st, because the parishes of Bylands and Glenburnie are separated by a natural boundary, being situated on opposite sides of high ranges, as the direction of the water-courses delineated on the map and permeating each parish in opposite directions proves; 2nd, because the ranges which sever the parishes are largely or wholly occupied by the Kilmore town common, which it is proposed to exclude from the road district petitioned for, thereby leaving a hiatus in the centre of the contemplated district; and occasioning an artificial severance of the two parishes; 3rd, because parallel main roads penetrate each parish, viz., the Sydney road through Bylands parish, and the Woodstock and Broadford road through Glenburnie parish, rendering each parish independent of the other, and dissociating them in interest, as no circumstances exist to necessitate the connection of these main roads within the parishes even if it were practicable; 4th, because they believe it would be for the interest of themselves and the ratepayers of the parish of Bylands, and for the good of the district generally, to have the whole of the parish of Bylands joined to the Donnybrook and Wallan-wallan Road District, with a view to the formation of a shire under *The Local Government Act, 1863*.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"In these circumstances, the petitioners respectfully pray that your Excellency will not grant the prayer of the petition requiring the parishes of Bylands and Glenburnie to be proclaimed a road district by the name and style of 'The Bylands Road District,' and that your Excellency will take this petition into your favorable consideration, and concede and join the whole parish of Bylands, by the metes and bounds aforesaid, to the Donnybrook and Wallan-wallan Road District, and proclaim such district a road district by the name and style of 'The Donnybrook, Wallan-wallan, and Bylands Road District,' or do otherwise, as to your Excellency may seem just."

Printed forms of tender may be obtained from the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge of police at each station, by whom also any information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

The tenders for each station will be accepted or rejected separately.

Tenders may be for either of the supplies required, oats, bran, hay, or straw only; and if all be included in one tender, it will be accepted for one article only, if advisable.

Tenderers may offer for the manure at each station at per cwt.; manure to be removed as may be arranged with the officer in charge, and the value of the manure will be deducted from the account for forage.

As much forage as the storage will accommodate will be drawn at a time for the convenience of contractors.

The price must be per ton for hay and straw, and per bushel of 40 lbs. for oats, 20 lbs. for bran, and 54 lbs. for maize, including delivery at the stations and all charges; bags to be returned when empty.

The net weight only after deducting the tare is to be charged.

No tender will be entertained unless accompanied by a certificate from two responsible persons that they are willing to become bound as sureties for the due fulfilment of the contract in one-third the estimated cost of the entire supply at the station tendered for; and in the event of the tender being accepted, the bond must be executed within twenty days, failing which the contract may be again advertised or another tender accepted.

The names and addresses of the tenderers and of their proposed sureties must be stated at full length.

All tenders must be enclosed in a separate envelope, marked "Tender for ——" (as the case may be), and deposited in the box at the Government Stores, King street; or if sent by post they must be addressed to the Government Storekeeper, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran and maize to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will not, however, exceed during the whole year 50 per cent. of the estimated quarterly consumption.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Government Storekeeper on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice only can be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th June, 1864.

take and hold in its corporate name, until the same can be advantageously disposed of for the purposes of reimbursement, any lands, tenements, and hereditaments which may be taken by the society in satisfaction of or as security for any debt or liability, and to dispose of the real and personal estate of the society from time to time, as occasion may require; to provide for the manner in which the society may act and contract; to enable it to sue and be sued in its corporate name; to provide for the service of process on the society, and the registration of its offices and officers; to make the interests of members of the society in its funds and property transmissible as personal estate; to enable minors and married women, subject to certain limitations, to become members of the society, and to obtain the benefit of policies effected by them with the society; to protect, subject to certain limitations, the interests of members and of their personal representatives in policies and other contracts effected or entered into by such members with the society from the operation of the laws relating to bankruptcy or insolvency and from seizure under legal process; to authorise the local board of directors of the society in Victoria to make certain payments to persons entitled on the intestacy of any member without requiring such persons to take out letters of administration, and to protect the society from being bound by notice of any trusts affecting any policy or contract granted by or effected with the society.
