NOTICE TO MERCHANTS, AGENTS, AND MASTERS OF VESSELS TRADING TO WELSHPOOL, CORNER INLET.

PEFERRING to the intimation dated 12th June, 1863, respecting Welshpool Jetty, it is hereby directed:—

1. Merchants, agents, and others will be required to give, at the Custom House, Port Albert, twenty-four hours' clear notice prior to their landing goods at, or shipping goods from, the jetty in question.

2.
